SCRIPTURE READINGS FOR THE FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

January 31, 2021

Moses was the model for prophetic authenticity. Jesus is seen as the second Moses, one who speaks and acts with God's own authority.

The focus of our readings is the teaching authority of the prophets, especially Jesus.

The prophets of the Old Testament were "the voice of God" and, as such, commanded obedience. In our passage for the Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time, God promises the people of Israel a future prophet who, like Moses, will come from among their own people. But with this promise, God issues a stern warning to obey the voice of the prophet.

The New Testament sees Jesus as that future prophet, who teaches with "real authority." He not only speaks for God but demonstrates his authority with power. The exorcism of evil spirits serves as an example of the authority of

Jesus: "he teaches with real authority...even the evil spirits obey him."

Deuteronomy 18:15-20

The Israelites ask Moses to give them a prophet to intercede for them with God.

Who do I ask to intercede for me with God? Or, have I never asked for an intercessor?

1 Corinthians 7:32-35


Expecting Jesus to return soon, Paul counsels the church to concentrate completely on God.

How am I preparing for the return of Jesus?

Mark 1:21-28

Jesus casts out an evil spirit that has recognized this power as God's holy One.

What needs to be "cast out" of my life, my relationships, my faith life?



In next Sunday's Gospel reading we will see Jesus confronting an evil spirit and freeing a man who had been tormented by it. Two commentaries from the February 2015 issue of the Magnificat devotional magazine see the Gospel of the 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B, as an opportunity to consider the reality of evil. However, as we consider the reality of evil may we be drawn by God ultimately to understand more completely the unifying, healing and life-giving action of the grace of God!

Bishop Robert Barron points out that, "One of the terms typically used in the New Testament for the dark power is *ho diabolos*, which literally means, 'the scatterer.'" Where evil is present and acts, there is division and separation. "God is a unity of three Persons, and his characteristic mark is unification [emphasis added]; the divine brings the many into one."

The British spiritual writer, Caryl Houselander, says that manifestations of evil over the years have revealed to us something of its nature: "Satan has not the power to

incarnate himself in our nature, to make himself man, to be born of a woman. He must always work from outside; he is rabid because he is hate, and hate can never be incarnate as Love is incarnate in the world. Hate can never be born in generation after generation as Love is.

"It may look as if evil is triumphant. But in reality, there is always, from every outset of the devil, an element of frustration.

"It is a tormenting thing...for Satan to be compelled to witness the indwelling of divine Love, of Jesus Christ, in the dust that we are made of, and to see the substance of earthly things endowed, by the touch of his human hands and the warmth of his breath, with life-giving power.

"Certainly, Satan has cause for malicious exultation in the results of his attempts to achieve his sacramental system. But what irony for him in these very results: they not only fail to make Satan human, but they dehumanize those who are. He must remain outside of nature, outside of the harmony that motivates everything, from a man's heart to a star."

I hope you can appreciate the depths of these insights of Caryll Houselander – and can reflect on them so that they sink in more profoundly. They are ultimately meant to give us a more personal confidence in God and a greater desire to live our lives immersed in God and in His love.

God creates us in love, marked especially by the gift of free will, and then also offers us mercy. God even enters into our humanity in a way that an angelic being like Satan cannot. He cannot be united with our humanity in and with love, but only in a way that distorts and ultimately wounds our humanity. This is meant to draw us to seek the Lord's mercy, to turn away from sin and – with the help of the Holy Spirit – to act in and with love and generosity as Jesus did. We're not to toy with evil and the divisiveness it brings to our hearts and to our lives but instead we are to seek to become immersed in goodness and in love, in and with Jesus!

It is essentially in the social hall area of Christ Lutheran Church.

Their social hall area also includes storage shelving for GRACE Pantry. Thank you for your generosity in supplying so many food donations throughout the year for that pantry. As a parish we contributed funds for the purchase of the van used for GRACE Pantry and I plan to make a parish contribution for refurbishing the kitchen for Feed My People. I would encourage parishioner donations toward that project to be well worth it, again, since this outreach benefits our larger Guernsey County community.

Thank you for your participation in the collection for purchasing the ultrasound machines for the Open Arms Pregnancy Center. We have less than \$2,000 to complete the fundraising for the second ultrasound machine, the one to refurbish the unit at the OAPC offices.
