



The Rosary is intended to bring us ever closer to Christ in humble devotion and sincere love. What makes this effective meditation on the mysteries so especially fruitful, however, is the fact that we combine it with prayer with Mary. We mediate

If you have yet to develop a relationship with your spiritual mother, Mary, the month of May — devoted to Our Lady — is a great time to start or to increase your devotion. Here is a brief summary about the Living Rosary here at Christ Our Light Parish.

What is the Living Rosary?


The Living Rosary is a prayer group that requires a short, simple, daily commitment from the members. Parishioners form teams of five members, with each member individually praying one decade of the Rosary, so that each day the team completes a full Rosary. Each team will have one special intention for which they offer their decade in addition to prayer intentions of the members. Each member follows a calendar indicating the mystery to meditate on as they pray their decade, which can be prayed at any time. We have 13 Teams actively participating in the Living Rosary. Anyone may join our Living Rosary prayer group, and it would be best for younger children to be guided by an adult or older sibling.

SCRIPTURE READINGS FOR THE SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER May 9, 2021


The call to discipleship is rooted in love, for God is

love. The Eucharist calls us to remember and enter more fully into the mystery of God's love revealed fully in Jesus Christ.

The mission of the <u>Church</u> is to love—all people, everywhere.

The ultimate sign of the Christian believer is love. Love is not an option. It is the commandment of the one who witnessed to his love for us by giving his life. The Gospel tells us, with the clearest of focus, "You are my friend if... you love one another.

In the first reading St. Peter tells us that this love must be all inclusive. God does not have favorite people. God's Spirit is poured out on the Gentiles as well as on the Jewish people. The Christian



community is founded not in external circumstances but in Christ's love.

Acts of the Apostles 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

In truth, I see that God shows no partiality.

Have you experienced God's unconditional love for you?

1 John 4:7-10

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is of God.

Who is the most difficult person for you to love as God asks?

John 15:1-8

This I command you: love one another.

Who is the person who is most loveable for you? Why is that person easily loved?

This is a time of year when much growth is happening all around us every day. This

is a time of year for spiritual growth as well. This means becoming more aware of being immersed into life in Jesus. Our Mass readings for this Sunday and next Sunday both speak of this spiritual growth.

This week, for the 5th Sunday of Easter, Year B, Our Lord describes our relationship with him through the image of the Vine and the Branches. Next week, for the 6th Sunday of Easter, is a continuation of that passage from John 15. He says, "It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain" (John 15:16).

What can help us to "go and bear fruit"? Before he gave this command to his apostles at the Last Supper Jesus had said two things that can give us a confident joy to know he is helping us to carry it out. He had said, "I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing. I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father" (15:15) and "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy may be complete" (15:11). We will have the strength to lay down our lives for each other, following Jesus' example and command, because his own joy – the joy and confidence that come from close friendship – will be in us.

It might be challenging for us to see our relationship with God from a friendship perspective. We might be more familiar with a king-servant or creditor-debtor perspective, seeing him as perfect and us as quite a bit less than perfect. We might be more familiar with trying to earn God's praises rather than focusing on the joy that he wants to give us that helps us to do the difficult right thing. But Jesus suggests that the spiritual growth he wants for us will come from appreciating the <u>friendship</u> perspective more completely.

Hopefully we have some friendships to which we have become supremely loyal. We couldn't fathom betraying this or that friend. Jesus wants our relationship with Him to become a supremely loyal friendship as well.

This can be challenging when much of our culture puts pressure on our fidelity to Jesus' teaching about respect for life, for example, or about acknowledging our sins and receiving his mercy before receiving his body and blood in Holy Communion (1 Corinthians 11:28). When we in fact turn to him for his mercy and for his assistance in having a restored relationship with him, he is tremendously generous and welcoming with his mercy (Romans 5:6-11).

May his gift of mercy bear fruit in our hearts as a confident joy that we can offer to others. In that way we, too, will bear fruit that will remain.

Gardeners and farmers can thank me for the drenching rains we had this past Wednesday evening and Thursday. I was amazed to see that finally washing my car really did bring on some rain. I washed my car on Tuesday evening and, sure enough, by Wednesday it was raining. Plus, I vacuumed the interior and, wouldn't you know it, the rain was heavy on Thursday! I guess I should apologize for putting it off so long and for contributing in that way to the dry spring weather! I suppose then I would have had to apologize to our baseball and softball players instead!

This spring is also proving to be a time of transition here at Christ Our Light Parish. As you might have seen or heard already our St. Benedict School Principal, Sue Sanders, will conclude her three-year tenure here at the end of this school year. What a tremendous blessing she has been for our School and Parish community! We have begun the search for a new principal with several good inquiries and candidates.

Additionally, Pat Farley, who has served more than 30 years as our Director of Religious Education, is retiring this summer as well. When you see the job description here in today's bulletin, as we begin the search for a new DRE as well, you can likewise see how comprehensive her role(s) in and contributions to the life of our parish have been!

And, we are also grateful for Lynn Padden's exceptional service as Secretary for St. Benedict School. That is indeed a multi-faceted and essential role for the life of the School!

For all three of these, we will need to pray fervently that Our Lord will raise up and show us the right people to carry on serving in these capacities and to further the mission of the Church. Their successors will see how significantly they have provided strong foundations for building on and how those foundations can enable our Parish and School community to flourish even more profoundly.

Congratulations to our students who are receiving their First Holy Communion this Sunday afternoon, May 2nd. Thank you to their families and household members as well as to all who have helped to inspire them and to form them with the gift of faith in Jesus' presence through the Eucharist. God bless!

- The DRE will coordinate the Safe Environment/Child Protection Training & Program for those involved with the Parish School of Religion and parish faith formation groups with the Pastor.
