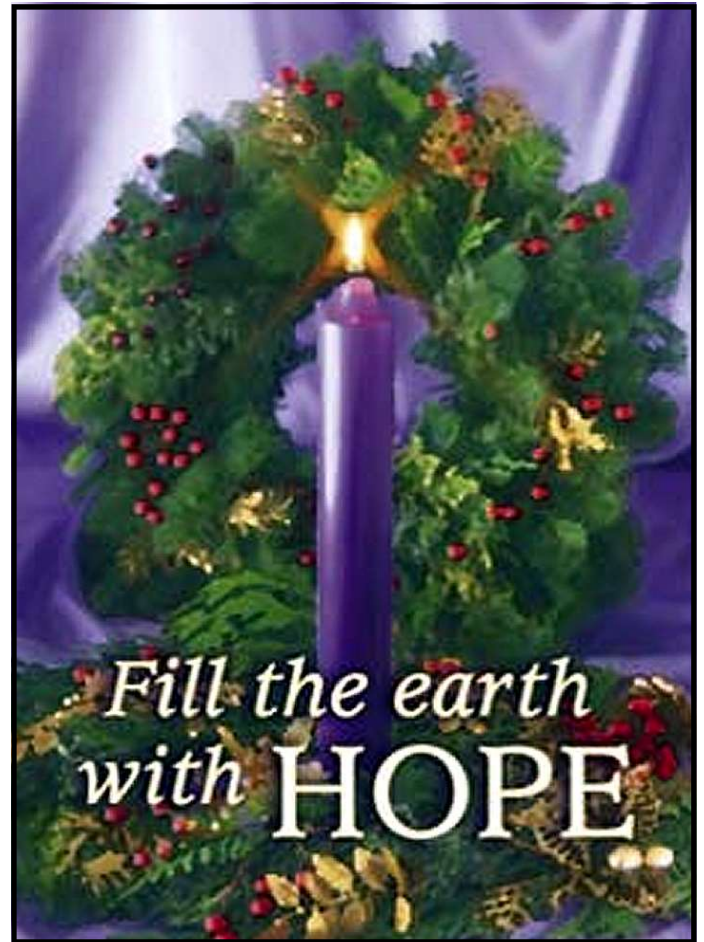

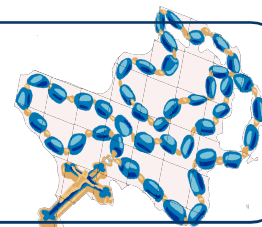

## READINGS FOR THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT December 5, 2021

When the word of God came to John the Baptist, he began to proclaim a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. As we eagerly await the coming of the Lord at the great feast of Christmas, let us repent of our sins as we seek the mercy of our loving God.

The focus is news of salvation to the people who were in exile in Babylon. This salvation was very real for them. It meant, literally, that they were coming home to Jerusalem. Baruch tells us that it is because of God's justice and mercy that the people are saved. Their salvation is expressed by "wearing" justice, peace and the glory of God. In other words, it is these qualities that show we are saved.

In the Gospel reading, John the Baptist calls us to change our lives so our sins will be forgiven. In so doing, we prepare the way for God. God's way is the way of justice, and equality. This justice is symbolized in Isaiah's prophecy

by saying "Every valley will be filled in and every mountain will be made small..." Both readings use beautiful, symbolic language to speak of God's justice.

**God comes with love and justice!  
Prepare the way!**

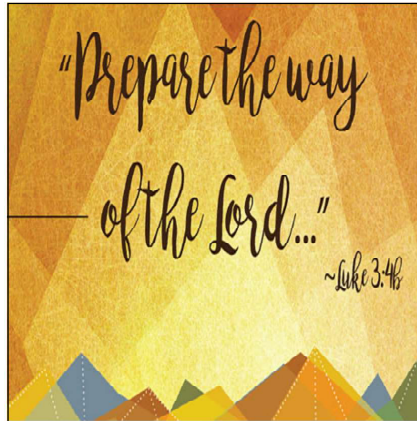

**What is the significance of the desert in the Bible? Let us consider two contrasting meanings.**

In next Sunday's Gospel, the 2nd Sunday of Advent, we meet John the Baptist at the edge of the desert. St. Luke says that, "the word of the Lord came to John, the son of Zechariah, in the desert." Why was he in the desert in the first place? After all, he was the son of Zechariah, a priest. John, like his father, should have been living in relative peace and security in the protective shadow of the Temple in Jerusalem. He should have been preparing to follow in his father's footsteps. The Jewish priesthood was handed on from one generation to the next within the sons of the tribe of Levi, the same tribe as Moses.

Instead, again, to our surprise, John is in the desert.

On the one hand the desert, or most of the wilderness outside of towns and villages in the southern region of Judea, was the most dangerous place for a person to be, especially if they were alone. Out of necessity communities built solid walls around their cities and villages to keep out marauders and night-hunting animals. If a person ventured outside of the walls, perhaps to lead their flocks to hunt

for pasture or to journey from one town to another, they usually did so with other companions who they could trust and who were armed with at least a knife holstered to their hips. And most of the terrain outside of the walls and fortifications of the cities and towns was dry with low-growing shrub trees and was rugged with winding roads and dangerous ambush points amidst rocky hills and valleys. The wilderness was, therefore, on the one hand, a place of death and danger. Most people preferred the safety and peace of life inside city walls.

On the other hand, the wilderness could also actually be the place of ultimate peace and security! When the cities and towns were controlled by foreign invaders or were consumed with sinful and shameful ways of life and philosophies some people would flee to the wilderness to find hiding places in caves and crevasses where it could be much more difficult for them to be found and caught. If they could live from the simple sustenance found in the wilderness – like locusts and honey – and if they could camouflage themselves by wearing the hides of the beasts of the wilderness, they could live with even more peace in the isolation they had established there. The ambush points then served to their advantage and defense.

Why, then, was John the Baptist in the wilderness? The list of leaders given in the verse before John's inspiration should be familiar to us in how corrupt and cowardly they had become in the face of Roman occupation. John the Baptist had fled to the wilderness to find the security of God, both in the Lord's sufficient providence and in the Lord's nourishing and life-giving Word, which is sometimes easier to hear in the silence of the desert than in the noise of the city. Furthermore, wearing the hairy mantle of a prophet's garb, St. John indicated outwardly that he had encountered the word of the Lord interiorly.

John the Baptist was also a highway builder, according to the passage of the prophet Isaiah that St. Luke quoted. When kings and lords visited a town, the people would try to smooth out the road before them so that their carriages and retinue could swiftly and smoothly and safely race from village to village. This meant also securing ambush points even if that meant knocking down the mountain

and filling in the valley. They would try to prepare the way for their lord and they would try to welcome him through their preparation and hospitality.

John was building a highway for God. He was in the Jordan River, at the edge of the desert, announcing that as the Lord came racing into their midst, in his wake he would transform the desert wilderness completely into a place of life. Like one of King David's prayers in Psalm 126, which is prayed as our Responsorial Psalm: "Restore our fortunes, O Lord, like the torrents in the southern desert."

May we turn to the desert solitude of our hearts to hear the Word of the Lord spoken to us this week, to transform the desert into places of peace and security and to transform those villages, towns and cities in our hearts that need a renewal into the way of life and teaching of the Lord!

## Pastor's Letter

On the one hand I want to say "thank you" to all who have participated in the photo sessions for our new picture directory. We are still gathering "submitted photos" and I will let you know the deadline for those photos as soon as I clarify with the directory representative with whom I am meeting tomorrow, Monday, November 29th, for our directory design meeting. I am greatly encouraged by the level of participation, all things considered.

On the other hand, I need to offer a FORMAL APOLOGY. I believe I need to apologize for the experience many parishioners had of exorbitant prices charged for the photograph packages.

I have contacted the Diocese of Steubenville about recourse we could have for filing a formal scam report or any kind of group legal action to recoup some of the, again, exorbitant charges some have discovered on their credit card bills, etc. I understand that studio quality photography is expensive, but the "sticker shock" approach – or the aim high and then drop-down approach – with a surprising amount of pressure employed by at least one of the photographers, was far from what I had expected. We employed this same parish directory company for our 2015/2016 directory and I don't recall having such a pressured experience.

The photographer must have seen how deeply my jaw dropped when he showed me the initial charge for only four photos. Then, when I remained speechless after he offered a less expensive backing for the photos, he finally relented and simply offered four wallet-sized photos on

simple photo paper. I know my mother loves me and will be happy to get one of those photos, but I'm sure she wouldn't have wanted me to spend so much on the picture!

So, I would like to ask anyone who experienced that pressured sales pitch and would like to (or need to) join in the formal complaint and demand for reimbursement to please contact me. We will send out this week's bulletin early by email so if some of you need to contact me even before our meeting with the representative at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, please feel free to do so. Feel free to send a reply by email ([phrezo@diosteub.org](mailto:phrezo@diosteub.org)) or leave a message for me at my parish voicemail box [(740) 432-7609, ext. 201]. I will try to return the message and build a list of how many people had that pressured experience, including, if you can, the original sky-high price and what you ended up being charged.

As mentioned last week, please note that instead of having an Advent Reconciliation Service this year, we are planning to have expanded times for confession, including three Tuesday evenings, December 7th, 14th and 21st from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m. at St. Benedict Church. Please note that when we have the Holy Hour on the 4th Wednesday at Sts. Peter & Paul, from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m., I usually plan to be available for confessions at that time as well. Hopefully we will have a communal reconciliation service in Lent.
