



We ask the Lord that we truly will be better people from having faced these exceptional times, buoyed as always both by the wonderful people in our community who have faced even more exceptional challenges than these and by knowing that God is always inviting us to a closer relationship. God is with us now, reinforced by so many ways: the Eucharist, Cross, Resurrection, Holy Spirit, Saints & Holy Angels to name just a few!

And, we will have two full months of information regarding the upcoming election at the beginning of November. Our Pro-Life Committee will be meeting this Sunday, August 30th, at 2:30 p.m. in the Marian Room and will review election information resources.

Welcome back to students and staff both here at St. Benedict School and at the various school districts in our parish area. This will definitely be a time for great cooperation. I am truly grateful for Sue Sanders, Principal of our St. Benedict School, and our whole staff who are going the extra mile to provide in-class instructions, beginning on September 1st. This upcoming week will be an important time for <u>learning</u>, not only the content of course subjects but also how we can safely and joyfully restore being a gathered school community.

READINGS FOR THE 23RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME Sunday, September 6, 2020

As disciples of Jesus, we are called to live in harmony with one another. We are called to live in love. Bonded by our love for God and for one another, let us seek the Lord's mercy and ask pardon for our sins.

Our readings focus on the obligation we have to help one another grow in goodness. Sometimes this requires us to point out the errors of a brother or sister in the church.

Ezekiel warns the prophets of his day that they have a serious responsibility in the community. They are to guide the people and show them right from wrong. The prophet will be held accountable.

Jesus picks up this theme and applies it to everyone in the church. It is not only the leaders who are responsible, but we are all responsible for one another. This Gospel focuses on the power and authority of the community which has rarely been recognized. The source of that power is Christ:

"I am there with them."

Ezekiel 33:7-9

If you do not speak out to dissuade the wicked from His way, I will hold you responsible for His death.

How readily do I accept the responsibilty for my brother or sister who is in need?

Romans 13:8-10

Love is the fulfillment of the law.

When fraternal correction is necessary, do I do it with love and understanding?

Matthew 18:15-20

Where two or three are gathered together in my name there am I in the midst of them.

How faithful am I to the obligation of attending Mass (even virtually now)? How well do I participate in the community of prayer?

We begin a shift next Sunday, September 6th, from what has been our "Summer Discipleship

Training" – several Sundays in a row with a focus on **faith** and examples of faith – to what could be called the "Month of Mercy." The shift also goes from dealing with <u>external</u> forces that can influence our faith to relationships <u>within</u> the Church. The next four Sundays have a basic theme – even if not in an obvious way – about what God's mercy is like and how we can become people of mercy with each other.

We see in next Sunday's three readings the interaction of themes of law and fraternal correction together with themes of love and mercy. St. Paul says in Romans 13 – our 2nd Reading – "Love does no evil to the neighbor; hence, love is the fulfillment of the law." And, what is a profound example of loving our neighbor? We can turn to the Gospel to help us with that. The Gospel gives us a blueprint about how to go about loving our neighbor who we know is struggling with sin. "Fraternal correction" can be a way to show our deeper care for our brother or sister.

To appreciate the value of fraternal correction we could remember times when growing up we were warned and, hopefully, prevented from touching a hot stove. And, biblically speaking, the term "law" means not only a cold list of right and wrong but also the <u>personalized</u> <u>instruction</u> in wisdom we can receive from someone we respect.

So, how can we point out that something is morally dangerous for someone else without scaring away that

person from our care for him or her? How can we do this in a culture that is hawkish against anything that smacks of "being judgmental"?

Hopefully, we too have already known the soul-lifting relief of the Lord's mercy to us. Recalling that can help us be grateful for the people the Lord used to help set us on the path away from sin and toward God's ways.

Then, the Gospel gives us Jesus' stepwise blueprint for offering this correction. Jesus tells us to work our way out to a broader and broader circle of people who could reinforce the correction we need to make. We start as personal as possible. If that's effective enough, we rejoice with them about God's mercy. If not, we then try to draw the person back by showing that more and more people see the value of the Lord's ways on a given teaching.

According to Jesus in the Gospel, we can get to a point where one day we could cease offering correction to a particular person. Nevertheless, until we get to that point, the examples of many saints, as well as of Job in the Old Testament (see Job 1:4-5), who interceded fervently for his children, can encourage us to keep trying to offer loving correction. During this past week we celebrated the feast of St. Augustine, whose mother, St. Monica, was a great person of loving persistence in her fraternal correction and in her intercessory prayer for the conversion of her son. May the Lord both help us to be loving and persevering when we have opportunities to show our care for someone through fraternal correction and help us to be open to similar calls for change that we ourselves will need as well!
