

"Did you feel it?" asked the priest.


"To be sure, I did," replied the man.

READINGS FOR THE 17TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME Sunday, July 26, 2020

The readings for the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time speak of the precious gift of discipleship. As Christians, we are called to turn away from the allurements of this world and to seek the treasures

of the kingdom of heaven. To better prepare our hearts to celebrate these sacred mysteries, let us call to mind our sins as we seek the Lord's mercy.

Our readings focus on seeking the things that are of true and enduring value.

King Solomon is praised for seeking wisdom rather than riches or personal gain. And he desired wisdom in order to better serve his kingdom.

The Gospel gives us two examples of doing everything possible to attain the reign of God. The person who truly



wants the reign of God will sell everything in order to remain faithful to the kingdom. That is true wisdom.

<u>1 Kings 3:5, 7-12</u>

Give your servants, therefore, an understanding heart.

As you reflect on your past life, what is it that you find predominate in your search for satisfaction?

Romans 8:28-30

All things work for good for those who love God. Are you truly able to experience the love of God for you?

Matthew 13:44-52

The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure buried in a field.

What aspects of the life of Heaven motivates you to value Heaven above all things?

A beautiful sports car or a perfect house on a gorgeous piece of property is easy to

desire. You can visualize them in your own mind or you can see them displayed on a dealer's lot or zipping past you on the highway! You can walk around on a piece of property and even become familiar with the smell of a new house or new car.

How can we desire more deeply those realities that endure forever that we can't always notice right away? Can some of these other beautiful things draw us to desire what's "transcendent," such as wisdom? Next Sunday's readings show us the way!

"The Kingdom of Heaven is like a treasure **buried** in a field..." It's not obvious right away. It's been buried for safekeeping. The footnote for this verse in the *New American Bible* (Matt. 13:44) says, "In the unsettled conditions of Palestine in Jesus' time, it was not unusual to guard valuables by burying them in the ground." But then, according to God's good will and good timing, comes the time for revelation, for finding the treasure. The person who found the treasure would probably have been simply a worker in the field, doing some day labor for the property

owner. To his surprise and very much to his delight, he discovers this buried treasure.

This parable describes a **wise** man! He has found the most valuable of all treasures and he is willing to give everything so that he can have the land with that buried treasure, a treasure that is without price. It is worth it for him to give everything for it because it will pay him back perpetually – it's benefits will never run out!

That's the kind of relationship and experience the Lord is inviting us into. He wants us to experience Him as the most valuable of all treasures! **Knowing Jesus** is that great treasure. Its worth everything we've got. That is true wisdom!

The evangelist and apostle Matthew records Jesus as using the phrase "Kingdom of Heaven," reflecting the practices of the good, devout Jewish faithful. Using "Heaven" rather than the word "God" or the name of God expresses deep esteem for God the Father. "Finding the Kingdom of Heaven" means experiencing the "reign of God" in our hearts. We experience Jesus reigning in our hearts. That's what it's like when we "know Jesus" – we experience Jesus subduing sin in our hearts and helping us to want to praise the Father. We experience Him giving us a peace and knowledge we couldn't have on our own without him. When we struggle with sin or feel empty in our worship of the Father, Jesus invites us to turn to Him.

This is described in Hebrews 4:15-16, "For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who has similarly been tested in every way, yet without sin. So let us confidently approach the throne of grace to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help." Some people have found it helpful both when they pray and when they need help with temptations to visualize in their mind's eye entering into the throne room of God, both simply to be with Him and to ask for His help. God the Father loves it when we actually turn to Him. He welcomes and encourages us and gives us the assistance we need through an awareness of the real presence of Jesus with us, reigning in our hearts, reigning over that temptation or praying with us. Remember that we use Jesus' very words when we pray the Lord's Prayer, for example.

What can help us to desire this relationship? Experiencing God's perspective about us can help. God sees **us** as the most valuable of all treasures. Is God willing to give us His all to purchase the field of our souls, of who we are? By simply looking at the cross and empty tomb and we can say a resounding, "Amen!"

We can even say, "Lord, I'll sell you this sin I'm holding onto; I'll let go of it for you"! Yes, the Lord desires to take our lives and then swap with us for His land that has the great treasure of eternal **life**. He invites us to dig around in a relationship with Him and to discover Jesus as our greatest treasure.

Pastor's Letter

This might be largely an echo of last week's bulletin. In part, we seem so close to either progressing toward slowing down the spread of COVID-19 or returning to some degree of the lockdown situation. In his address on Wednesday evening you could tell that Governor DeWine so strongly wants to resist having to make masks mandatory and returning to another lockdown. Thank you to all of you who, again, are playing it extra safe now that the number of cases in our county has been increasing.

Thankfully, it seems that health care professionals have a better handle on managing this virus so that the mortality rate remains relatively low. Nevertheless, it sounds like a fair number of those who have contracted it, especially those with other underlying conditions, have had lasting effects. So, let's do our best to keep our homes and the various buildings on our parish properties havens of cleanliness.

We'll continue to provide a live stream of at least one Mass per day at our parish's Facebook page [Christ Our Light Parish, Guernsey County, OH]. And, Lord willing, we will improve our parish's YouTube channel [it has a very similar "address": Christ Our Light Parish Guernsey County Ohio] so that these liturgies could be accessed through that means as well. For some people YouTube is easier to access than Facebook. We'll continue to try different camera angles and ways of boosting and improving the sound quality. We have also been live streaming Evening Prayer and Benediction on Wednesdays at 4:30 p.m. and posting the text for that prayer service at our parish website: <u>www.christourlightparish.com</u>. From the menu or along the top banner you can see the link for "Liturgy of the Hours." That's where you can access the text for the weekly Evening Prayer and Benediction, part of our weekly 9:00 a.m. – 9:00 p.m. Eucharistic Adoration.

And, to echo again what I mentioned last week about our Bereavement Haven support group in last week's letter: in light of scheduling the First Communion Mass for Sunday afternoon last week, please note that our Bereavement Haven support group will meet this week/today, Sunday, July 19th, at 2:30 p.m. in the St. Benedict social hall (which has sufficient space to maintain safe distances). This group usually meets on the second Sunday afternoon of each month for several years and will plan to continue to do so. The group has recently been discussing a very effective book, Finding a Loving God in the Midst of Grief, reading and reflecting on a chapter-at-a-time. This week we're planning to read and reflect on Chapter 4 of that book. Sharing resources like these as well as simply enjoying the time of fellowship have helped this group to be impactful.

May the Lord keep us protected and healthy and, as always, well prepared for the gift of eternal life!
