- The book of the Acts of the Apostles tells of Jesus's continued help to the followers of 'The Way' (the description of the Apostles and disciples preaching) proclaiming His life, death, and resurrection. Saul has been redeemed by Jesus on the road to Damascus and has preached boldly in Jesus's name there but the disciples in Jerusalem are skeptical of him because of all the evil he did to the Christians there before. They sent him out of the city to Tarsus to preach to the Gentiles which was God's plan for him. The church was thriving and at peace.
- ✤ John is giving instruction to truly show our love for others telling us "Actions speak louder than words". It is in living and loving as Jesus did that we truly show the Spirit of Truth through his commandments; for his commandments are love in action.
- "I AM the true vine and my Father is the vine grower." We are all from farm families or we garden some and even have the simple knowledge that if a branch breaks off from a tree, or a leaf is broken off your house plant, or you pick or cut a flower from its main plant it will eventually die. There is no more sap or life giving nourishment flowing from its main trunk, root, or 'vine'.
- So it is when we sin and "break off" or "cut ourselves off" from God. Without the Sacraments, especially Holy Eucharist, Jesus tells us plain and simple many times "You have NO LIFE in you". We won't bear fruit. We have no nourishment for living and we will whither and become as dead inside. We need His life giving body and blood to keep us alive and strong to remain in Him and He in us.
- Becoming a disciple of Jesus sounds scary at first hearing, but it's really easy to bear fruit and glorify the Father. Discipleship is living the life Jesus calls you to as best you can, where you are and with what you have, keeping the commandments and giving examples of love to others so they will want your joy for themselves too. 'The Way' to bear fruit is with joy in Jesus and sharing with others why you have that joy!
