## **Respect Life**



Most Americans would recognize the contradiction in the statement, "While I am personally opposed to slavery or racism or sexism I cannot force my personal view on the rest of society." Real pluralism depends on people of conviction struggling vigorously to advance their beliefs by every ethical and legal means at their disposal."

# SCRIPTURE READINGS FOR THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD January 3, 2021

In our search for the Lord we need go no further than to behold the faces of our family, neighbors, and friends, for the presence of Christ dwells within the hearts of all God's faithful. As we prepare to celebrate these sacred mysteries, let us turn to the Lord for mercy and pardon for the times we have not paid homage to the presence of Christ in the world.

The birth of Christ is the manifestation (epiphany) of God in the world. In Christ, salvation has come for everyone, Jew and Gentile alike.

The reading from **Isaiah** tells us that the light has come, a light for all to walk in. In the light, the glory of God shines forth. This light is the epiphany of God. The Gospel tells us that this light shone in the east and brought visitors from afar to see this manifestation of God's love. Christ is the One to whom all people will come, bringing gifts fit for a king. He is the "newborn King of the Jews" and, indeed, of all the earth. He reveals the limitlessness of God's love for all.

#### Isaiah 60:1-6

Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem!

How have I experienced the presence of God in my life?

#### **Ephesians 3:2-3, 5-6**

The Gentiles are co-heirs, members of the same body.

Who in my life has become most difficult to see as Christlike?

### **Matthew 2:1-12**

They found the child with Mary his mother... and did him homage.

Do I truly do "homage" to the Lord? How faithful am I to the Lord?



## A key theme that unfolds throughout the

**Bible is** that God established successive covenants with His special people in the Old Testament leading up to the covenant He made with and for us all through His Son, Jesus.

Those covenants, those "testaments," that God established were with successively larger groups of people, from Adam and Eve through King David. God promised Eve that one of her offspring would defeat the evil one. This promise — a covenant — was established between God and a couple. Other covenants are made with Noah, leader of a family, using the sign of the rainbow, with Abraham, the leader of a tribe, with Moses as leader of a nation, and with King David, who was the leader of a kingdom, which is a collection of nations under one king.

The final covenant God made with us – the New Testament – was made between God the Father and Jesus. Jesus represents the Church that God established as a <u>universal</u> kingdom. In Jesus, then, the Father established a <u>universal</u> covenant. The worldwide and even universal scope of the Church is at the heart of what is celebrated on the Epiphany. The visit and adoration of the Magi is to show that Jesus is the Messiah for the whole world – and even for the whole universe!

The adoration of the Magi has significance on several other levels as well. When St. Matthew says that, "They prostrated themselves and did him homage," it indicates that they were, on one level, acknowledging Jesus as a king. Then, that they gave him a gift of incense indicates that they recognized him as having divine quality. Some astronomers report surprising movements of the planet Jupiter – one possibility being like this past week's "Christmas Star" – about the time of Jesus' birth. That could have spoken a message to the Magi. The planet Jupiter was commonly associated with the <u>universal</u> god, Zeus. Evidently a common religious view at that time was that each nation had its own god. So, with the Magi offering Jesus both homage and incense could indicate that they were surrendering worship of their own gods to worship Jesus instead. The Magi could have been acknowledging the universal quality both of Jesus' reign as king <u>and</u> of his <u>divinity</u>.

The Magi also offered Jesus the gift of myrrh, which was used as a burial spice. This could be seen as a prophetic gift foreshadowing Jesus' death. Putting the three gifts together, furthermore, could be seen as foreshadowing of Jesus' kingly and priestly <u>power over death</u> as well!

May we benefit from the covenant – the secure promise – that Jesus established with the Father for us. May we benefit from his invitation to us to be gathered under the protection of his universal reign, which is both kingly and priestly. May we, like the Magi, acknowledge Jesus as our king, as our God and as the One who can – and who <u>wants</u> to – save us from sin and death.

## **Pastor's Letter**

Praise God that we will be celebrating a new year together this week!

There is so much to recall from this past year that can be valuable for us to put in the perspective both of hindsight and of looking forward into a new year. May the Lord bless your reflection on the past and help you to look into the future with the hope that God wants us to have from being alive in Jesus through baptism.

In many ways we were spared until the very last couple of months of this year here in Guernsey County what people in other parts of the world had dealt with earlier.

In fact, for me it wasn't until just this past week that I had to be tested for the coronavirus. Thankfully the first part of the test – the rapid antigen test – was negative. That's the one where the probe takes a sample from deep in the nose! I had never realized how long the nasal cavity is! As of Wednesday, December 23rd, when this letter was written, I have not received the results of the second test, the one that is less invasive. Lord willing, that second one will have the same result as the antigen test.

While being tested for the coronavirus, the nurses and physician noted that some of the "symptoms" I reported were from having high blood pressure and an elevated heart rate. Yikes! If nothing else, that was a fortunate discovery from the need for a coronavirus test. That means the new year's resolutions of losing weight and adjusting exercise and eating habits that I've been making in a relatively half-hearted way these past few years is necessary now.

As I mentioned a few years ago in a letter like this, thank you for many holiday treats as gifts, but please don't be offended if I don't consume as many of them into the future. I have been prescribed a blood pressure medication, which is something I never thought I would ever need. As a skinny runner throughout high school, college and adult years, I never imagined weighing more than 200 pounds as I do today. And blood pressure medicine: my blood pressure has usually been low if anything. Anyway, the one positive side of this is that I literally get to take a "chill pill"! Many of us have benefitted from good coaches in life and this prescription to lose weight, etc., is like that.

This new year begins with plenty of things crossing over from this past year, including how this year's St. Benedict School Auction will be conducted. Please see the information in another part of this bulletin about how it will be conducted as a weeklong online auction. As different as it will be for many people, it looks like the auctioneer conducting it will make the items available to thousands of his regular customers, which will hopefully be a substantial boost and enable the auction to be a necessary success.

May the Lord continue to bless us with joy and peace *and His Christmas light* into the New Year as disciples of Jesus and to help us to be always ready for the gift of eternal life in Heaven!
