Dear Friends in Christ,

Praised be Jesus Christ! There were three tasks that I had to complete in the summer semester in my Canon Law program: finish writing the thesis for my degree, take one class, and sit for comprehensive examinations (the Canon Law equivalent of the bar exam). I have now finished one of those tasks.

Last week, I was able to deposit my thesis to the university. What a wonderful feeling to have that off my shoulders. It was hours and hours of work. Isn't it funny how after we do some large project like that we think to ourselves "Well, that wasn't so bad."—yet in the midst of it, it seemed like an endless road to travel. The human condition is strange that way!

As you are reading this, I will only have one week of my class left. The class is on the Canon Law of the Eastern Catholic Churches. You might not realize that there are in fact 24 Catholic Churches in the world: we belong to the largest, the Latin Catholic Church but there are 23 other Catholic Churches as well, the largest being the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church. Some of the priests in our diocese from India belong to one of these Eastern Churches, namely the Syro-Malabar Catholic Church which has over 4.5 million members. In any case, these 23 Catholic Churches have a different code of Canon Law than the Latin Church so there is a special class on it.

Some of you might be wondering more about me. Here's some trivia: I enjoy cooking, although more for a group than for one! I also enjoy reading. Two of my favorite authors are Matthew Reilly and Morris West. Even though I was born and raised in Wisconsin, I'm not much of a football fan. I do love soccer though, both domestic (MLS) and international. My favorite domestic soccer team is DC United—and that was true even before I lived in Washington, DC! Finally, I'm a coin collector (a numismatist). My grandfather was also a coin collector and gave me first coin to collect—a Peace silver dollar—and I was hooked ever since.

I appreciate your prayers for me as I finish up my studies in Washington, DC. Know that I am praying for you all as well. In today's Gospel reading, our Lord tells Martha that she is anxious and worried about many things. How often we find ourselves in the same state, I know I do. May we heed the words of Jesus: "There is need of only one thing." What is that one thing? God Himself, and to serve and love Him with all our heart, with all our soul, and with all our mind!


