## SCRIPTURE READINGS FOR THE SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER

April 11, 2021

**United in one heart and mind, we gather on this Easter day with joy, for the Lord is rich in mercy. Remove all fear and fill us with the Spirit of the Risen Christ is our prayer. As we prepare ourselves to celebrate these Easter mysteries, let us ask for Christ's gift of peace in the forgiveness of all our sins.**

The mission of the Church is to establish and nurture community, giving witness to the peace and forgiveness of the Risen Lord. The reading from Acts tells us that the early Christians shared everything they had so that no one was poor or in need. Their common belief in Jesus united them in heart and mind. Because of this witness, the disciples were respected when they preached about the Risen Lord.

Jesus' first words to his disciples are of peace and forgiveness, "Peace be with you... If you forgive the sins of anyone, they are forgiven."

Thomas represents those of us who find it hard to believe that Christ is truly among us and that living in peace and forgiveness is possible. To him Jesus says, "Don't be unbelieving, but believe." The evangelist tells us that he has written this for us, so that we will recognize the signs of the Risen Lord and believe.

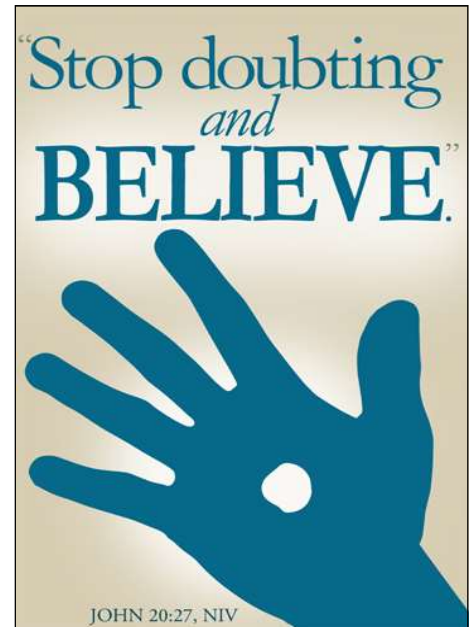

**Throughout this week we observe what is called an "octave" for Easter.** That means that each day this week is celebrated as if it were another Easter. For example, usually for daily Masses we don't sing or recite the hymn of the Gloria. During the Octave of Easter, however, the Gloria is part of even daily Masses. The Mass readings, too, focus on the events around the Resurrection.

The Second Sunday of Easter is also called Divine Mercy Sunday. On this Sunday we go back to the Upper Room with the apostles to where Jesus had eaten the Passover Meal as the Last Supper. They were hunkered down, fearfully hoping that what had happened to Jesus would not happen to them. The door was closed securely with a huge wooden beam across the door.

In spite of this, Jesus passed through that door and appeared to them. This moment is depicted in the Divine Mercy images that are central to this devotion, like the

one we have near baptismal font at St. Benedict and near the right-hand devotional candles at Sts. Peter & Paul. In those images, Jesus is depicted as just having passed through the door with streams of light flowing out of the wound in his side that had been inflicted on him after his death by one of the soldiers standing nearby.

As Jesus greeted his surprised disciples he said, "Peace be with you!" St. John, in his Gospel, emphasizes that after Jesus showed them his hands, still with the nail marks, and his side he gave them a command to go and forgive people's sins. He gave them the authority to do so in his name. This moment, therefore, was one of peace to calm our fears about death and one of mercy to help us hear God's words of forgiveness through human instruments. So, this Second Sunday of Easter is fittingly called Divine Mercy Sunday.

A religious sister in Poland, St. Faustina Kowalska, in the 1930s, received inspirations regarding the development of



this devotion to God's mercy. This devotion had a positive impact on St. John Paul II, and he promoted it enthusiastically as a bishop and as pope. There is a form of prayer associated with this devotion called the Divine Mercy Chaplet which is prayed utilizing Rosary beads. Many people have found it to be a good complement to praying the Rosary.

The other readings for next Sunday's Mass also echo, at least indirectly, this theme of mercy. In the First Reading, from the Acts of the Apostles, we hear about the early

Christian community living peacefully and in unity with the needs of all being met, which could be seen as fruits of living as a community of mercy. The Second Reading proclaims the experience of Christians as being victors over sin and death through faith in Jesus. And, the Responsorial Psalm declares that God's love is everlasting. In the Hebrew language, there is much overlap in the meaning of the words for love and for mercy. May we, like the earliest Christians as well as like our Jewish ancestors in the faith become instruments of God's abundant Divine Mercy!

## Pastor's Letter

Happy Easter! May Easter 2021 be a season of new life immersed in our Lord Jesus.

We offer congratulations to all who have participated in the Sacraments of Initiation this weekend, including 8 Baptisms, 5 adult Confirmations and 4 adult First Communions. At all of the Easter Masses all of us proclaim and participate in a Renewal of our Baptismal Promises. May we experience the benefits of having a new "re-beginning" by completing this whole year-long Lent! It was a blessing to see so many people who are feeling more confident to participate in public events again.

Pope Francis offered this word of encouragement during the Wednesday Audience of Holy Week, which is a word of encouragement for all of us.

"The Risen One gives us the certainty that good always triumphs over evil, that life always overcomes death and our end is not to descend lower and lower, from sadness to sadness, but to rise above."

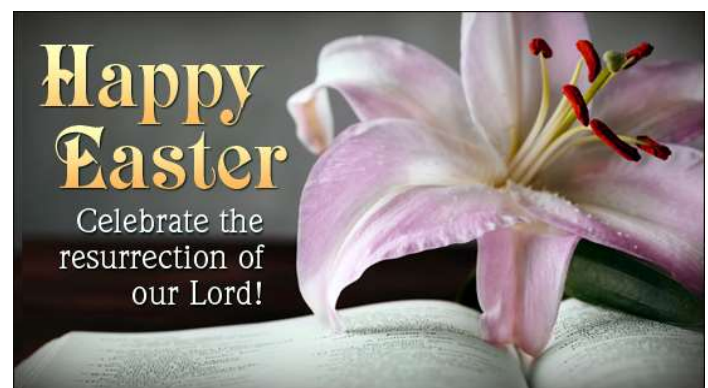
And, this is in the context of our current worldwide situation. Pope Francis proclaimed, "Dear brothers and sisters, this year too we will experience the Easter celebrations in the context of the pandemic. In many situations of suffering, especially when people, families, and populations already tried by poverty, calamity or conflict suffer them, the Cross of Christ is like a beacon that indicates the port to ships still offshore in the stormy sea." He said, "Christ's Cross is a sign of the hope that does not disappoint; and it tells us that not even one tear, not one sigh is lost in God's plan."

Please note that we will plan to have Divine Mercy Sunday devotional prayers next week in the afternoon, on

Sunday, April 11th, at 3:00. That hour is traditionally called the hour of mercy, recalling when Jesus offered his life on the Cross. However, as we see in the painting at the left side of the sanctuary at St. Benedict and near the statue of our Blessed Mother on the right side of the devotional candles area at Sts. Peter & Paul, in the depiction of the Divine Mercy of Jesus, it flows from His wounded Heart. His heart was opened on the Cross so that mercy could flow out. The devotions would include praying the Divine Mercy chaplet and having Confessions available.

We are plan to have a gathering of our Bereavement Haven next Sunday, starting at 2:30 p.m. in the St. Benedict Social Hall. That group has been a helpful source of encouragement and a bridge to healing for the many who have participated in the group both from our parish and from throughout our Guernsey County community.

May the Lord help us to experience the joy of the transforming power of God's love and mercy for us. Happy Easter!

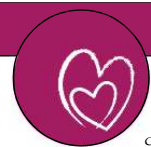
