READINGS FOR THE 25TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME September 19, 2021

Next Sunday's readings confront our desire to be first, the best, the most important. The way of Jesus is to make ourselves last. St. James asks, "Where do wars and conflicts among you come from?" Let us prepare ourselves to hear God's answer, and to


ask God for the grace to live what

we hear.

The readings focus on the attitude Christians have toward each other. Christians, living by God's wisdom rather than earthly values, treat one another with respect and love.

The reading from James gives us a list of virtues to be found among those who live by wisdom. It also describes life without those virtues—when people are jealous and think only of themselves, it leads only to fights and arguments.

The Gospel passage gives us an example of this among the disciples.



Jesus is quick to correct them. "If you want to be among the most important... you must serve all other people." Our faith in Christ should make a difference in the way we treat others. Jesus presents a little child as a model for this simplicity and humility.

Wisdom 2:12, 17-20

"Let us put the just one to the test." When have you experienced your faith being tested? How did you respond?

James 3:16-4:3

Where do conflicts come from? What do you think are the causes of the upheavals in our world today?

Mark 9:30-37

Jesus speaks of his death while his disciples vie for first place.

How do you respond to people who are self-seekers? Does our world reflect a care for all peoples or are we more interested in being "number one"?

As Jesus continues to provide "discipleship training" both to us and to his disciples in the Gospels of these next two weeks, he invites us to explore a couple of the surprising realities of Christian Gospel living.

This week, at the Masses for the 24th Sunday of Ordinary Time, Year B, Jesus teaches us that, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." How surprising to discover that, "whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it." Isn't that so contrary to the way we live our lives in society today?

Among the philosophies of our day and time that seem to contrast with Jesus' teaching about taking up our cross is the "Self-Interest Theory." That theory posits that it is better to organize a society and its laws by supporting the individual's pursuit of whatever he or she thinks is best for his or her own personal well-being. Unfortunately, with this approach the weakest in a society tend to be left behind. Individual rights of the weak are to be safeguarded, of course, but in the "Self Intent Theory" way of life the focus on the individual neglects in many ways the needs of the community.

For us as Catholic Christians we find that when we put into practice Jesus' teaching about taking up our cross –

when we make others' interests and needs the source of our motivation and decision-making, though it is typically more difficult to live this way – we often find how true Jesus' teaching really is.

Next week's Gospel reinforces this way-of-the-cross lifestyle. If we wish to be considered as great in the Kingdom of God, we need to have a last-of-all and servant -of-all mentality. This challenges even our typical way of thinking about God. We don't often think about God as being humble! We usually think about "fear of God" – which Psalm 110 describes as the first stage of wisdom – as meaning only a cowering in front of a God who does not like us. We can displease God, to be sure. But the fear of the Lord can also be described as the sobering awe our hearts have in the presence of pure goodness.

Furthermore, throughout the Bible, God consistently takes delight in surprising us by how merciful he is. See Psalm 103, Luke 15 (especially verses 7, 10, 20, 24, 31 and 32), and Romans 5:6-12 as examples of this.

May our Lord Jesus bless us with more abundant experiences of His pure goodness. And may we experience the life-giving graces of the Holy Spirit helping us to make others' interests and needs the source of our motivation!

Pastor's Letter

Bishop Monforton has asked that we participate this weekend, September 11th/12th, in a national collection for the people of Haiti, to help with earthquake rebuilding needs. As you know over 2,000 people died and more than 10,000 people were injured in last month's earthquake. On a related note, we have a meeting this week (Tuesday, September 14th, at 6:15 p.m. at one of the Cambridge City Park picnic pavilions) of our committee for developing our relationship with St. Elisabeth Parish in Caracol, Haiti. We will especially be developing plans for the sacred music fundraiser that we are planning for November.

Again, we are <u>not</u> planning to have our Bereavement Haven group this weekend and this month. There are enough delta variant concerns to warrant waiting for October for the next gathering. For those who might have some grieving issues this month, please feel free to contact me so that we can connect you with the support you need.

However, we <u>are</u> continuing to plan on having the Mass of Anointing at the end of September, on Sunday, September 26th at 2:30 p.m. at St. Benedict Church. If you could assist with transportation or are in need of transportation, please contact me or Jacob Padden (both through our parish offices), as we are beginning to coordinate transportation needs.

We will have more information in next week's bulletin, too, about plans for Sunday morning Parish School of Religion, which will be beginning in a couple of weeks as well.

As mentioned last week, the photo sessions for our new picture directory have been moved to November. You will receive information next week about signing up online. We will have an insert with information in next week's bulletin. Two of the photo sessions are during the week before Thanksgiving, which should give some households an opportunity for college students to be home for the sessions as well.

May Our Lord Jesus Christ help us to experience the transforming power of His mercy as He helps us to be always ready for the gift of eternal life in Heaven!


Mass of Anointing

The Vincentians of our parish St. Vincent de Paul Society thank you for

There are a number of folks in our county who although they can financially meet their usual monthly expenses are unable to cover unexpected costs such as car repair, damage from mold, insects, water leaks, heating/cooling and household appliance repair/replacement, gasoline for emergency travel, co-pay for prescriptions, loss of income due to family illness, injury, or death, vandalism and theft, background checks, IDs and birth certificates, license renewals. Local civic agencies seldom have funds to cover such needs.

In addition, there are residents who request help with delinquent utility bills/shut off notices or rent payments or eviction notices for which they simply have no money to pay. These needs can frequently be at least partially paid by other area agencies in which case St. Vincent de Paul funds may supplement the cost to stop shut-offs and evictions.

Our community residents who ask for help also need prayers and guidance to help them get some stability in their lives. In addition we Vincentians who serve on your behalf need your prayers to help us make prudent decisions and to glorify God by our service.
