- The faith and love of Abraham! Oh that we would trust God as he did. Could you? Would you? The love and trust of Isaac too is incomparable. How can you put your trust and love up against these two? In these next thirty days try to give your love and trust to God in ways you haven't before. Believe!
- Romans is a wonderful letter of St. Pauls. There is so much encouragement and truth to explore in it. Like today's second reading, "If God is for us, who can be against us?" Who can defeat us if God is with us? Rely on his goodness and faithfulness.
- The Transfiguration is the second time God shows us Jesus as His Son. The first was Jesus's baptism. Here God shows the disciples Jesus's glory that awaits him. Peter, James, and John get a glimpse of who Jesus truly is and are caught off guard and are moved to worship. Moses represents the law and Elijah the prophets. Jesus is the fulfillment of both bringing the covenant God made to fruition. Have you ever had an experience where you truly felt God's presence with you? and you didn't want to leave or loose that moment? That my friend was your own personal Transfiguration where God showed himself and glory to you.
- Need a cause for prayer this Lent? How about the conversion of sinners. Mary was very adamant on this and pleaded us to pray for conversion. How the world would change if hearts were converted from self to others. Add it to your prayers.
- Become someone unafraid of your cross. We are called to pick up our cross daily and follow Jesus. Lent is the time when we can become more aware of our cross. Temptations ask us to lay it aside, give in to an easier way but Jesus tells us to take it up for His sake and gain eternal life.
- If we face temptations, it doesn't mean that God has abandoned us. Temptation actually gives us an opportunity to answer the question: Whom will we serve? When we overcome temptation, we grow in virtue. Each time that we resist these temptations, we become stronger in our faith. This is why God allows these tests in our spiritual lives.
- ✤ What is it that makes your soul beautiful? Prayer. What is it that keeps you from sin? Prayer. What is it that fills you with hope? Prayer. What is it that leads you on the road to holiness? Prayer. Prayer is the key to all things. Without prayer, each and every day, you are directionless in life and are left to your own wisdom and ability, which is a frightening state to find yourself in (Faustina's Diary #146).
- Do you pray? Not just every so often, at Sunday Mass or before meals. But do you truly pray every day? Do you spend moments alone speaking to God from the depths of your heart and let Him speak back to you? Do you allow Him to initiate a conversation of love with you every day and throughout the day? Reflect, today, upon your habit of prayer. Reflect upon whether you can honestly say that your daily conversation with God is the most important conversation you have each day. Make this a priority, the number one priority, and all else will fall into place.
