Adult Education Notes

- Today we talk leprosy. First reading tells the seriousness of the disease. Those with leprosy could not be near another person much less touch them. It was thought to be a punishment from God for serious wrongdoing serious sin against Him.
- The Responsorial Psalm it talks of confessing to the Lord to take away the "guilt of my sin". Make me clean as I turn to you in my trouble.
- The Heavy In the Gospel, we hear of the leper who asked to be made clean. When Jesus stretched out his hand and touched him, it was probably the first time he had EVER been touched! That contact was just as compassionate as Jesus curing him. Sickness and suffering can be powerful occasions to experience goodness and tenderness from another. The leper may not have approached Jesus at all if he hadn't had the leprosy. He saw Jesus's compassion and was drawn to Him. Jesus knew his suffering and "willed him to be made clean".
- ₱ Just as sin is our leprosy, we need to draw close to Jesus thru His healing power in confession so we can be made clean and Jesus "will it". "Lord, if you wish, you can make me clean." (same verse used on our signs). Mark 1:40
- † Faith asks; God gives. We may not suffer from leprosy, but where our faith in God's love for us has grown weak, let us pray with the leper to be healed. (Magnificat)


