Paul's Epistle: Just the other day I was talking with a friend about our current culture and we both asked the question; "When will we as Christians hit our tipping point?" At what point do we take a stand and say, "ENOUGH!" Enough with the culture of death that has more action taken in regards to a lion killed than to baby parts sold. To a culture that will silence the videos of people talking about their willingness to negotiate a change in procedure so that the babies they kill will have organs to sell? I am both saddened and angered listening to pundits and politicians talking about how this is all taken out of context and it shouldn't overshadow the good that Planned Parenthood is doing in many other areas. The Church continues to teach that evil cannot be permitted no matter how good we think the outcome will be.
