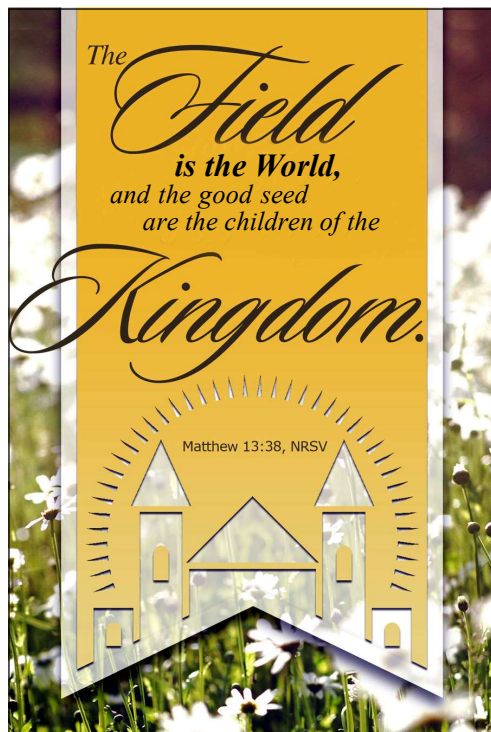

## READINGS FOR THE 16TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

### Sunday, July 19, 2020

The Gospel for the 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time is brimming with powerful images of the kingdom of God. As children of the Kingdom let us turn to the Lord seeking mercy for the times we have failed to let the word of God take root in our hearts.



The Gospel passage for the 16th Sunday is a continuation of Matthew's parables of the reign of heaven. In the reading, Jesus compares the Kingdom to a mustard seed and yeast. Both result in a surprise, and that's the point of the parables. The Kingdom, here and now, may seem small and hardly noticeable — but like the mustard seed and the yeast, it is more than it seems. We don't always see the results of our small, sometimes hidden efforts. The world situation could lead to discouragement. Today's parables encourage us to see beyond the present and to know that what can and will be is already here in small, hidden ways. The reign of God is already among us.

#### Wisdom 12:13, 16-19

**Though you are the master of might, you judge with clemency.**

How have you come to experience the mercy/clemency of God?

#### Romans 8:26-27

**The Spirit intercedes for the holy ones according to God's will.**

What difficult situations do you have that need the Holy Spirit's intercession?

#### Matthew 13:24-43

**He who sows good seed is the Son of Man.**

How have you experienced the "seed" of faith growing in your life?

**Next Sunday is the second of three successive Sundays with Gospels from Chapter 13** of the Gospel of Matthew. We could call this "Parables of the Kingdom of God, Part Two."

In an interesting commentary about this Gospel, Fr. Raniero Cantalamessa, OFM Cap., points out both that the patience of God is oriented toward our salvation and that even when we and those who oppose Christianity are angered by injustice in the world that anger simply reinforces that the desire for goodness is something we all ultimately have in common. This aching for goodness and justice can lead to all contributing to the ultimate and victory of goodness.

Fr. Cantalamessa served as "Preacher to the Papal Household" for three popes. "That means that sometimes he preaches at daily Masses while the Pope simply presides and that he organizes retreats for the Pope and other Vatican staff members.

**Fr. Cantalamessa said:** Jesus sketched the situation of the Church in the world with three parables. "The third parable in Next Sunday's Gospel, about dough and the leaven, also describes growth of the Kingdom of God. However, the emphasis is not so much about its growth extending from one place to another but about the Kingdom growing in intensity, for example more completely in our hearts or more strongly in our community. The force of the Gospel, like yeast, provides a transforming growth."

These two parables were easily understood by the disciples, but not so the third, the seeds and the weeds, which Jesus explained to them separately. The sower, he said, was himself, the good seeds were the children of the Kingdom, the bad seeds were the children of the evil one, the field was the world and the harvest was the end of the world.

"In the early days of the Church, in the third century after Christ, Jesus' parable about the weeds and the wheat was the focus of a memorable dispute that people in our day

and time bring up in similar concepts but using different terms.” There were Sectarian Spirits the Donatists, who resolved the matter in a simplistic way: on one hand was the Church (their church) made up wholly and solely of the perfect; on the other was the world full of children of the evil one, without hope of salvation.

St. Augustine opposed them: The field, he explained, is, indeed, the world, but it is also the Church, the place in which saints and sinners live side-by-side, and in which there is room to grow and to be converted. “The evil-doers,” he said, “exist in this way either so that they will be converted, or because through them the good exercise patience.”

Hence the scandals that every now and then shake the Church should sadden, but not surprise us. The Church is made of human persons, not wholly and solely of saints. There are weeds also in every one of us, not only in the world and in the Church, and this should render us less ready to point the finger.

Perhaps the main subject of the parable, however, is neither the seeds nor the weeds, but God’s patience. The liturgy underlines it with the selection of the first reading, which is a hymn to God’s strength that is manifested under the form of patience and indulgence. **God’s patience** is not simply patience, namely, awaiting the Day of Judgment so as to punish more severely. It is forbearance - mercy - the will to **save**.

Pastor’s Letter

With the numbers of COVID-19 cases increasing especially with a relative surge locally, we would all benefit from having the mentality that the various good hygiene practices we’ve been observing over these several months have been to prepare us for now. Now is when we especially need to be attentive to keeping the air around us clean in response to this largely airborne virus.

We have been cleaning all of the surfaces in our churches several times a week, including a full cleaning before the Saturday and Sunday Masses at St. Benedict and thoroughly each week at Sts. Peter and Paul and before and after other events there. We have masks available at each location and both disinfecting spray and hand sanitizer. Please continue to utilize these when you visit our churches.

Likewise, we ask all visitors to our parish offices to wear masks. And, as you can see elsewhere in this bulletin, our St. Vincent de Paul volunteers are not meeting with clients in the offices but are conducting almost all of their outreach services by phone and fax. We ask the Lord to strengthen our hope and peace for persevering to the end of this pandemic.

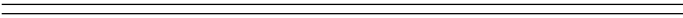

May their experience of extended patience in preparation for this milestone encourage all of us who have likewise had to persevere with a longing to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, especially recently.

Over the history of the Church, there have been times when it was later in life and less frequently that the faithful would receive Communion, as you well know.

Even a great saint like St. Therese of Lisieux grew in holiness very profoundly through less frequent yet reverent reception of Communion. So, may a better appreciation for how Jesus feeds our souls through the Eucharist be among the fruits of this extended time of dealing with the coronavirus as well.

And, to echo what I mentioned about the Bereavement Haven support group in last week’s letter: in light of scheduling the First Communion Mass for this Sunday afternoon, please note that our Bereavement Haven support group will meet next Sunday, July **19th** at 2:30 p.m. in the St. Benedict Social Hall (which has sufficient space to maintain safe distances). This group has been meeting on the second Sunday afternoon of each month for several years and will plan to *continue* to do so. The group has recently been discussing a very effective book, Finding a Loving God in the Midst of Grief, reading and reflecting on a chapter-at-a-time. Sharing resources like these as well as simply enjoying the time of fellowship have helped this group to be impactful.

May the Lord keep us protected and healthy and, as always, well prepared for the gift of eternal life!
