LITURGICAL LIFE

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

First Reading

God promises Noah to use a “bow in the clouds” (a rainbow) as a sign and symbol of His divine pledge to never again allow a world-wide flood to devastate the earth. This is the Bible’s first recorded covenant between God and humanity. What do you think of when you see a rainbow?

Second Reading

Peter teaches that Jesus preached to both the living and the dead — those dead dating back to the days of Noah — and connecting us through baptism. What do you find intriguing about this idea?

Gospel Reading

We hear about Jesus’ temptation in the desert and his inaugural gospel message to those living in Galilee. Jesus saw repentance as necessary to believe his good news. As we begin the Lenten journey, what aspects of your life require repentance?



GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

St. Oscar Romero said, “Aspire not to have more, but to be more.” These powerful words provide the perfect framework for a conversion oriented Lenten experience. God is giving us this Lenten sign to stop being concerned about what you have and focus on who you are. This requires that we create a desert space and listen more attentively for God to reveal His presence. It is all so wonderfully simple on the one hand and so incredibly challenging on the other. The message is simple: love God, neighbor, and self. Those simple words make great sense, but we struggle translating them into reality. Our attachments, compulsions, obsessions, addictions, routines, and busyness all anchor us to the “idol of the self,” keeping us mired in our compulsive need for self-aggrandizement. It’s not about us!

God vowed, long ago, to nurture, sustain and protect the relationship He has with His people. He called us into being, nurtures us in being, and sustains us in being. Without the Loving Divine Presence, all life would cease. Once we slow down a bit and clear away some of the clutter, we can see how the journey of our life is unfolding. We can see what brings us in and out of tune with God’s love and how we can better imitate God’s loving fidelity in our relationship with Him. In short, we will see our myopic short sightedness and figure out how we can better share the Divine Fire within with others. Lent isn’t just about giving stuff up for forty days and indulging again at Easter. We need to push things much farther and wrestle with the question of how we can be more. “Being more” means becoming more fully alive and in touch with the holiness of life and the divinity that lives in and empowers all beings and things. It is realizing that the “quality” of our presence is crucial to being an effective witness and herald of God’s unconditional love.

The illusion we have bought into causes us to believe that the wrong things and systems matter. We tirelessly fight to keep things the way they are, to return to the former ways of doing things or restore some nostalgic fantasy memory of “life in the good old days.” Lent isn’t about maintaining what we have or returning to something that is gone. It’s about becoming something new. It’s about being more focused, centered, convicted, and grounded so that we can be a person who truly loves and treasures being made in the image of God. The secret to Gospel living is not found in accumulating anything for ourselves, even merit points for heaven. Gospel living means learning how to live with less so that others can live with more. The thought of permanently giving something up makes us feel uncomfortable. Truth often does.




1ST SUNDAY OF LENT



Plans Change

As we begin the season of Lent, I remember the last time we attended Mass before the pandemic. It was February 29, 2020, the first Sunday of Lent. Liturgically speaking, it was one year ago this weekend.

We weren't planning on going to Mass that Saturday evening. Four years before - on Leap Day 2016 - our grandson was born. Ever since, I promised myself that I would be with him on that day, exactly four years later, to celebrate his first actual birthday. Preparations had been made. Gifts had been purchased. Candles would be lighted and birthday wishes would be sung. But, on the evening before his birthday, my daughter called to say that they were feeling a bit under the weather. There would be no party on his birthday. I shared with her the wisdom my mom had often given me - plans change. With our plans cancelled, we went to Mass that day. We sat next to a friend and nodded at many familiar faces. We listened to the Liturgy of the Word, to the story of Jesus spending 40 days in the desert. We recited prayers we know by heart. We knelt for the Consecration and received Communion. Using common protocols during the flu season, we did not shake hands during the sign of peace and did not receive communion under both forms; still, there was nothing to indicate what was to come. Within 24 hours, I developed cold symptoms. Before any mandatory restrictions were in place, my cough was worrisome enough that we missed my mom's birthday celebration, cancelled a planned vacation to Florida and stayed home from Sunday Mass. Plans change.

Our plans are the promises we make to ourselves and others to be present at some time in the future. We schedule an appointment or enroll in a class. We agree to meet with friends for coffee, to watch a play or to discuss a book. We flip our calendar ahead many months and schedule a vacation, a family reunion, a celebration within our community. Our most ambitious plans are the ones we make when we feel confident in our health and our employment. Our most intimate plans are the ones we make with our spouses, when we buy a house, have a baby, or discuss our retirement, because those are the ones when we trust in and renew our commitment to one another. We make plans even though we know they hold no guarantee for the future. When our plans change, we often dismiss them with mild disappointment or inconvenience. Sometimes, though, we are devastated by a great sense of loss as we face future challenges without the security of our health or employment, or, especially, the presence of loved ones.

Today we hear the story of God's covenant with Noah. Specifically, he promises that he will never again bring a flood that will destroy the earth but he is also signifying the importance of his relationship to us. He is a God of love; and while he does not promise a life without trials or disappointment, his covenant contains a promise to be ever present for us. God fills the sky with a rainbow as a sign of his love and commitment. As I contemplate the grace God's covenant bestows on us, I am also reminded that it is not enough to simply take comfort in this blessing for ourselves. Sometimes, we are asked to be the rainbow that brings the presence of God to those who cannot feel it during their times of loss and loneliness.

While plans changed for all of us during 2020, the impact of those changes was not equally distributed. I am saddened by those who have been devastated by grief and loss from the pandemic, and I am humbled by those who have worked so hard during this time for the benefit of the many. I continue to pray that God will bring them comfort but I also ask God to help me focus on those in need through words and actions that will show them compassion.
