

Lenten Vocation Crucifix







READINGS FOR THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT March 14, 2021

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son that we might have life. As we continue on our Lenten journey, let us turn to the Lord who is rich in mercy and compassion.

We live in a world broken by a false sense of worth based on the work ethic and personal accomplishment. Our new life in Christ is God's free

gift to us.

In the reading from **Ephesians**, Paul assures us that our salvation is not a commodity we have earned or worked for. We have been taken out of darkness into the light, freely. We choose to live a life of good deeds, not to earn salvation, but as a fitting thanksgiving because we are being saved. The Gospel reminds us that this free gift was given through the ultimate act of love—the giving of one's life, freely.

Christ, lifted up on the cross, is our reminder that we have been saved, gratuitously, by him.

2 Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23

Whoever among you belongs to any part of his people, let him go up and may his God be with you.

Ephesians 2:4-10


For by grace you have been saved through faith in His kindness to us in Jesus Christ.

We pause next week in our Sunday Mass

Readings from the focus on the successive 4 kinds of covenants described in the First Reading. Instead, we observe Laetare Sunday. That will be one of the two times each year when our liturgical color shifts from purple to rose. It is a kind of oasis in the middle of the Lenten desert, a drink of refreshment to help us to persevere with our Lenten disciplines. And, key to this drink of refreshment is *love*!

Next Sunday's Gospel for, again, the 4th Sunday of Lent, is from the well-known passage of John 3:16, "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son...," quoted further below. Pope Benedict XVI gave a reflection on this passage during the Way of the Cross held at the Coliseum in Rome on Good Friday, April 10, 2009.

"The anguish of the Passion of the Lord Jesus cannot fail to move to pity even the most hardened hearts, as it constitutes the [high point] of the revelation of God's love for each of us. Saint John observes: God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish, but have eternal life (Jn. 3:16).

"It is for **love** of us that Christ dies on the cross! Throughout the course of the millennia, a great multitude of men and women have been drawn deeply into this mystery and they <u>have</u> followed him, making in their turn, like him and with his help, a gift to others of their own lives. They are

the saints and the martyrs, many of whom remain unknown to us.

"Even in our own time, how many people, in the silence of their daily lives, unite their sufferings with those of the Crucified One and become apostles of a true spiritual and social renewal! What would [our human family] be without Christ? Saint Augustine observes: 'You would still be in a state of wretchedness, had he not shown you mercy. You would not have returned to life, had he not shared your death. You would have passed away had he not come to your aid.' So why not welcome him into our lives?"

"Let us pause...to contemplate his disfigured face: it is the face of the Man of Sorrows. His face is reflected in that of every person who is humiliated and offended, sick and suffering, alone, abandoned and despised. Pouring out his blood, he has broken the solitude of our tears. He has entered into our every grief and our every anxiety.

"Brothers and Sisters! As the cross rises up on Golgotha, the eyes of our faith are already turned towards the dawning of the new Day, and we begin to taste the joy and splendor of Easter."

May the Lord help our observance of Lent, both this week and next, help us to place our faith in Him, that we may receive the gift of His merciful <u>love</u> for us and for the world, leading to His gift of eternal life in Heaven.

Pastor's Letter

As we are very much at the heart of Lent (literally one month away from Easter as I am writing this on Friday morning, March 5th!) a number of people have said that this already has been a unique Lent. In a way, it's kind of been like a year long Lent since mid-March last year, with so many moments of hope and frustration. With the number of hospitalizations of patients with COVID in Ohio down to 1,009, in the ICUs down to 270, and on ventilators down to 196 as of March 4th, Lord willing this year-long "odyssey" is closer to its conclusion or at least to a Holy Week and Easter a little closer to normal!

Thank you to all who "tried something new this year" by participating in this year's St. Benedict School Annual Auction online. Thank you to the many, many parishioners who have dedicated countless hours over the 30+ years that the auction has been developing. From the Social Hall to the Armory to the Gym and now to the internet: thank you for helping to develop this annual event to be an enjoyable social event and substantial fundraiser for our school.

Please note that we still need a few more Lenten Vocations Crucifix participants, especially from the 5:00 p.m. Saturday Mass and our 12:15 p.m. Mass at Sts. Peter and Paul. As noted before, you would receive the Vocations Crucifix at the conclusion of the Mass, place it in a place of prayer in your house and offer the prayers in the enclosed booklet each day of that week. Please see the sign-up sheet in the Marian Room or on the back table at the Oratory.

Again, the Diocese of Steubenville is planning for a day of introduction for prospective new candidates for the permanent diaconate, on Saturday, March 27th. We will be hosting that event at Sts. Peter and Paul in Lore City. Please keep that event in prayer and ask our Lord to clarify that potential calling for members of our parish here in Guernsey County.

Please note the Pro-Life convention being held next weekend in the Cleveland area, on March 12th and 13th. You can participate online by going to their website at bringingamericabacktolife.org. It looks like an interesting conference with "speakers from around the world."

I had mentioned a couple of weeks ago about planning for a new picture directory and that we were hoping for photo sessions in April. We received a vigorous reply that for most parishioners this April is too soon for them to feel comfortable to participate in the photo sessions. So, we have moved those dates to the first and second full weeks of September! Lord willing, we will be at a much better place for something like that. More on that as we get into August.

I will have more information on this year's Diocesan/ Parish Share Campaign in next week's bulletin. You probably have received the first mailing. Thank you for your generosity to this annual campaign.

May the Lord continue to bless us with joy and peace as disciples of Jesus and to help us to be always ready for the gift of eternal life in Heaven!



Walk Where Jesus Walked



Join Fr. Paul Hrezo and *Crown of Bethlehem Tours* for a Pilgrimage to the Holy Land which has been postponed to June 14-25, 2021.

Our tour conductors informed me that we are still awaiting clearance from the authorities in Israel.

Close to 80% of the people in Israel have already been vaccinated. Sites and shops formally opened up this

week. We will hear from Crown of Bethlehem at the beginning of March if we can proceed with this pilgrimage, perhaps combining with another group from Texas.

The visible, public centerpiece of 40 Days for Life is a focused, 40-day, non-stop, round-the-clock prayer vigil outside a single Planned Parenthood center or other abortion facility. Each day during 40 Days for Life (which happens to correspond with Lent this year), individuals, churches, families and groups will be asked to join together in prayer for a specific request so the entire Body of Christ can unite around a common focus. Devotional for Day 19, Sunday, March 7

Intention: We pray for a renewal of our zeal to offer generous help to the unborn and their families.

Scripture: If I have despised the cause of my male or female servant when they complained against me, what then shall I do when God rises up? When He punishes, how shall I answer Him? Did not He who made me in the womb make them? Did not the same One fashion us in the womb? —Job 31:13-15

Prayer: God, forgive us when we try to explain away the obligation we have to help others who need help. Enable us to not devalue them because they are in the circumstance that they are in, but to see them for what they are, those, who like us, were formed by your hand in their mother's womb. Amen.

Devotional for Day 20, Monday, March 8

Intention: That we may realize the generational impact of abortion.

Scripture: Isaac prayed to the Lord for his wife because she was barren; and the Lord granted his prayer and Rebekah his wife conceived. The children struggled together within her, and she said, "If it is thus, why do I live?" So she went to inquire of the Lord. And the Lord said to her, "Two nations are in your womb, and two peoples, born of you, shall be divided; the one shall be stronger than the other, the elder shall serve the younger."

— Genesis 25:21-23

Prayer: O, God, you formed us in our mother's womb and planned a unique and special life and purpose for each of us, and we do thank you. Grant that we may pray and work for an end to abortion, especially in these 40 days, so that no unborn baby you have made may fail to achieve your divine intention for him or her because of

intentional abortion. We pray this for the sake of your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

Devotional for Day 21, Tuesday, March 9

Intention: Pray that we each will daily put on the full armor of God, so that we are strong in the Lord and the power of His might.

Scripture: For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. Therefore, take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day and having done all, to stand.

— Ephesians 6:12-13

Prayer: Dear Lord, as you lead us into the spiritual battle of abortion may we be reminded that the battle is truly Yours. Thank you for hearing our requests for direction and protection. Thank you for the victory that is ours because of Your Son Jesus, amen.

Devotional for Day 22, Wednesday, March 10

Intention: May those who hold life as trivial realize that we live because God wills it so.

Scripture: Who among all these does not know that the hand of the Lord has done this, in His hand is the life of every creature and the breath of all mankind.

— Job 12:9-10

Prayer: Thank you Father God for being the Creator of my life and every life. Please give me, and the society in which I live, an appreciation for your gift of life.
