

THE READINGS FOR THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY August 15, 2021

Today we celebrate Mary's glorious Assumption into heaven. As Christians, we also believe that one day

our own human bodies will share in the glory of the Resurrection. In order to prepare our hearts to celebrate the wondrous mysteries of our faith, let us ask the Lord for mercy and pardon.

Both the First Reading and Gospel, as they are chosen and placed together for this feast, tell us something about the place of Mary in the Church. The reading from **Revelation**, rich in symbolism, presents Mary in various aspects of her role in the Church. She is the image of the Church with the 12 stars (12 tribes of Israel, 12 Apostles) around her head. And the crown seems to indicate her entrance into heaven where she received the reward of those who remain faithful (2 Timothy 4:8).



indicates the real meaning of the Feast of the Assumption. Mary is the Mother of the Lord, and all generations will

call her blessed because she believed. The Feast of the Assumption places Mary among the Blessed, and indeed as the model of the Blessed.

Revelations 11:19, 12:1-6, 10

A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon beneath her feet, and on her head a crown of 12 stars. How have you already experienced God's victory in your life?

<u>1 Corinthians 15:20-27</u>

For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. In what area of your life are you now asking for God's victory?

Luke 1:39-56

Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb.

How did Mary respond to the Archangel's announcement?

The Gospel reading, usually called "The Visitation,"

Throughout the Church year we have many different days when we celebrate memorials, feast days and solemnities for Mary, the Mother of Jesus. Next week on

Sunday, August 15th, we will celebrate the Assumption of Mary in place of the 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year B. That is because the Assumption of Mary is celebrated as a Solemnity, meaning it's the highest level of days that we observe throughout the year. It is always celebrated on August 15th and when it is during the week (Tuesday through Friday) we observe it as a Holy Day of Obligation.

Furthermore, we can say that because Mary was blessed with such an abundance of spiritual gifts and graces that we need these many days throughout the year to consider these graces with special emphasis. For example, on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on December 8th we consider how Our Lord Jesus blessed his mother with profound gifts of protection from sin – and we reflect on and pray for those graces for ourselves as well, that we may cooperate better with the protection from sin that God offers us. What spiritual gifts and graces do we consider with a special focus on August 15th, the Assumption of Mary, body and soul into Heaven?

All of us want to be brought safely home to Heaven. At the moment of her passing from this life into the next, we believe that Mary had no trace of sin. So, death had no way to affect her. We believe that, like the prophet Elijah, and like Jesus' own ascension 40 days after the Resurrection, Mary was taken up into Heaven, body and soul. In the eastern Church, both Catholic and Orthodox, this solemn feast day is referred to as the "Dormition of Mary", that is, the falling asleep of Mary.

In the document formally declaring the belief in the Assumption of Mary to be an infallible teaching of the Church, entitled *Munificentissimus Deus* (meaning "the most bountiful God"), an emphasis was placed at the very beginning of that document on how in spite of the many sorrows we may face in our lives, "by means of joys that [God] interposes in their lives from time to time, in such a way that, under different conditions and in different ways, all things may work together unto good for those who love him." Pope Pius XII drew upon Romans 8:28 for the last phrase of that statement. In that same document, *Munificentissimus Deus* (try saying that 5 times, fast!), Pope Pius XII highlights how Mary is the fulfillment of the Ark of the Covenant in the Old Testament, as the living vessel of Jesus, who is the true Living Word and Bread of Life – since the Ark was a pure vessel, which held the tablets of the Ten Commandments, the Word, and some of the manna, bread from heaven. The Ark of the Covenant is seen in Heaven in the vision in the Book of Revelation (12:1) with Mary,

the Woman crowned with stars (nn. 26 & 27). In Psalm 132:8, King David also sings about the Ark being taken up to its peaceful resting place (n. 29).

The Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary, therefore, has graces especially associated both with final perseverance into Heaven at the end of our lives and with the joy of seeing difficult moments working out for good. May we experience a bountiful measure of those graces in our lives and world today!

Pastor's Letter

You've seen a number of "thank-yous" throughout this bulletin for all who made last Sunday's parish picnic a possibility and an enjoyable reality. I wholeheartedly echo those "thank-yous." God blessed our parish with many people – of all ages! – who were very accurate at hitting the dunk tank target!

We ask the Lord to give us both healthy optimism and common-sense cautiousness about the direction of our community health circumstances with the COVID-19 variant.

On the one hand, we are continuing to restore activities that we enjoyed before last year's lockdowns began in March 2020. And, Bishop Monforton has reinforced that we would not have another closure to public Masses as we had last year. On the other hand, we will continue to monitor the current spread of new COVID cases and understand if it becomes clear that a return to some forms of additional precautions is necessary.

I am looking forward to gathering again for a donut and some coffee this Sunday and to enjoying an ice cream sundae next Sunday (and Saturday?) to support the promotion and formation of seminarians for our Diocese of Steubenville.
