READINGS FOR THE 21ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME August 22, 2021

"Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life." These poignant words of Peter


challenge each one of us to make a choice to follow Jesus. As disciples of Christ, let us ask the Lord to increase our faith as we seek mercy for our sins.

The focus of the readings is our freedom to choose God. We must choose whether or not we will follow Christ. God does not force anyone. If we are to be true disciples, it must be a free, loving choice. That is a profound and often overlooked revelation of God.

The Israelites are told, "You must choose whether you will serve our God or false gods."

Jesus asks his disciples, "Will you also leave me?"

Our readings call us to reflect on whether or not we have made a conscious choice to follow Christ.



Joshua 24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b

As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord.

Most of our parents chose to ask for baptism for us as children. Have we affirmed the faith we have been baptized into?

Ephesians 5:21-32

The two shall become one flesh.

How faithful have you been to the vocational call the Lord has extended to you?

John 6:60-69

Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.

Have you truly turned to the Lord in your daily existence in order that you too may have eternal life in Jesus?

Many people found Jesus' Bread of Life teaching difficult to accept, that we are to eat his body and to drink his blood because that is how He fulfills the meaning of the Passover bread and wine. We read about their response next week, on Sunday, August 22nd, when we have Part Four of this larger passage from John, chapter 6.

On the one hand the people simply said, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" Eating someone's flesh would have been as very hard for them to comprehend as it would be for us. Drinking someone's blood would have been doubly difficult, bearing in mind the Jewish kosher laws which forbid consuming even the blood of animals because one's life was seen to be in their blood. To consume the blood of an animal (in a steak with blood still in it, for example) meant that something of the life of that beast was mingled with one's own life.

On the other hand, the people responded to Jesus by "<u>murmuring</u> about this." Recall that the Hebrew people murmured in the desert when, tired from or afraid within their journey from Egypt to the Promised Land, they cried out that they would rather return to slavery in Egypt.

Jesus' murmuring disciples were also given a moment of decision. This moment was foreshadowed by the scene in the First Reading when they were at the edge of the wilderness, ready finally to cross into the Promised Land. Joshua gave them a moment of decision. Who would they serve? Who would be their god?

To help them to decide, Joshua reminded them about all the various signs and wonders that God had worked for them. God had showed them his sovereign authority in the duel between Moses and Pharaoh. God had shown them that He has authority over life and death. God had shown them his awesome presence on Mt. Sinai and had fed them with the miraculous food, the manna, each day in the desert wilderness.

Jesus had worked many similar signs to help His disciples to trust in His words. He had cured many, many people. He had fed them likewise through the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. And, he had calmed the chaotic seas with simply a word of command, showing his sovereignty and his love.

All of the people with Joshua – whose name is also fore-shadowing of Jesus' name – echoed Joshua's declaration of faith: "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord" with "we also will serve the Lord, for he is our God."

In contrast, only Jesus' closest disciples, led by Simon Peter, decided to remain. "You have the words of eternal life ... you are the Holy One of God." The others "returned to their former way of life and no longer followed him."

Many aspects of Christianity can be difficult for us, more so socially these days, and, at times, morally as well. May we experience Jesus' words and his very presence as the Bread of Life as being truly life giving, giving us the joy and courage we need to be Jesus' faithful and loving disciples.

Pastor's Letter

This week marks the beginning of a new school year. We have the Back-to-School Night for St. Benedict School tomorrow evening, Monday, August 16th, in the Social Hall. The first day of school is Wednesday, August 18th. May the Lord bless all of us with the grace to "Do Small Things with Great Love!"

I'd also like to extend a blessing to the recent high school graduates of our parish. One of the things missed this past May and June with the more complete opening up was our annual recognition of recent high school graduates. This month is a time for new beginnings for them, whether beginning their studies in college or beginning to work full time. May the Lord bless them likewise with clarity in the path the Lord has for them and with protection for good and right decisions!

How about our October pilgrimage to the Holy Land?! I spoke with the pilgrimage organizer from Bethlehem (based in the Houston area now) this past Friday and he said on the one hand, on a positive note, they had a tour group this past week complete a full pilgrimage with no problems. On the other hand, however, this week on August 10th, the travel status to Israel was changed to Red, Level 4, "Do Not Travel." This is due mostly to the delta variant, which though they have very few cases in Israel, they are extremely restrictive now for prevention. And, another category of warning is at Yellow, Level 2, "Exercise Increased Caution," due to terrorism and civil unrest.

He said that although these warnings seem to change from week to week and though we might end up having the rare opportunity of having easier access to sites that are usually crowded, several parish groups have already shifted their pilgrimages to spring of 2022. I will update everyone after a round of consulting with those who have signed up.

Thank you to all who have participated in the DPSC and who have asked for clarification about directing some of the regular contributions through the DPSC. We will plan to include updates on the progress toward our 2021 DPSC goal in the finances and collection section of the bulletin starting next week.

And, next week, Sunday, August 22nd, I would like to plan another short trek of our Holy Hikers. I would like to follow through with last month's plan to journey on a portion of the Buckeye Trail that passes through Salt Fork State Park. If you would like to participate with this, we have two possibilities for meeting. You could either meet me in the Gomber Avenue parking lot here in Cambridge at 2:30 p.m. for carpooling or to caravan or meet us there at the Group Camping Area parking lot at 3:00 p.m., which is located to the left on Parker Road about ½ mile north of US 22. Parker Road is about ½ mile to the east of the main Salt Fork State Park entrance.

May Our Lord Jesus Christ help us to experience the transforming power of His mercy as He helps us to be always ready for the gift of eternal life in Heaven!
