

From the Pastor's Desk

The Readings for next Sunday, March 22, 2015 The Fifth Sunday of Lent

> Jeremiah 31:31-34 Hebrews 5:7-9 John 12:20-33



My dear parishioners,

I have been profoundly moved this week while reflecting on the spirituality of Mother Teresa that is found in the book 33 Days to Morning Glory. I thank God greatly that He guided us to choose this book as a central part of our Lenten observance. It is all so simple yet goes so very much to the core of all we are searching for. As Mother puts it, "Jesus is thirsting for us."

The following is from Mother Teresa's letter to her sisters that she wrote on March 25, 1993.

"Every day if you listen with your heart, you will hear Jesus say, "I thirst." What does it mean? Something so hard to explain in words. "I thirst" is something much deeper than Jesus just saying, "I love you." Until you know deep inside that Jesus thirsts for <u>you</u> you can't begin to know who He wants to be for you. Or who He wants you to be for Him.

Our Lady was the first person to hear Jesus' cry "I thirst." Because Our Lady was there on Calvary she knows how real, how deep is His longing for you. Ask her to teach for her role is to bring you face to face with the love in the heart of the Crucified Jesus."

It will be at the Eucharist on March 25, the Feast of the Annunciation, that those of us who have been preparing with Fr. Gaitley's book will be making the Marian Consecration.

From the days of Mother Mary's *yes* in Nazareth her deepest desire is to bring Christ to us. At Lourdes, Fatima and Guadalupe she continues with true maternal affection to guide us toward heaven.

While Mother Teresa is so well known for her care of the poor in very difficult circumstances, we may feel that we cannot imitate her in that way. However as we follow the Lenten practice of almsgiving we can truly touch the lives of the needy. We have made a good start on Partners in Charity, but we will need the sacrificial cooperation from everybody to achieve our parish goal.

Two weeks from today the Liturgy brings us to Jerusalem and Jesus' triumphal entry on Palm Sunday. Please note the new brochures at the entrances regarding our parish pilgrimage to the Holy Land in October. A chance to truly walk in the footsteps of Jesus.
