Summary of the Bishop’s Mass Directives

1. 6-foot social distancing between persons not living in the same household must be maintained at all times. Maximum church capacity is limited to 25%.
2. All parishioners must wear masks. Disposable gloves are optional.
3. Upon entering the church, please sanitize your hands.
4. No congregational singing at this time. The extension of a Sign of Peace is also omitted.
5. Communion will be distributed in the hand only. Gloves, if worn, must be removed.

General Mass Dispensation Rescinded

The general dispensation which excused all the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation is revoked effective the weekend of September 26 & 27.

Even though the general dispensation has been lifted, it does not necessarily mean you have to attend Mass or incur serious sin. Some of those who would still be automatically dispensed from Mass would be anyone:

- 1) who has tested positive for COVID-19, or come in contact with someone who has tested positive in the past 14 days.
- 2) has a cough or who has COVID-19/flu-like symptoms.
- 3) who is in the “at risk” category due to: age 60 or older – compromised immune system – diabetes – serious heart conditions – or if you believe attending Mass would pose an undue risk to other family members such as elderly parents you are caring for is dispensed.
- 4) who tried to attend Mass but was turned away due to lack of room because of the limitation placed due to social distancing would be dispensed even if they could attend another Mass without extreme difficulty.
