Adult Education Notes

- Today we celebrate the Holy Trinity. The Father who created us, the Son who redeemed us, the Holy Spirit who dwells within us. The Father begetting the Son and the love between them which is the Spirit. This mystery is one of the highest teachings and studied from the time it was declared a Truth of the Church.
- Dwell —verb (used without object), dwelt or dwelled, dwell·ing. to live or stay as a permanent resident; reside. Indwelling — to exist as an inner activating spirit, force, or principle.
- The Father, in begetting the Son, not only communicates to him a participation in his nature, his intelligence, and his life, but he communicates to the Son the totality of his indivisible nature...The Father gives to the Son to be "God from God, light from light, true God from true God," and the Father and the Son together communicate to the Spirit of love who proceeds from them this same indivisible divine nature and these infinite perfections. Goodness is naturally self-diffusion, and the more perfect it is the more fully and intimately it gives itself. —Fr. Reginald Garrigou-Lagrange, OP
- Living in constant unity and "Indwelling", the Trinity is Love in constant action. A spiritual writer described contemplative prayer as "conscious union with God." Another example is a married couple loving in conscious union with each other and the Holy Spirit the giving love between them.
- ✤ Are you longing for contemplative union with God? Here are some Scripture passages to serve as stepping-stones that may help lead you toward that very union with God.
- I am the vine, you are the branches" (John 15:5). As you ponder these words, let yourself move into a contemplative state of mind and heart and become united consciously with Jesus. Let yourself, the branch, become one with Jesus, the vine. Focus on that intersection point where you, the branch, intersect and become united with Jesus, the vine. Quietly savor the feeling of oneness with Christ who is the Incarnate Word and infinite being. Open yourself to the vastness of the divinity of Jesus, who surrenders himself entirely to you. Taking some deep breaths, surrender yourself humbly to the infinite God who loves you.
- It is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me" (Galatians 2:20). Open your heart to Christ who lives within you. As in the prayer above, let yourself move into a contemplative state in which you become consciously and silently united to Jesus who lives deep inside you. Savor the feeling of oneness with Christ who is the Incarnate Word of God and who says, as he said to his disciples after his resurrection, "I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20).
- "[God] is not far from each of us. For 'in him we live and move and have our being'" (Acts 17:26-27). St. Paul, speaking at the Areopagus in Athens, is describing God as the "God who made the world and everything in it" and "who is the Lord of heaven and earth" and the God who "gives to all mortals life and breath." Open yourself to this vast God who is nevertheless very close to us. Allow yourself to be consciously united with your omnipresent God, in whom you "live and move and have your being." - Look for the opportunity in search for times when the Holy Trinity is calling to you to draw nearer. Be open to 'God moments' from the Holy Spirit. Sit in a quiet spot and just 'dwell' on God's love and movement in your life then 'dwell' on his presence within you and you in him.
