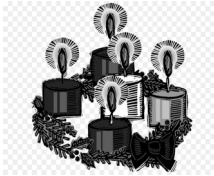

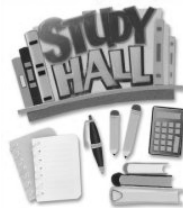

Humans of Newman

Sr. Maura Cho, SOLPH * Sr. MariJulianna Cho, SOLPH



We belong to the Sisters of Our Lady of Perpetual Help (SOLPH) founded in 1932 in Korea. Our Sisters have been engaged in parish ministry, teaching in schools, undertaking social welfare work throughout the country and overseas

missionaries. Since 1972, our Sisters started the Bible Apostolate called 'Catholic Bible Life Movement' (CBLM) in Korea. We began with the university students and later expanded to various groups of adults in their parishes.

In 1988, CBLM started in the East and West Coast in the U.S.A. Since that time on, we have a small bible center in Buena Park Orange County in Southern California. We, SOLPH Sisters, came to the Bay Area in 2012 and served Bible groups among the Korean Catholic Faithful. In August 2018, the Lord provided a small place in Berkeley for us. Now, we are happy to become members of Newman and strive to continue serving more Bible groups in Berkeley. Sr. Maura is in charge of CBLM in the Bay Area among Korean Catholics and Sr. MariJulianna is a student at Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley.

There are reading guides and reference books designed for the participants of the small Bible groups. CBLM group meets once a week and the participants to prepare each lesson of the reading guide before the weekly meetings. It takes five to six months for the participants to complete each stage of the book of the Bible. The method is to study and meditate on the given text of the Bible individually and share both intellectual and emotional treasures among the participants in each small group. One of our charisms is joy and gratitude, which are the most prominent gifts through the Word of God in the small group Bible sharing. In the United States, we have English and Korean speaking groups.

The main goal of CBLM is to train small bible group facilitators called '**Servants of the Word.**' The role of the Servant of the Word is like the role of a small piece of wood used to inflame the larger pieces of firewood "so that the power of Christ may dwell in [us]" (2 Cor 12:9). They are trained throughout their bible group sessions and the **Bible seminar and retreat** we call **Bible YOUNSU**, after the completion of each book of the Bible. Through the Bible YOUNSU the Servants of the Word are trained as the Bible group facilitators.

From the beginning till now, wondrous miracles are taking place, in our Bible apostolate, by the virtue of vigorous efforts of the Servants of the Word. Wherever the Servants of Word went, the bible groups became active by the power of the living Word in the Holy Scriptures! CBLM has spread to several countries of Asia, Europe and America. Wherever the Servants of the Word reside, CBLM has spread to form small bible groups throughout the countries and cities.
