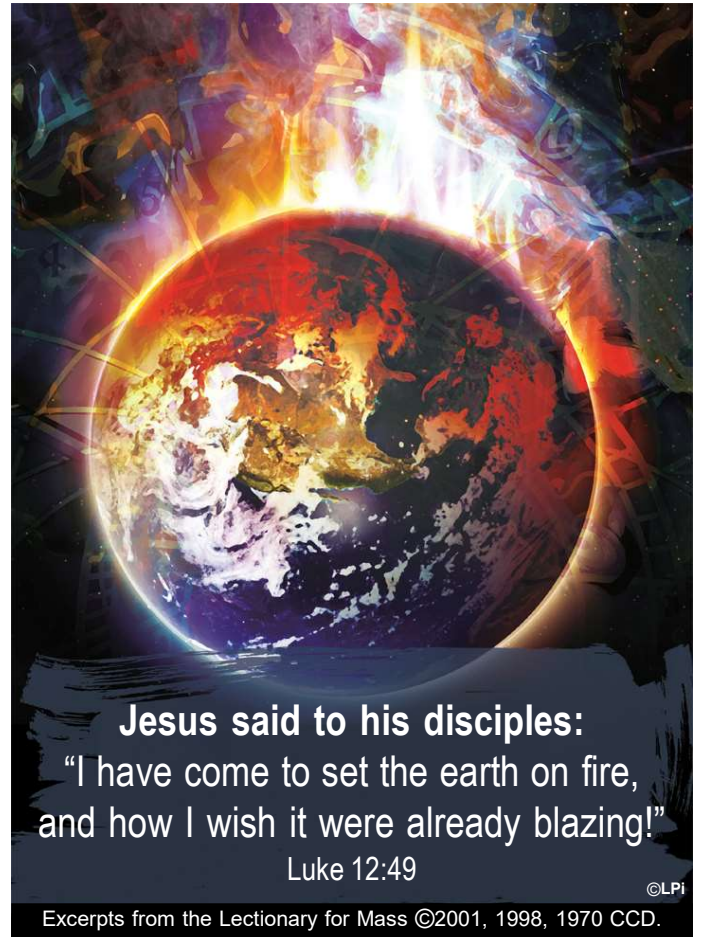
RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: Parish School of Religion (PSR) classes for children in grades K through 8 are held Sunday mornings from September to May.

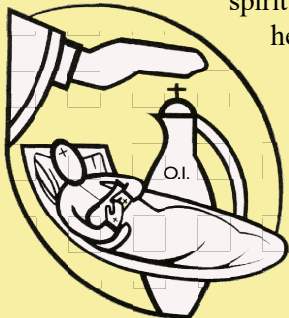

READINGS FOR THE 21ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

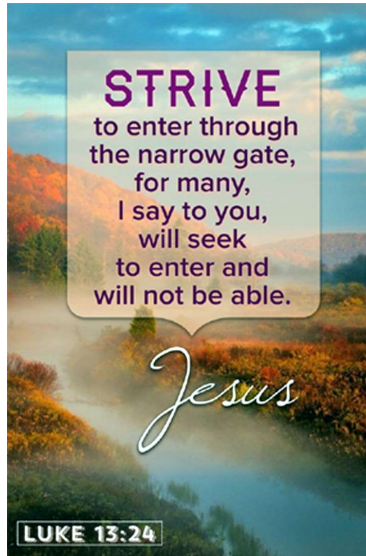
August 25, 2019

Strive to enter through the narrow gate. These prophetic words of Jesus beckon all believers to live each day as faithful disciples. In order to prepare our hearts to celebrate these sacred mysteries, let us turn to the Lord seeking mercy for our sins.

The focus of both the first reading and the gospel is universality. In the first reading, we have the prophecy that God will gather people from all over the world. Not only the Israelites, but all people will know and praise God.

The gospel appears to contradict itself. First, Jesus says that the door to heaven is narrow, and his parable seems to indicate “getting in” will not be easy. But the passage goes on to say that people will come from everywhere and sit at the table of God’s Kingdom.

In fact, these are not contradictory. All people are invited to the Kingdom, without reference to race or nationality (or assumed importance). But, all people must enter through Jesus, the door. There are no guarantees for



“card carrying members.” We are saved by believing in Jesus and being faithful to his ways.

All people will know and praise you. I am the door; come in by me.

Isaiah 66:18-21

I come to gather nations of every language, they shall come and see my glory.

Who are the people who you find difficult to see as numbered among God’s chosen ones?

Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

Endure your trials as discipline.

How do you come to accept difficulty or pain as a worthy offering for our good?

Luke 13:22-30

Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough.

When has your faith been shaken (or perhaps lost)? How has that experience helped you to grow in faith?

Next week’s Sunday Mass Readings provide teachings on salvation, especially that the gift of salvation is offered to those who we might least expect.

Jesus turns from teaching us parables about the Kingdom of God in the verses before this passage (Luke 13:13-21) to the requirements for entrance into that kingdom.

And, we are not to assume that the gift of salvation is something automatic. We are asked to provide faithful evidence that we belong to the Lord.

We reflected on “discipleship training” over three Sunday Masses in July and August. Jesus speaks in next week’s Gospel about being “strong enough” to enter through the narrow gate. Likewise, in the Second Reading next week we read an exhortation to “not disdain the discipline of the Lord or lose heart when reproved by him” (Hebrews 12:5). Athletic coaches and personal trainers prompt us to build up physical strength. Mental health counselors walk with us in building up emotional strength and coping skills. Jesus

helps us to have the greatest strength possible, the strength to pass through the narrow gate.

What does this mean? This is the narrow gate of living as our Savior Jesus did in His love for the Father and for the people in our lives in the Holy Spirit. And it is participating in His dying and rising. It is being open to the prompting and guidance of the Holy Spirit that both enables us to do what is right in God’s eyes – i.e., beginning to live as people with one foot in heaven! – and gives us the grace of salvation.

The door of salvation is open to all who are open to the Holy Spirit’s prompting to pass through the “narrow gate” of self-surrender, of love, and to be released from the chains of selfishness and of sin. It is praying for our persecutors and those who are tempting us rather than replying with destructiveness and sin.

Christian discipline, as we read in the Second Reading, is not without effect, for it unites the faithful disciples to Christ, who “Son though he was, he learned obedience

from what he suffered” (Hebrews 5:8). Discipline “brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it” (Hebrews 12:11). Being trained in Christian discipline means that our Lord Jesus helps us to grow in the habit of turning to the help of the Holy Spirit in the face of persecution, suffering or temptation, which, again, brings a peaceful result.

May the Lord help us to be open to this grace of salvation and to joining people of every nation who “bring their offering to the house of the Lord in clean vessels” (Isaiah 66:18), as we read in next week’s First Reading. May the Holy Spirit transform each of us into new and eternal Life in Jesus, our Savior.

Pastor’s Letter

Back to school time gives us great opportunities to ask the Holy Spirit to be active in our lives. The Holy Spirit is very active when the mission of the Church is advancing and God’s plan of salvation is unfolding. We might not usually think about the place of God’s grace when shopping for backpacks and folders and calculators. But, again, this is a season of grace.

Tomorrow (Monday) our St. Benedict School teachers will begin the week with a time of reflection and prayer. We will be asking the Lord to surround them and all of our students and staff with not only an eagerness to learn the fundamentals of reading, writing and arithmetic but also with an openness to experience life in Jesus at the heart of their daily activities throughout this school year.

I am grateful for all of our teachers and staff who are open to serving the deeper mission of educating with the desire to be planting the seeds of faith in Christ, even when that entails additional sacrifice on their part as well. Thank you to Susan Sanders as she begins this second year as our principal. She has very much gone the extra mile as this new school year has been approaching. We welcome Emily Klinger as our new language arts teacher and Kelli Reineccius Bruns as our new Kindergarten

teacher. Kelli is a St. Benedict School and Bishop Rosecrans graduate and had done student teaching with Mrs. Denniston in the Kindergarten, and so we are looking forward to welcoming her return.

Tomorrow is the Back to School night and Wednesday is the first day of school. And, we will begin with the weekly all-school Mass this Thursday morning as well. All are welcome to participate in that 8:35 a.m. daily Mass, but please note that we lock the external doors of the church building as soon as Mass begins. And, because we have breakfast available for students, the access to the social hall is restricted in the mornings as well on the other days of the week and we usually do not open the upper doors to the church before daily Mass until about 8:00 a.m.

And, we will soon be re-opening the gym once the curing of the final coat of finish is complete. Again, additional donations to that refurbishing project would be much appreciated. Please contact me if you would like to participate in this further or for the first time.

May the Lord help us to journey together open to the graces of the Holy Spirit ever more joyfully and faithfully, always ready for the gift of eternal life!
