





# READINGS FOR THE 13TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME June 26, 2022

Jesus' call to discipleship is at the heart of the Christian journey. As disciples, we are called to accompany Jesus from death to new life. In order to prepare ourselves to enter into these sacred mysteries, let us ask the Lord for the gift of his mercy.

The focus of our readings is call and response. In the reading from **The first** book of Kings, Elisha is called to follow Elijah. The Gospel presents us with the conditions for following Jesus. In both readings, those who are called, request time to take care of things at home before following. Elijah grants this request to Elisha. But Jesus responds to his followers by insisting that the response be immediate. Why? What makes these calls different? Note that when Elisha is called, he is called to "replace" Elijah after Elijah dies. There does not seem to be an urgency in this call. But the disciples were not called to replace Jesus or even to follow at some later time. Jesus is the living Lord,

always with us. And when he calls, everything else must be given up. True followers are ready to leave everything and follow immediately. Our response is, "You call us, Lord, to follow you. Here I am; I come to do your will."



#### 1 Kings 19:16, 19-21

You shall anoint Elisha, son of Shaphat of Abed-meholah, as prophet to succeed you.

How have you experienced God's call in your life?

#### **Galatians 5:1, 13-18**

If you are guided by the Spirit, you are not under the law.

How do you see yourself being guided by the Spirit to do God's will?

#### Luke 9:51-62

No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God.

Do you experience the word of God bringing an urgency to your life?

In next Sunday's Mass readings, we do <u>not</u> encounter the <u>Good</u> Samaritan! Instead, we encounter the "Unwelcoming Samaritans" and their <u>lack</u> of hospitality, which prompted the Apostles James and John to ask Jesus to call down fire from heaven to consume the whole town! Why was there such animosity between the Jewish people and the Samaritans?

To understand this relationship between the Jewish people and the Samaritans we need to go back to around 1250 B.C. Around that time, the <u>twelve</u> tribes of the Hebrews were united and arrived in the Promised Land of Canaan, called Israel by all of the Hebrew people. Each of the tribes settled in a different part of that country. The tribe of Levi did not settle in a particular region because as the priestly tribe they settled wherever holy places for offering sacrifices to the Lord were established throughout Israel. Around 1000 B.C., King David established Jerusalem as the royal city for all of the Hebrew tribes, in the part of Israel controlled by the tribe of Judah – a.k.a, the Judeans.

In 700 B.C. the powerful Assyrian Empire attacked Israel and conquered most of the country, except the mountainous region in the south controlled by the tribes of

Judah and Benjamin, including Jerusalem. <u>These survivors</u> became the <u>Jewish people</u>. Many of the others were taken into exile in Assyria. And people from other countries were moved into those regions and over a couple of centuries they mixed with the remaining Hebrews of that northern area and in time <u>became the Samaritans</u>.

In the early 500s B.C., the Babylonian Empire conquered the Assyrian Empire and then, in 597 B.C., they conquered the southern region of Judah and Benjamin and destroyed the Temple in Jerusalem that King David's son, Solomon, had built to house the Ark of the Covenant. Seventy years later, the Babylonian Empire weakened and was replaced by another empire that then helped the surviving Jewish people to rebuild the Temple in Jerusalem. The Samaritans offered to help rebuild the Temple. But their offer was refused because the Judean leaders – a.k.a. Jewish leaders – refused the help of the Samaritans who, again, were seen as a mixed race and not as true Hebrews. So, the Samaritans established another temple on Mt. Gerizim. Then, some of the Jewish survivors of the Babylonian exile re-settled in the northern region of Israel, which became known as Galilee. The

Jewish Galileans had to pass through Samaria if they wanted to go to the Temple in Jerusalem. Joseph and Mary settled in Galilee, in Nazareth, and that is where Jesus grew up. All of this is the background for next Sunday's Gospel when Jesus and his disciples were walking from Galilee through Samaria to Jerusalem.

So, as we will read in that Gospel, when the Samaritans refused to allow Jesus and his disciples to pass through their village because they were Jewish and were going to Jerusalem, that's when James and John wanted Jesus to call down fire from heaven to destroy the village. Instead, Jesus used the hardship from not having been welcomed to reinforce to his disciples the hardships that are part of being one of his followers. Jesus' disciples will need to make a complete commitment to Him because of likely hardships.

Jesus would also then become a <u>unifying</u> bridge between the Jewish people and the Samaritans. In a couple of weeks, we <u>will</u> read about the <u>Good</u> Samaritan in the Gospel of the 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time, from Luke, chapter 10. And, in Luke 17:1-11, we read that among ten lepers who Jesus healed the only one who returned to give thanks was a Samaritan. Finally, in the Acts of the Apostles we read about the action of the Holy Spirit bringing <u>reconcilitation</u> between the Jewish and Samaritan disciples of Jesus (Acts 8:4-8, 14-17, 25).

May the grace of Jesus' victory over the cross help us likewise have confidence to enter into a more complete commitment to Him and to participate in the work of reconciliation and healing that is part of being a follower of Jesus.

# **Pastor's Letter**

As we transition into summer, how nice to have a weekend of relief after last week's oppressive heat!

We have been having issues with the phone system in the office especially after it rains over these past few weeks. This past week was especially bad with a couple of rainy nights or evenings that have left us without phone service in the office for a couple full days. The phone company we have been working with said that they will be sending out the technician who installed the system to see what might be the underlying problem.

Also please note that we are planning the return of receiving the Precious Blood at Mass at the Sunday Masses this weekend (including the 5:00 p.m. Mass). This seems like a most appropriate weekend for reintroducing this, as we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi! We plan to begin with simply one chalice on each side (two total) since many might still be reluctant to receive from the chalice. Please note that *intinction* (dipping the Host into the chalice) is not an option, because of the more likely potential for dripping the Precious Blood outside of the chalice. We will plan to return to offering the chalice at daily Masses as well.

All are welcome to participate in the Corpus Christi procession and Benediction at Sts. Peter & Paul Oratory, starting around 1:30 p.m., after the 12:15 p.m. Mass today (Sunday, June 19th). See additional information in other parts of this bulletin.

This Friday, June 24th, we are looking forward to the Consecration Mass for Alycia Oswald. She will be taking a step into one of the earliest forms of religious vocation in the Church, called Consecrated Virginity Lived in the World. Some of the earliest women martyrsaints in the Church participated in this form of religious life. This form of religious and "consecrated life" has been growing rapidly from the early 1900s and especially since the Second Vatican Council and its call for a revival and renewal of religious life. Alycia will be taking that step into this form of religious vocation on Friday, June 24th, at 5:30 p.m. at St. Benedict Church. Bishop Monforton will be the consecrating bishop. All parishioners and truly everyone is welcome to participate in this Mass of Consecration and the reception afterward.

Don't forget about Vacation Bible School this week, Monday, June 20th, through Friday, June 24th, 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., in the St. Benedict Social Hall (and in the gym on Friday because of the Consecration Mass and reception).

If you are around town on Saturday, June 25th, between 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m., 7th Street between Gomber Avenue and Steubenville Avenue will be a **Block Party** involving many of our area churches. Please stop by to visit our Christ Our Light Parish and Right to Life tables.
