

Respect Life

"Bringing a respect for human dignity to practical politics can be a daunting task. There is such a wide spectrum of issues involving the protection of human life and the promotion of human dignity. Good people frequently disagree on which problems to address, which policies to adopt and how best to apply them. But for citizens and elected officials alike, the basic principle is simple:

We must begin with a commitment never to intentionally kill, or colude in the killing, of any innocent human life, no matter how broken, unformed, disabled or desperate that life my seem.

In other words, the choice of certain ways of acting is always and radically incompatible with the love of God and the dignity of the human person created in His image. Direct abortion is *never* a morally tolerable option." (US Bishops, *Living the Gospel of Life*, 1998, n. 21)

SCRIPTURE READINGS FOR THE THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT December 13, 2020

We rejoice in the Lord who is the joy of our soul! As we gather on this Gaudete Sunday, let us turn to the

Lord to ask pardon for the times we have failed to reflect the joy and hope that flows from the presence of Christ among us.

Good news for the poor! Christ, our Light, is among us!

The first reading focuses on justice. The One sent by God is anointed by the Spirit for mission, and his mission is to the poor, the oppressed and the broken-hearted. He will bring justice to the world and the poor will be exalted — bedecked with the jewels of salvation.

The Gospel reading focuses on Christ the Light. Again we hear from John the Baptist who is the witness to the Light.

John calls us to see the Light who is already in our midst. That Light is Christ, and He is the God who comes to save.

<u>Isaiah 61:1-2, 10-11</u>

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me to bring good news to the poor. How have I heard and responded to God's invitation to care for the poor?

<u>1 Thessalonians 5:16-24</u> Test everything; retain what is good. Refrain from every kind of evil. How do I determine what to refrain from?

John 1:6-8, 19-28 There is one among you whom you do not recognize.

When have I been able to discern the presence of Christ in my life/world?

Santa Claus might get a lion's share of

attention during this time of preparation for Christmas in our North American culture. In many other parts of the Church and world John the Baptist rightly gets more attention.

The parallels and contrasts between the birth, life and death of John the Baptist and those of Jesus can help us to understand and appreciate Jesus more clearly. The more familiar we are with John the Baptist the more we can appreciate the meaning and miracle of Christmas.

When the Archangel Gabriel asked Mary of Nazareth if she would accept the mission and vocation of being the mother of Jesus, the archangel also told her about the miraculous pregnancy of her relative, Elizabeth. That information – that Good News – seems to have helped to confirm her decision to say, "yes," to God's plan.

Here are some reflections by St. Augustine about those parallels and contrasts.

"It is significant that we celebrate the birthdays of John and of Jesus ... John was born of a woman too old for childbirth; Christ was born of a youthful virgin. The news of John's birth was met with incredulity, and his father [Zechariah] was struck mute. Christ's birth was believed, and he was conceived through faith.

"John, then, appears as the boundary between the two testaments, the old and the new. That he is a sort of boundary the Lord himself bears witness, when he speaks of *the law and the prophets up until John the Baptist*. Thus he represents times past <u>and</u> is the herald of the new era to come. As a representative of the past, he is born of aged parents; as a herald of the new era, he is declared to be a prophet while still in his mother's womb. For, when yet unborn, he leapt in his mother's womb at the arrival of blessed Mary. In that womb he had already been designated a prophet, even before he was born; it was revealed that he was to be Christ's precursor before they ever saw one another.

"Zechariah is silent and loses his voice until John ... is born and restores his voice. The silence of Zechariah is nothing but the age of prophecy lying hidden, obscured, as it were, and concealed before the preaching of Christ. At John's arrival Zechariah's voice is released. The release of Zechariah's voice at the birth of John is a parallel to the rending of the veil [of the temple in Jerusalem] at Christ's crucifixion. If John were announcing his own coming, Zechariah's lips would not have been opened. The tongue is loosened because a voice is born. For when John was preaching the Lord's coming, he was asked: Who are vou? And he replied: I am the voice of one crving in the wilderness. The voice is John, but the Lord in the beginning was the Word. John was a voice that lasted only for a time; Christ, the Word in the beginning, is eternal."

John the Baptist as an adult expressed a humility that is also a message for all of us. Even though he had become very popular and crowds of people were listening to John



the Baptist's words and actually doing what he had told them, he said, "He [Jesus] must increase and I must decrease." It does take humility for us to celebrate Christmas well. We so often are self-conscious about how well or how "loudly" <u>we</u> are celebrating Christmas. We ask the Lord to help us to be like John the Baptist and keep putting the focus on Jesus. Even before he was born, John the Baptist leapt for joy in the womb of his mother, Elizabeth, when Jesus was present to him in the womb of Mary. Even before that first Christmas John the Baptist was helping us to see that Jesus' presence among us, even in the womb of Mary, begins a new era of human history. May we grow in appreciating how John the Baptist prepared the way for Jesus.

Pastor's Letter

Not surprisingly we have a number of things different this year. Among them is that we are not able to have our usual Advent Penance Service, with several visiting priests available for the event. So, in its place Fr. Bob and I are offering 3 ways to participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation in preparation for Christmas.

First of all, we are <u>expanding</u> the usual times that we have Confessions. We will plan to be available in the confessional from 3:30 p.m. on Saturdays at St. Benedict and 11:30 a.m. on Sundays at Sts. Peter & Paul in Lore City. We will do so for these next three weekends before Christmas.

Secondly, I will be available for Confessions on Tuesday evenings, December 15th and December 22nd, at St. Benedict from 6:30 p.m. – 8:00 p.m.

Finally, please note that we can be available by appointment at a time that would be more convenient for you. Simply call our parish office and we can plan for a time to meet by appointment. Sometimes that arrangement works best, too, because there wouldn't necessarily be other people in line afterwards and so the confession could go at a less time-conscious pace.

We have had an encouraging number of additional people asking about RCIA and joining the Church. We also usually begin the process each year in October. Because of the several additional people recently asking about joining in later, we will likely be starting a second group of "inquirers". If you know of someone who has expressed interest to you about either learning more about the Catholic faith or about joining the Church, please let me know and we could see about including them in this second group.

Finally, over the past several years we have offered a variety of approaches to adult faith formation for those who have been Catholic for years but are looking to continue deepening their faith. Something that has been developing recently is something in which my own parents have participated for over 30 years. In their parish in Steubenville almost all of the parishioners are part of a "men's group" or a "women's group." These are faith sharing groups of about 5-8 members who meet either weekly or sometimes every other week. They have been "walking with" each other in their experience as disciples of the Lord, sharing with each other about their prayer life, about applications to various situations in life and sometimes "praying over" or praying with each other during those faith sharing gatherings.

Here at Christ Our Light, three groups like this – going by the name of "Discipleship Quads" – have developed. Two are groups of 4-6 women and the other is a group of 5 men. We are looking at eventually expanding by establishing some additional new groups. Please let me know if this sounds like something in which you might like to participate.

May the Lord continue to bless us with joy and peace as disciples of Jesus and to help us to be always ready for the gift of eternal life in Heaven!
