(Brief History)

Saint Catherine of Siena, original name Catherina Benincasa, born March 25, 1437, Siena, Tuscany. She died on April 29, 1380 at the age of 33 (the same age as our Savior) of a massive stroke. Her last words were, "Father - Into Your Hands I commend my soul and my spirit!". She was

canonized in 1461, declared a Doctor of The Church in 1970 (only 1 of 4 women declared so and the only one who is not a Religious) and in 1999 the Patron Saint of Europe and of Fire Prevention. Her feast day is this Wednesday, April 29.

Saint Catherine of Siena Doctor Of The Church

During this time of a world pandemic, we need reminders of holy and righteous persons and deeds that can and do come out of perilous times, not only in world history, but also in the Church.

One such person is Saint Catherine of Siena. She was bon on March 25, 1347 - on the Feast of The Annunciation, in Siena, part of Tuscany, Italy, the 23rd of 25 children born to Jacopo and Lapa Benicia. She grew up as an intelligent, cheerful and intensely religious person. Catherine disappointed her mother by cutting off her hair when she was in her teens in order to be less attractive, as her father wanted her to marry and she staunchly refused to do so. Finally, her father came to support her in her decision to remain chaste and ordered that she be given her own room in order to better pray and meditate. Sadly, only about half of their children survived the Black Plague (1347-1351) that ravaged all of Europe and killed about one-third of the entire population. Her twin sister did not survive.

Catherine became a tertiary (lay) Third Order Dominican as a young woman, but it was not without controversy. Many in the Order did not want her admitted, as at the time, the Order was thought to be for older widows, not young, outspoken virgins. She eventually prevailed, most likely due to her abounding faith. She stayed outside of the convent and before long became a social and political force to be reckoned with. She rapidly gained a wide reputation for her holiness and her severe asceticism. When the rebellious city of Florence was placed under an edict by Pope Gregory XI (1376), she determined to take public action for peace within the Church and Italy. She went as an unofficial mediator to Avignon, accompanied by her Confessor and (eventually) her biographer, Father Raymond of Capua. Her mission failed, but while there she gained perspective and spiritual strength.


It became clear to her that the return of Pope Gregory XI to Rome from Avignon was the only way to bring peace to Italy and to the Church in all parts of the known world. At his request, she went to Florence and was there during the Ciampa Revolt in June. After a short stay in Siena, during which she completed her acclaimed "The Dialogue", she went to Rome at the invitation of Pope Urban VI whom she helped reorganizing the Church and reconciling the Church after the days of two Popes and the schism caused by the antipope Clement VII.

Catherine's writings include 380 letters, 26 prayers, and the four treatises, better known as "The Dialogue", which is the record of her ecstatic experiences in her visions of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

My brothers and sisters in Christ,



"The Lord has risen indeed!" Yes, He has risen! For "if there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not risen,

and if Christ has not risen, then our proclamation is in vain and our faith is in vain. But, Christ has risen from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died."

During today's first reading, we hear that Peter stood up among the Eleven. As the first Pope, he claimed that Jesus had risen, that he had been handed over to those who crucified Him outside of the law according to God's definite plan and foreknowledge. God had raised Jesus from the dead, because it was impossible for Him to remain in their power.

In today's Gospel reading, we hear about the two disciples who walked with Jesus on the road to Emmaus. We also hear that during their journey, their eyes did not recognize the Lord. But later that day, when Jesus was at the table with them, he took the bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to them. At that moment, the eyes of the disciples were opened and they recognized Jesus just before he disappeared from their sight. From this event it is understood that while participating in the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, the disciples were suddenly able to perceive a deeper understanding of revelation.

My brothers and sisters in Christ, "the Lord is risen, just as the disciples of Jesus were touched by His presence, we too can be touched by His presence in the Holy Eucharist, even if we cannot participate in the Mass in the Church, because of the Corona-Virus Pandemic. There is no greater joy than to be touched by the love of the Risen Lord.




