





Students and staff are back from Easter break and in addition to the Season of Easter, we have entered the "season of testing"! Over the next two weeks students in grades 2-8 will take a new assessment - ARK (Assessment of Religious Knowledge). This test replaces the ACRE test that previously was taken by students in grades 5 and 8. We are hopeful that ARK will give us more comprehensive data on religious knowledge and help guide future instruction. Later in the month all students will be assessed in several subject areas through the IOWA standardized test.

The T/TH and 5-Day Preschool classes for next year are full, there are only a few spots remaining for the MWF session, and we now have a waiting list for our kindergarten class! Enrollment continues to look promising for next year. We are still accepting registrations for all other grade levels. If you know anyone who is seeking an excellent faith-based education, encourage them to call the school office for more information, including several scholarship opportunities.

Join us in praying for our confirmation candidates as they attend their confirmation retreat this weekend.

Please continue to pray for our students, staff and school as we journey through the remainder of this year with "Jesus as our Guide".

### HUMAN RIGHTS BEGIN IN THE WOMB.

The Human Life Protection Act was introduced in the Ohio Senate. This would prohibit abortions except those necessary to save the mother's life and would only take effect until the Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade. (Bill Sponsors: Senators Kristina Roegner - R & Sandra O'Brien - R.)

April is Abortion Recovery Month. Ministries for this purpose are: surrenderingthesecret.com; saveone.org; godeeperstill.com; or call 1.800.712.4357.

Planned Parenthood and the American Civil Liberties Union filed a lawsuit challenging Ohio's Unborn Child Dignity Act. This act requires abortion facilities to cremate or bury the remains of aborted babies. Mike Gonidakis, president of Ohio Right to Life, said the lawsuit is "more proof of the abortion industry's callous disregard for innocent life."

The American College of Pediatricians released press statements, one of which shows the growing body of evidence that unborn babies can feel pain as early as 12 weeks old as researchers Stuart W.G. Derbyshire & John C. Bockman point out.

Ohio & 18 other states file motion to stop taxpayers from funding abortions through Title X programs. A recent Marist poll shows that a majority of Americans oppose taxpayer funding of abortion – 54% to 39%.

The Equal Rights Amendment is back. The original deadline for it was 1979. The Democrat House leadership voted to retroactively remove the 1979 deadline. This amendment is a threat to innocent life. It would enshrine abortion on demand into the Constitution, mandate taxpayer funding for abortion and invalidate every state law protecting unborn babies and their mothers from abortion. It would also strip conscience protections for health care workers who don't want to participate in abortion.

## SCRIPTURE READINGS FOR THE THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER April 18, 2021

Like our crucified and risen Lord, we will encounter suffering on our road to glory. We rejoice in being called from our baptism to full maturity in Christ. May our celebration strengthen us with hope and free us from our sins.

The mission of the church is to call us to constant conversion and invite us to give witness to our faith in the Risen Lord.

Jesus, the Risen Lord, appears and proclaims peace and forgiveness, the good news of the Resurrection. He tells his disciples that all the writings of the Old Testament (the Hebrew Scriptures) have pointed to this day, and they are now witnesses to it. And he commands them to go out and call others to "change their lives and believe."

The reading from the **Acts of the Apostles** finds Peter doing just that —
proclaiming the Resurrection to those

who killed Jesus. Yet, even to these, he proclaims, "now, change your lives... be forgiven."

### **Acts of the Apostles 3:13-15, 17-19**

The author of life you put to death, but God raised him from the dead.

How have you come to know the forgiveness of sin?

### 1 John 2:1-5a

Whoever keeps His word, the love of God is truly perfected in him. How do you manifest the keeping of God's word?

### Luke 24:35-48

It is written that Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day.

What sufferings have you been able to face because of the hope of the Resurrection?



We progress into the Easter season with Sunday Readings that express the heart of the Christian message proclaimed both very soon after the resurrection and as it continues to be impactful today. Key to these passages is what it means to be a witness of the Gospel.

Speaking with *fire*, that is, speaking in a way that *changes* people – this is what St. Peter and the Apostles do in the First Reading's passage from Acts chapter 3, flowing directly after the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost in Acts chapter 2. The Holy Spirit had appeared and descended upon them as tongues of fire. Again, this means that the Holy Spirit enabled them to speak with power and with fervor, changing hearts and changing people. Indeed, God was now bringing to fulfillment through the fiery words of St. Peter what had been proclaimed "through the mouth of all the prophets" (Acts 3:18).

"Of this we are witnesses," St. Peter cries out on behalf of all the Apostles. They could testify to what they had experienced personally. This entailed having experienced personally two dimensions of their message in particular. On the one hand, they knew well the way Jesus was betrayed and handed over to be crucified, and that a murderer, Barabbas, was preferred to be released instead of Jesus. On the other hand, however, they likewise were witnesses to Jesus' resurrection! They saw Jesus pass through the Upper Room's securely locked door. They heard Jesus recount Scripture passage after Scripture passage – especially prophetic texts – that referred to the Messiah, whose life Jesus fit so completely. Finally, they saw Jesus take a piece of baked fish and consume it in front of them, something that simply a phantasm could not have done. They had witnessed personally Jesus' death and resurrection.

What's more, a witness is someone who not only has seen something happen and is convinced it has happened. A witness also needs to stand by their experience and proclaim it <u>publicly</u>. A witness testifies to what they've experienced. St. Peter and the other Apostles, again, testified to their experiences not only with ordinary words but also with words empowered by *the Holy Spirit*. Finally, the Holy Spirit then enabled all of the Apostles, in time, to offer their very lives to show that they believed

convincingly who Jesus was. All of them, except the one who had been the youngest Apostle, St. John, eventually were killed for proclaiming Jesus as Lord and Savior and God. Only St. John lived his life to its natural end. His witness, therefore, was to how the Gospel can transform us completely, our minds and our way of life, throughout our whole lives.

As our parish community will be celebrating Confirmation next week (and our "confirmandi" participated in a retreat this weekend), we ask the Holy Spirit to empower them and, indeed, all of us to be witnesses of the Gospel. May we experience that being immersed into life in Jesus transforms our lives and enables us to be witnesses of that transformation as well.

## Pastor's Letter

Praise God that we can continue to enjoy Easter blessings. May you experience Our Lord's life-changing mercy.

We are entering into another phase of Sacraments of Initiation during this Easter Season, including Confirmation next Sunday, April 18th, and First Communion on Sunday, May 2nd. Congratulations to all who have participated in the Sacraments of Initiation. Please keep all of them and their sponsors in prayer.

I'm looking forward to next Saturday's hiking trip. We have had at least half a dozen people mention to me that they are interested in participating in this hike. Since several of us are needing to begin with a trail that is manageable for a first hike, I'm planning to meet hikers at the parking lot for the Stone House Loop, which is Trail #10 on Salt Fork State Park maps, at 10:30 a.m. If you would like to carpool or caravan, I will plan to leave from the Gomber Avenue parish parking lot at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday morning April 17th. See you at either place!

This afternoon (Friday) I participated in a Zoom meeting about the distribution of food to Haiti. From the USA, 77 parishes participated to raise funds for more than a million pounds of food! It will be distributed from more than 26 sea containers to Haiti!

These will be 14 sea containers of rice from Guyana (718,242 pounds of rice) and 8 sea containers of beans from Brazil (304,000 pounds of beans). This more than one million pounds of food will be distributed in a staggered way over 3 months, April through June. We are blessed that it looks like our twin parish in Caracol, St. Elisabeth Parish, is among those receiving the food distribution in April, through the northern dioceses of Cap-Haitien and Fort-Liberte. They mentioned in this Zoom meeting that PTPA & Food for the Poor actually are establishing a new warehouse in Caracol itself, so this will be a true on-going blessing for St. Elisabeth.

Imagine going to the grocery store and trying to load this amount of food. Each parish will receive 100 bags of rice (99-lbs. bags) for a total of 9,900 pounds of rice and 38 bags of beans (110-lbs. bags) for a total of 4,180 pounds of beans, for a total of 14,080 pounds of food. This was from \$2,000 in donations from our parish that was then matched by a donor through Food for the Poor. This partnership with Food for the Poor was coordinated through a group called PTPA (Parish Twinning Program of the Americas).

Again, thank you for participating all of the various collections we have had for this twin parish program. We were just at the edge of having an evening of sacred music to connect even more when the COVID situation began. The people of St. Elisabeth's in Caracol produced a beautiful DVD of music from a Mass that was offered in January 2020 that we were planning to present that night. We will be looking forward to having a better breakthrough now that the COVID situation is changing. The food insecurity there is very profound, so this will be a very important part of our relationship.

May the Lord help us to experience the joy of the transforming power of God's love and mercy for us. Happy Easter!
