

The St. James Council of Catholic Women is once again undertaking a service project helping Cross Catholic Outreach bring hope and blessing to children. This fun project is known as **"BOXES OF JOY"** and will be brightening the lives of poor children in developing



countries who may never have known the joy of receiving a Christmas gift. Who doesn't like to shop for children, surprise them with joy and put a big smile on their faces. Each volunteer picks an age range (2-4 yrs., 5-9 yrs. or 10-14 yrs.) and gender of the child they would like to bless with their gift. You then fill a shoe box with a variety of new small toys, school supplies, small clothing items, hair accessories, personal hygiene items, small books or a rosary. I can provide a list of many suggestions to choose from. You should also include a \$9.00 check made out to Cross Catholic Outreach (no cash) to cover the cost of shipping to the destination countries. If you wish you can also include a Christmas card or personal note. Our CCW goal is to provide at least 36 boxes for these needy children, but we can always do more if we have interested parishioners who would like to help us and be a part of this project.
