



# OPLATEK OR "CHRISTMAS WAFER"

The Christmas wafer is a Central European Christian Christmas tradition celebrated in Polish, Slovak, Lithuanian and Italian families during Wigilia (Christmas Eve Vigil). The unleavened wafers are baked from pure wheat flour and water, are usually rectangular in shape and very thin; they are identical in composition to the Host used during a Catholic mass however, they are not consecrated. Wafers are embossed with Christmas related religious images, varying from the nativity scene, especially Virgin Mary with baby Jesus, to the Star of Bethlehem. Family members and friends break off a small piece of the *oplatek* wafer and give it to one another along with a blessing. Breaking off and exchanging part of *oplatek* with someone is symbol of forgiveness between two people and is meant to remind participants of the importance of Christmas, God, and family. The tradition of sharing the wafer is one of the rich variety of traditions that Poles still celebrate during Christmas Eve Supper, which is the most elegant and pompous evening in the whole year. Why not start a new tradition this year. Oplateks are available in the Parish Office and will be available after all the Masses this weekend and on December A Free Will donation is not required, but would be appreciated!

## GOSPEL MEDITATION

# **ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE**

What does it mean to be worthy? There are a few different ways to approach this question. Today's Gospel highlights two: the way of the Pharisees and the way of John the Baptist. Our faith values good works and discipleship. Perhaps, then, we "earn" our worth by adhering to the right doctrines and following the right pious practice. The Pharisees thought they were worthy. Due to their religious pedigree and proper procedures, they were self-satisfied. John the Baptist's words to them are strong. "Do not resume to say to vourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.'" Of course, Jesus (and John) don't omit the responsibility for moral behavior. John gives the Pharisees quite a strong warning in that regard. "Produce good fruit as evidence of your repentance ... every tree that does not bear good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire."

It's a question of attitude. Of disposition. It's a matter of the heart. If anyone would be worthy in this scenario, it's John the Baptist. Jesus himself will name him the greatest of prophets and a great man. John, however, recognizes his own lowly place in the grand scheme of things. "The one who is coming after me is mightier than I. I am not worthy to carry his sandals." The Pharisees take pride in being "better" than others. John embraces humility in Christ being "better" than him. We don't self-generate our own worthiness. We receive it as a gift from God.

In a few short weeks, we'll celebrate the birth of Christ. Bishop Ven. Fulton Sheen wrote about the Nativity in his "Life of Christ": "Because [Jesus] was born in a cave, all who wish to see Him must stoop. To stoop is the mark of humility. The proud refuse to stoop and, therefore, they miss divinity." God invites us to prepare our hearts this Advent. When you consider your own life, where are you looking for your worth? This Christmas, are you prepared to stoop?



# Meeting Chow for December 17 Meeting is a Pot Luck; Bring a Dish to go With Council Provided

Meeting Chow for the December 17 Membership Meeting will have a new wrinkle. It will be a pot luck affair with the Council providing the meat entre --- baked ham. Members are asked to bring a dish for eight to pass. Hospitality Chair Ken May said the dish can fall into one of four categories: starch such as potato or rice, vegetable, green or DINNER fruit salad and dessert.



"Please let me or Program Director Tom McPhail know what you are bringing so we can have a great dinner and aren't eating just ham and pie." May said. He said that a hot dish should be brought as close to 6:20 PM as possible so it can be ready to serve at 6:30 PM, the usual dinner time. "If you need to warm something up, please allow enough time to warm it and make sure dish is in an oven-proof container, "he said. "I plan on arriving around 5:30 PM to get the oven up to temperature, if needed."

This is the first time a pot luck has been tried by the meeting chow program which May has headed since it began in mid-2018. "It is important to clear the dish you are going to pass with either Tom or me since we need to have a balance", he said. May can be contacted at 248-763-4589. The RSVP program is an effort by the Supreme Council to generate support for vocations. The State Council is building a \$1.25 million endowment fund for Sacred Heart Seminary.
