





Have You Reported the Dish You'll Bring to Tuesday's Meeting Chow Pot Luck?

If you plan to enjoy the chow before Tuesday's Membership Meeting and haven't reported on the dish for eight that you are bringing, you should pick up your phone now and call either Hospitality Chair Ken May or Program Director Tom McPhail. Tuesday's meeting chow for the first time will be a pot luck with the Council providing a baked ham as the main dinner item. "Please let me or Tom know what you plan on bringing so we can try and keep this organized so that we have a great dinner and aren't eating just ham and pie," May said. He can be reached at 248-763-4589. McPhail can be reached at 248-875-1185.

A member's dish should be one of four categories; starch such as potato or rice, vegetable, green or fruit salad and desert. A hot dish should be brought hot as close to 6:20 PM as possible. "If you need to warm something up, please allow enough time to warm

it and make sure the dish is in an oven-proof container," May said. The plan is to serve food at the usual 6:30 PM

time with the business meeting opening as close to the regular 7 PM starting time.

The major item on Tuesday's agenda will be a request for the membership to endorse a decision by the Officers to again have the Council provide a \$500 grant to a seminarian enrolled in the Archdiocese of Detroit's Sacred Heart Seminary. The Council's net cost is \$400 since the Supreme Council, which established the RSVP program, will pay a \$100 rebate. The seminarian assigned to us by the Archdiocesan Vocations Office is John Wachtel, a second year college student and a native of White Lake, Michigan. John talks about his call to the priesthood in a video (http://vimeo.com/369651335) provided by the Archdiocese.

You should have received your 2020 dues statement by now, either via an email from Financial Secretary Bob Kuhr or through the U.S. Mail. Included in that statement is a request for two optional donations. One is the "\$10 for Charity" fund which finances the State Council's year-round giving to about 60 entities. The other is a request for a gift of \$6 for the State Council's effort to build a \$1 million tuition endowment fund for Sacred Heart Seminary. Began in April of last year, the fund has reached \$200.000. As always, if the Council dues impose an extra burden on a member having economic difficulties that member should privately contact Brother Kuhr or GK Dave Bednarski.
