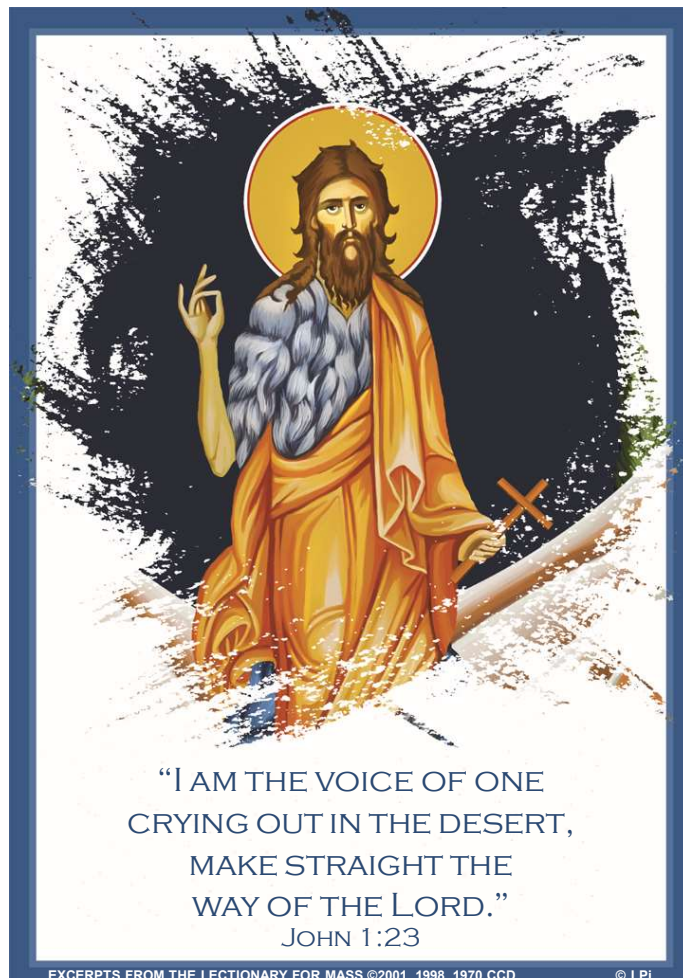

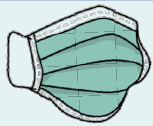

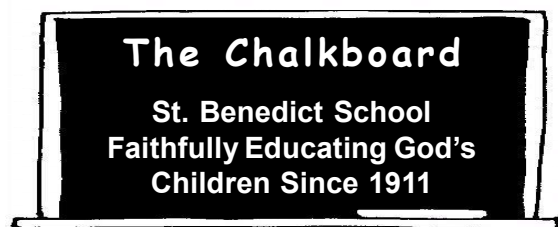

This year the Auction will be held in an online format. We are contracting with a professional online auction agency and the Auction will be held for one week, Saturday, February 27, through March 6, 2021. This format will not only be the safest option for everyone involved, but also has the potential to reach more prospective buyers.

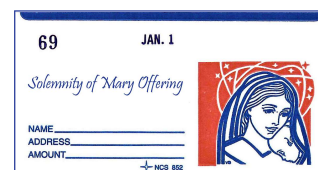

SCRIPTURE READINGS FOR THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

December 20, 2020

Our readings are filled with images of the Lord's enduring love for us, and this love is brought to fulfillment in the angel's greeting to the Blessed Virgin Mary. As we prepare to enter into these sacred mysteries of salvation, let us ask the Lord for the grace to be open to the mystery of the incarnation and for the grace to say yes to the Lord.

God's love is faithful. Mary will give birth to a son. Holy is his name.

The first reading focuses on the promise made to David — a member of his family would be a great king whose kingdom would last forever. This reading is filled with the fidelity of God. "I called you... I have always been with you... I promise to be with you forever... He will be like a son to me... I will never take my love away from him."

The promise is fulfilled in the Annunciation. By the power of the Spirit, Mary

will give birth to a child and "he will be the ruler of the family of David."

In both of these readings we see the power of God at work in human beings — God's faithful love made real in history.



2 Samuel 7:1-5, 8-12, 14, 16

I will be a father to him and he shall be a son to me.

How have you shown your love for your son/your father?

Romans 16:25-27

The revelation of the mystery kept secret is now manifested.

What do you know of the prophetic messages of the Old Testament?

Luke 1:26-38

You will conceive in your womb and bear a son and you shall name him Jesus.

What difference does Mary's "yes" to the Angel make in your life?

Where does God like to be? Does God, the Creator of Heaven and Earth, have a favorite dwelling place? Both our 1st Reading and our Gospel for next week, for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, address these questions.

In the time of King David, ~1000 B.C., the Israelites still had the Ark of the Covenant that God had asked Moses to construct about 250 years earlier. It was the chief focal point for the presence of God on Earth. The Israelites would sometimes bring the Ark to a battle site to be more open to the victorious action of God in their midst. It is described in Exodus chapter 37 to have been about half the size of our current altars, made of wood but lined with gold. There were poles for carrying the Ark by twelve priestly assistants, one for each of the twelve tribes of Israel, six on each side.

The Ark was maintained within a tent, specially designated for it. But King David was inspired to provide a more dignified place for the Ark than a tent. The prophet, Nathan, responded with a word from the Lord, to tell David that it would be his son who would build that dignified place — a temple for Him and for the Ark — which did happen under his son, Solomon.

In the Gospel, we see God turning the tables. There, God is the one who indicates where he would like to dwell. In a

special way, the fulfillment of God's enduring dwelling place was to be through Mary, becoming a new and living Ark of the Covenant. Mary is ultimately identified as the New Testament Ark in Revelation 11:19 (the last verse of Revelation 11) — 12:2.

How can we appreciate Mary as the Ark of the Covenant? According to Hebrews 9:4, the Ark of the Covenant contained the Ten Commandments, some manna and Aaron's staff. Mary carried Jesus in her womb, the living Word of God and the One to whom the manna referred.

A key shift takes place in Mary: from dwelling in either a tent or in one temple, God shows that He prefers to visit and to dwell in a person and in many buildings.

That's where we become part of the picture. God does want us to be living tabernacles, too, open both to God's presence and to our responsiveness by living our lives in ways that give God glory. St. Therese the Little Flower once wrote that she felt drawn to genuflect as people who had just received Holy Communion passed by her. She perceived them as being living tabernacles.

May the Lord indeed continue to form our daily lives that we give witness to both, the presence of the Lord and the action of the Lord, as His living tabernacles.

Pastor's Letter

our fears are great.*

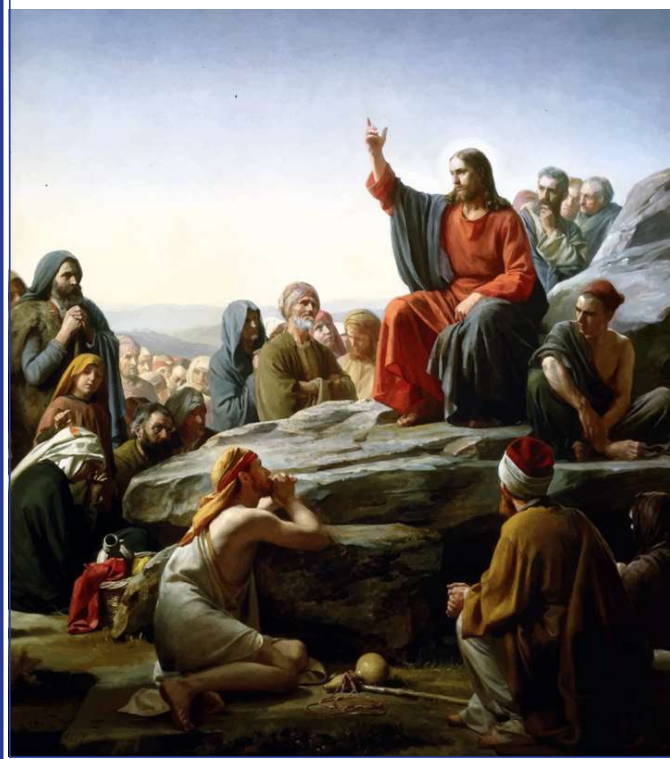

THE SYMBOLISM OF OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE'S IMAGE

The symbolism of Our Lady of Guadalupe's image was meant to teach the Aztec people her importance: she came from heaven but was not a god. The symbolism spoke to their culture and taught them Christian truths.

| Face & Hair | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• complexion was that of a mestizo, a combination of Mexican & Spanish ancestry• eyes cast downwards to indicate humility; gaze is motherly tenderness• loose hair shows that she is a virgin |
| Clothing | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• rose-tinted tunic with four-petal flowers symbolize earth and four seasons• rose color portrays the dawn, which indicates a new era• mantle is bluish-turquoise with stars, the color of royalty and the heavens• black ribbon around her belly shows that she is pregnant |
| Hands | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• folded in prayer shows that she is praying to a god |
| Medallion | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• engraved with a cross & worn around her neck shows her consecration to Jesus Christ |
| Sun | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• sun rays behind her show that she is greater than the Aztec sun god |
| Moon | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• she stands upon the moon showing that she is greater than the moon & the night |
| Angel | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Aztecs believed angels took sacrifices to their gods. Her image shows that she is the perfection of all sacrifices. She is lifted on shoulders of the angel with eagle wings (popular in Aztec iconography), which points to her place as royalty in heaven |



When compared to Scripture she is seen as the woman from the book of Revelation.

"And a great portent appeared in heaven, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars; she was with child and she cried out in her pangs of birth, in anguish for delivery." (Revelation 12:1-2)

"But the woman was given the two wings of the great eagle that she might fly from the serpent into the wilderness." (Revelation 12:14)
