Holy Thursday
Mass of the Lord's Supper
April 1, 2021

Before the feast of Passover, Jesus celebrates the Last Supper in which he gives us his body and blood.

Before Mass begins, the tabernacle is entirely emptied. A sufficient amount of hosts will be consecrated at this Mass for the Communion of the clergy and laity not only at that Mass but also for those attending the Good Friday Celebration of the Lord's Passion.

Typically, we have a foot washing ceremony, which reflects today's Gospel. This year we will simply recall Our Lord's servant leadership from the Gospel.

After Communion, a ciborium with hosts for Good Friday is left on the Altar. Following the Prayer after Communion, we have a procession with the Holy Eucharist to the place of reposition, which will be in the Marian Room.

When the celebration has ended, the Altar and Sanctuary is stripped. The faithful are encouraged to adore the Blessed Sacrament quietly in overlapping periods of time in the Marian Room of St. Benedict Church until midnight.

Good Friday
Celebration of the Lord's Passion
April 2, 2021

Entrusting his life to the Father, Jesus bore our infirmities, and, obedient unto death, won for us eternal salvation.

Good Friday, and, if possible, Holy Saturday until the Easter Vigil, should be observed by the Paschal fast everywhere to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more deeply in the Resurrection.

The Celebration of the Lord's Passion takes place in the evening for the convenience of the people of the parish. The Passion of the Lord according to St. John is proclaimed. Those parts of the Liturgy which will be sung are the general intercessions and the chants for the showing and Veneration of the Cross. A cross will be used for the veneration, shown by genuflecting or with a profound bow.

After the Veneration of the Cross, the ciborium with the Blessed Sacrament is brought from its repository and placed on the Altar and the clergy and faithful receive Communion. After reception of the Eucharist the Altar is again stripped and the assembly leaves in silence.

Holy Saturday
Easter Vigil
April 3, 2021

Alleluia! The stone rejected by the builders has become the cornerstone! If we have died with Christ, we shall also rise with him and pass from death to life.

The entire celebration of the vigil should take place at night, that is, it should begin after the nightfall and end before the dawn of Sunday. The four (4) proper parts of the vigil are:

- (1) Light Service (Blessing of New Fire and Easter Candle)
- (2) Liturgy of the Word
- (3) Renewal of Baptismal Promises
 - a. Adult and Family Baptisms
 - b. Profession of Faith for Receiving New Members into Full Communion with the Church
 - c. Confirmation of Adults
- (4) Eucharist

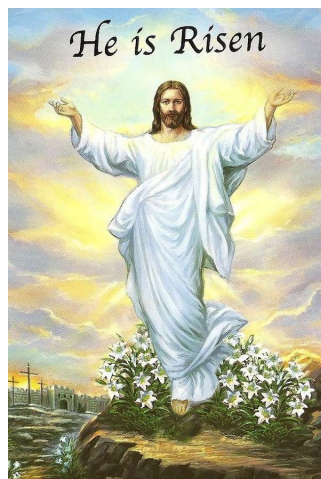
EASTER SUNDAY OF THE
RESURRECTION OF THE LORD
April 4, 2021

Alleluia, Alleluia, Jesus Christ is risen from the dead, Alleluia. As we gather on this Easter morning to celebrate the glory of the resurrection, let us offer praise and thanksgiving to our saving God.

The mission of the Church is to give witness to the Resurrection. In the reading from Acts, Peter gives witness to those who killed Jesus. His witness is based on experience:

"We have seen him. We ate and drank with him." His witness is based on the command of Jesus: "He told us to preach to the people." And what he preaches is that "God raised him on the third day!" The witness of the Church is that Jesus is alive and among us.

In the Gospel, the women, the first disciples to witness the empty tomb, receive the Good News: "He is risen!" They



are filled with fear and confusion. But even in their confusion, they are commissioned to “Go and tell the others.” Tell them what? If you are looking for Jesus, the One who was crucified, he is not here in a tomb. He is risen! You will see him, just as he said.

And so our Easter Readings tell us that the early disciples saw Jesus in sign: eating and drinking with him, and in an empty tomb. With these signs, they were sent out to proclaim that, “He is risen! We have seen him!”

Acts of the Apostles 10:34a, 37-43

All the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins

through his name.

How do you witness your faith in the redemption you have received from Christ?

Colossians 3:1-4

When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory.

Describe your belief in the “resurrection of the dead.”

John 20:1-9

They did not understand yet that he had to rise from the dead.

Spend some time with the Gospel passage. What does it reveal to you?

Please keep repeating our Mass times for Easter and letting others know about them, too:

8, 10, 10 and 12!

So, again, our times for Masses on Easter Sunday are:

8:00 a.m., 10:00 a.m. and Noon at St. Benedict Church in Cambridge and at 10:00 a.m. at Sts. Peter & Paul in Lore City. That is because typically the 10:00 a.m. time is the most highly attended Easter Mass and so by offering a parallel Mass at 10:00 a.m. in Lore City as well as another Mass at Noon at St. Benedict we hope to spread out the attendance a bit more.

If you are concerned about being at a crowded Mass on Easter, please plan to attend the Noon Mass at St. Benedict or even the 8:00 p.m. Easter Vigil Mass on Saturday evening. The Easter Vigil Mass is also the anchor Mass of the year where we celebrate adult baptisms, adult confirmations and welcome participants in the RCIA program into full communion with the Church.

I invite you to participate in other Holy Week liturgies and times of prayer as well. Notable among them are:

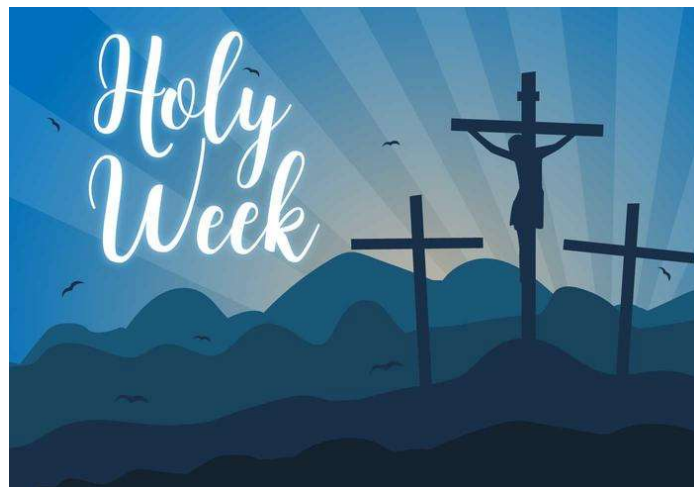
- Stations of the Cross on Wednesday, March 30th, at 6:30 p.m., followed by Confessions from 7:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m. at Sts. Peter & Paul in Lore City,
- The Holy Thursday Mass at 7:00 p.m. followed by silent Adoration in the Marian Room available from ~8:00 p.m. until Midnight at St. Benedict Church,
- And the Commemoration of Our Lord's Passion at 7:00 p.m. on Friday at St. Benedict Church.

Additionally,

- Both St. Benedict and Sts. Peter & Paul will be open for silent prayer from Noon until 2:30 p.m. on Friday, followed by the Stations of the Cross and the Chaplet of Divine Mercy.
- And, instead of Daily Mass, we will have Morning Prayer at 9:00 a.m. on Thursday, Friday and Saturday at St. Benedict Church.
- Finally, please join us for the Blessing of the Easter Foods at 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, April 3rd, at St. Benedict Church.

Thank you for all who have participated in this year's DPSC (Diocesan Parish Share Campaign). We will continue to have the information sheets and pledge envelopes in the pews this weekend.
