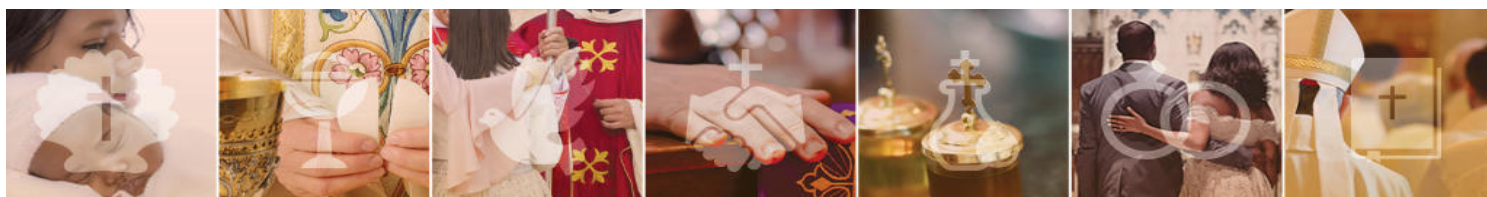

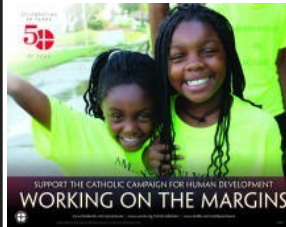

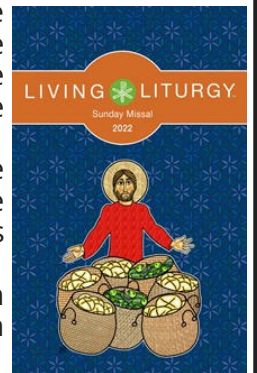


2022 Living Liturgy Sunday Missal

Synod 2021-2023

The Holy See has initiated Synod 2021-2023, a two-year process of "reflection and sharing of the whole Church." Archbishop Schnurr has appointed Deacon John Homoelle to lead and coordinate the Archdiocese of Cincinnati's contributions to this initiative.

The Holy Father has called a synod inviting ALL the Baptized to come together to discuss and discern how we can walk together in accomplishing the Mission of the Church. He wants ALL those who make up the Church to participate: elderly, youth, religious orders, clergy, lay faithful, poor, disabled, divorced, migrants, those who no longer practice the faith, etc. More will be coming on how this is going to be accomplished at the local level, and what the discussion themes will be. First Reading

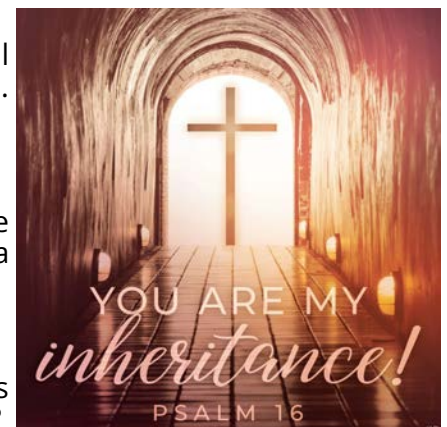

ADVENT SPIRITUAL PILGRIMAGE

During Advent, the Church will be directing the faithful toward Bethlehem, where Jesus was born, and to other parts of the Holy Land where He spread the words of the Gospel. However, the situation in the Holy Land has changed as many of the Christians are leaving this Holy Place. Take a spiritual pilgrimage with us to the Holy Land this Advent and learn about the diminishing Christian presence in Israel, Palestine, and Jordan in our own day.

Very Rev. William Turner of the Lansing Diocese, an alumnus of Mt. St. Mary Seminary, has been to the Holy Land on numerous occasions and has deep personal experiences on this topic. The theme of Fr.
