<u>Paul's Epistle</u>: This weekend we say good-bye to Deacon Barry Reuwsaat, as his summer assignment is coming to an end. I am not sure about you but I feel like we just said hello to him last week. I want to thank you for your warm hospitality and eagerness to get to know him over the summer. Barry has expressed how hard it will be to leave Watertown as he has found such joy in serving the Lord through his summer experience. We will continue to keep Deacon Barry and all men discerning God's call to the priesthood and/or religious life.

These past few weeks have brought home again the reality that we know not the day nor the hour when we will meet our Maker. Death is part of life, but it was not in God's original plan for us. It was a consequence of the Fall of Adam and Eve. In our Gospel this weekend Jesus speaks of working for food that will last for eternal life. A good question we should all ask ourselves is if what I am doing is God's will for my life and for His greater glory. I recall Curtis Martin, the founder of Fellow-ship Of Catholic University Students (FOCUS), talking about a conversation he had with Bishop Carlson before he started this ministry. Bishop Carlson listened to his plan for evangelizing college students and all that could be done to help them grow in holiness while in college. When he was done sharing his plan, Bishop Carlson simply reminded Curtis that his first priority was to get his family to heaven and that if FOCUS would prevent him from doing this, then he should not start FO-CUS. He had to make sure that he had his priorities in order for his primary vocation as husband and father.

We are busy in our world with many things, but are they the things that will last for eternity? This is a crucial question that has eternal consequences. The Eucharist is that true bread come down from heaven, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. It is why the altar and tabernacle are in the center of our church; it should be the center of our lives. When we take time to be present to the Lord in our daily lives we will find that deep hunger satiated and our lives more peaceful, even in the midst of the chaos around us.

Change can be difficult and yet it is part of life. Every day we change as we get older and every day the world moves forward and things change. There is comfort in familiarity and peace in steadfastness and thus our Church keeps that balance between change and Tradition. The bulletin is a fascinating aspect of the parish life as it strives to convey the important information without having a standard format. I always enjoy seeing bulletins from your travels and in fact picked up a couple on my vacation as well. We are looking at different ways of formatting the bulletin and conveying the information you need. I am sure for some this will be a source of tension as the information you are used to finding is not where it once was and we have by no means settled on any one format as of yet, but we will be working on finding a balance with the bulletin in the weeks to come.
