Reflections on Pope Francis' Fratelli Tutti...

How's this for Easter joy? I have a good neighbor, Judy. When Judy heard that I had not received the COVID vaccine yet, she told me where and how she was able to get it. Not only that, she offered to run home and get the phone number I would need to secure an appointment. Judy inspires me to be a better neighbor myself. Pope Francis challenges me to go even further. Using the Parable of the Good Samaritan in his encyclical Fratelli Tutti, Francis reminds us that Jesus had a more far-reaching definition of neighbor. In paragraph 66, Francis says, "Jesus' parable summons us to rediscover our vocation as citizens of our respective nations and of the entire world, builders of a new social bond."

Jesus and Francis want me to know that I am called to see every human being in the whole world as my neighbor. In response to this call, I'm thinking about my neighbors in the countries in Africa and all developing countries that have been deeply affected by the pandemic. I'm praying that our country and others will respond quickly and generously to countries in need with enough vaccine for all their people. Even more specific, I pray that those in developing countries can get the one-dose Johnson and Johnson vaccine, so people won't have to travel twice nor worry about the cold storage requirements of other vaccines.

The Risen Christ brings the promise of hope and new life. This year that new life comes in the form of a vaccine to keep us and all our neighbors safe from the coronavirus. What prayer or action might you offer to bring Easter joy to a neighbor you have yet to meet?

STAY CONNECTED

St. Clare Parish Livestreaming Roku Channel



We are happy to announce that St. Clare Parish has its very own Roku Channel! Now you can watch our live streamed Masses, as well as our archived Masses on demand right from the comfort of your TV. (Archived Masses will take 24-48 hours to upload to our account.) To add our channel to your Roku box or smart TV, simply go to "add channel" and type in **St Clare Parish.**

Helpful Tips:

- You do not need to type a period "." after St
- If you select the "live" feed on the Roku channel before St. Clare is actually live, it WON'T auto start
 the video feed when we do go live. It isn't like a TV channel where it just works. You have to back out
 of the live feed and go back to the St. Clare Roku Channel's menu and try the live feed again. If you
 just sit on the white/black message that says "This broadcaster is currently not streaming", it will stay
 like that even when we do eventually go live. <u>You have to restart that feed to get it to work.</u>
- If you miss Mass live that day, but want to watch it shortly after the missed Mass, the Roku Channel won't show the archive. Roku only updates overnight, so if you miss Sunday's live Mass, you have to wait until Monday to find the archive in the Roku Channel. So the only way to watch an archived video of Mass the same day it was live, you have to use our website to find the archive.

Returning To Mass At St. Clare HERE IS WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

THANK YOU FOR YOUR UNDERSTANDING AND COOPERATION

MASS OBLIGATION

The obligation to attend Mass is dispensed until further notice. Continue to watch from home or attend any Mass during the week.



WEAR A MASK



Everyone is strongly encouraged to wear a mask from the time you leave your car until you return to your car, only removing temporarily to receive the host.

ENTRANCE AND EXIT

Enter the Cedar or Salvia Ave. doors. The elevator is available if needed. The Salvia & Elevator doors will be locked five minutes before Mass to better accommodate seating capacity from the faithful entering through the Cedar Ave. door.



PERSONAL BELONGINGS

Please do not bring in handbags, books or other objects unless very necessary. Bring a small bottle of hand sanitizer to clean your hands before and after Communion.

SIGN OF PEACE

There can be no hand-holding during the Our Father and no handshakes or hugs at the Sign of Peace (other than family). Please acknowledge your neighbor.



OFFERING

Your offering may be placed in the offering box at the Cedar Ave. door or basket at the sanctuary by the Salvia wing.

We have now roped off every other pew. Please do not remove the ropes or sit in these roped off pews.

There are 23 open pews in the main part of church & 5 open pews in the Salvia wing.

Once you are inside church, the inside doors will be left open to limit touching the handles and doors. The holy water fonts have been emptied.

> Please use the hand sanitizer before entering. Please exit the same door that you entered.

Ushers will help guide individuals, couples, and families to specific open pews so as to better facilitate our capacity and keep our social distancing measures.



Communion:

For the main body of church, please exit your pew towards the exterior walls of church, receive communion, and enter back to your pew by way of the center aisle all while maintaining social distancing measures.

For the Salvia Wing,

per usual, please exit your pew toward the confessional, receive communion, and return to your pew by way of the aisle closest to the St. Joseph statue all while maintaining social distancing measures.

Only the Body of Christ will be offered to the faithful in your hand, not on the tongue. Please receive the host with your hand flat and by extending your arms.
