SCRIPTURE READINGS FOR PENTECOST SUNDAY

May 23, 2021

We gather to celebrate the great Feast of Pentecost. Our scripture readings remind us that the abiding presence of the Holy Spirit empowers us to take the good news of Jesus Christ to all people.

The mission of the Church is to do the work of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus breathed into his disciples his own life, the Holy Spirit. By the power of that Spirit, the Church is born. They are now to do what his death and resurrection were all about — forgive. Peace is the greeting of the Risen Lord and peace is His continued presence in the Church.

The Spirit comes upon the disciples with power. In the name of Jesus, in every language, they are empowered to preach about the great things God has done.

Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11

There appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each of them.

Describe a time when you experienced being empowered by the Holy Spirit.

1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13

There are different spiritual gifts but the same spirit.

Which are the gifts of the Spirit you have come to know have been given to you?

John 20:19-23

Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, “Peace be with you.”

How have you experienced the peace of Christ in your life?

For most of the major feast days we celebrate in the Church

we often have several choices of readings we could draw upon for our Mass readings. This is the case for next week’s celebration of the Feast of Pentecost. The variety of possible Old and New Testament readings is meant to help each of us to experience in our individual lives more of the powerful impact from both the original events and the Church’s more recent experiences of those graces.

Pentecost has at least three layers of meaning, based on the experience of the early Church and of the Church throughout the centuries. The outpouring of the Holy Spirit is for the sake of 1) proclaiming the Good News that Jesus is alive, 2) living our relationship with Him with growing depth, and 3) drawing people of all nations into a new unity in Jesus. Our readings reflect all of these layers.

Options for readings at the Saturday Vigil Mass include the first reading from Genesis 11. That’s the famous Tower of Babel passage. Pentecost represents a reversal of the language chaos that resulted from the people of Babel’s arrogant desire for fame. The Holy Spirit draws us into relationships with others, into that new unity in Jesus. The Holy Spirit helps us to communicate more clearly as is needed when we are in better relationships.

Other optional Vigil Mass first readings include prophecies from Ezekiel and Joel, which tell us that it is God’s plan that all of us participate in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and the gifts of the Holy Spirit and that even our desires will change from being given a new heart like God’s own heart.

The optional New Testament/Second Reading is a powerful teaching from St. Paul’s Letter to the Romans, chapter 8. There, in verses 26 and 27, he teaches that the Holy Spirit helps us when, for various reasons, we find it difficult to pray. That could be both because we find it hard to pray for someone and because we just don’t have the “oomph” to pray. The very groaning of our hearts can be converted by the Holy Spirit into a prayer with the Holy Spirit himself doing the praying in us and for us! This helps us to experience difficult moments when we find ourselves weak – like moments of temptation – being changed into moments of very effective grace.

All three of the Gospel options teach us about the range of ways we can experience the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit can be like a river that gives on-going refreshment to our lives (John 7:37-39). The Holy Spirit helps us to have the words we need to give praise and honor to God (John 15 & 16). And, while the first reading from Acts, chapter 2, describes the Holy Spirit as a strong, driving wind that shook the building where the apostles, Mary and other disciples were in hiding, the Gospel passage from John 20 – on the evening of the Resurrection – describes the Holy Spirit as bringing peace and mercy.

May we, also, experience the Holy Spirit giving us the kind of freedom that St. Paul describes in his letter to the Galatians. The Holy Spirit helps us to do those kinds of actions against which there is no law (Gal. 5:23). All of these help us to proclaim, with the assistance of the Holy Spirit, “Jesus Christ is Lord!”

Pastor's Letter

We received messages this morning (Friday, May 14th) from both the Ohio Conference of Catholic Bishops and Bishop Monforton regarding changes in restrictions due to COVID-19. At this point, the plan is for "restoring" the obligation to attend Sunday Mass by the weekend of June 5th/6th. We will be receiving information by next Wednesday, May 19th, about other changes in restrictions.

In light of the CDC statements regarding people who have been vaccinated, at this point we will continue to have masks and disinfecting wipes available at our Christ Our Light Parish church buildings for those who would prefer to wear them while attending Mass and other in-church prayer events and gatherings. We will likewise maintain the distancing ropes between the pews until we receive the green light to remove them.

Deacon Jeremiah has completed his seminary studies and is closing in on the priesthood ordination this upcoming Friday, May 21st. He has scheduled two Masses of Thanksgiving here at Christ Our Light Parish: Thursday, May 27th, at 8:35 a.m. and Sunday, June 6th, at 10:30 a.m. Please keep him in prayer throughout this week!

I'm looking forward to next Sunday afternoon's trek of the Holy Hikers. I'm planning for the "family friendly" Morgan's Knob Trail (#11 on the Salt Fork Trail Maps), which also has the option of the additional Pine Crest Loop. You could either meet at 2:30 p.m. at the Gomber Avenue parking lot, to caravan or carpool, or ~3:00 p.m. at that trail's parking lot, which is on the righthand side of the road toward Salt Fork Lodge.

Please pause at some time during the day on Monday, May 17th, and offer at least a decade of the Rosary to participate in the Marathon of Prayer called for by Pope Francis for the complete end of the pandemic. If you'd like to participate further, the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C., has been chosen to lead the worldwide recitation of the Rosary that day at 12 noon ET/6pm Rome time. Cardinal Wilton Gregory, Archbishop of Washington, will lead the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary. Go to uscgb.org for online links to that event.

May the Lord help us to experience the transforming power of God's love and mercy! May we all experience continued Easter Season blessings!

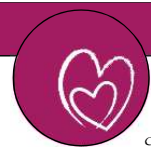
