Dear Friends in Christ,



Praised be Jesus Christ! Last time I wrote to you, I mentioned that one third of my summer academic endeavors were over, namely, that my thesis had been deposited. Now, this weekend, two thirds have been completed. I finished my class on Eastern Law this week and took the final exam. Now all that remains is the comprehensive examination.

The comprehensive examination is the canon law equivalent of the bar exam for civil lawyers, although it is an oral exam and not written—and is significantly shorter. Three professors of canon law, all doctors in canon law, will examine me on everything found in the Church's Code of Canon Law. There are 1752 canons in the code, many with multiple paragraphs, and anything in them is 'fair game' for the examination. The one blessing is that the exam is only one hour long so they can't go through everything in great detail! Your prayers are certainly appreciated as I prepare for this final endeavor.

As I continue to tell you all a bit about myself, I thought I would mention my assignments as a seminarian for the Diocese of La Crosse. During the summer of 2010, I was assigned abroad to the Parish of Our Lady and St. George in Walthamstow, London, England in the Diocese of Brentwood where I served the parish and its schools, and served as an assistant chaplain to Whipps Cross University Hospital, which houses one of the largest and busiest emergency departments in the United Kingdom. During the academic years of 2011–2013, I was assigned in Rome to the parish of St. Susanna where I taught confirmation for two years and served as a deacon in 2012–2013. During the summers of 2011 & 2012, I was assigned to SS. Peter and Paul Parish in Independence, Wisconsin as well as St. John the Apostle Parish in Whitehall, Wisconsin. I look back on all of these assignments with great joy—and some difficulty, no doubt—but they helped me not only to discern my call to the priesthood but also to learn effective pastoral ministry.

It's been terribly hot here in Washington, DC with heat indices above 110°F this past week but no bad storms. I know that many people in Central Wisconsin were hit hard by bad storms this past week, including many parishioners who had wind damage, downed trees, and flooding. Thanks be to God our parishes were relatively unaffected. Not only should we remember those affected in our prayers but, if we can, to lend a helping hand to neighbors and friends who might need assistance in the cleanup. May God protect all of us in this unpredictable summer weather.
