From the Pastor

Reflection for the 19th Sunday of Ordinary Time, Cycle C

You gotta love Peter. I don't know if this is the way Peter really was or if it's just that the Gospels have him saying crazy things. He's always saying crazy things, and this is one of his best; 'Lord, are you talking to us or are you talking to everybody here?' And I love the Lord's answer; 'yeah, this is for everybody but I'm talking to **you** right now.' You need to hear this. You need to understand.... Peter is a symbol for all of us. **We** need to hear and **we** need to understand. When the Lord is talking to everybody, He is talking to us, personally, too. I know, you're saying this is not about me. This is about the prudent and faithful servant whom the master has put in charge... That's got to be Peter. Right? He was the first pope! To think that, is to ignore the fact that Peter didn't ask "Is this parable for me?" He asked, "Is this parable for us?" Then Jesus talks directly to each one of us. He puts each of us in charge. We are all called upon to be the prudent and faithful servant. We are the ones He expects to distribute the food allowance at the proper time! Jesus is looking at each and every one of us and saying, "I'm talking to you!" OK, so what is the food allowance and what is the proper time? The food allowance is God's love. That's the service God wants us to perform; being an instance of His love for the other. That's what people are hungry for. It is not about volunteering at a soup kitchen so you can check off your volunteer hours and feel good about yourself. It is about encountering the other and making them feel good about that moment in their lives.

You can do that at a soup kitchen... you can do that at the family dinner table... you can do that at Starbucks or at the gas station or on the street. You can do that with an approving glance, or with an embrace, or by helping to change a tire, or by giving a couple of bucks to the person who begs. We can do that in so many different ways... we just need to do it. It is the food allowance that the servants are supposed to give out. It is what God's little ones are hungering for.

And when is the proper time? Whenever the Lord puts someone in need in front of us. And here's the soup kitchen again; we can't just say that we will volunteer at the soup kitchen once a month and feel like we're doing our job. We also have to pay attention to people's hungers as the Lord sends them to us. It's not on any schedule except the Lord's schedule. And the Lord's schedule doesn't seem to care about our schedules. When He sees someone in need and sees that we are capable of fulfilling that need, he puts them together with us, even when we don't think we are capable of fulfilling that need. Even when we feel we don't have the time or energy to deal with their problems. The proper time is His time; no excuses.

Peter would have to ask the question. I don't know why he asked the question but I get the Lord's answer. It's for everybody and it's for each one of us personally. We are all in this together and we all have to do our part; no excuses.

PARISH FINANCES

In order to fulfill our budget, we need to receive an average of \$12,722 in the collection basket each week. Some weeks may be higher and some lower, but we need to maintain that average. Additionally, we have budgeted for an average of \$12,802 to be contributed monthly through our Online Giving contribution program.

The total amount budgeted through these sources is \$660,095 this year. Our budget includes another \$106,384 expected income from other sources; (Annual Catholic Appeal rebates, Christmas & Easter collections, Sacramental donations, interest, one-time gifts and bequests, etc.).

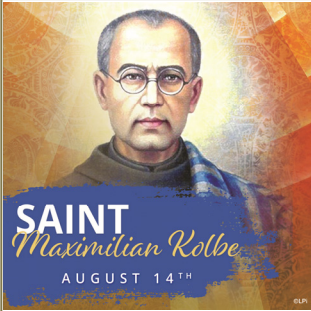

Gospel Meditation, Live the Liturgy & Catholic Traditions



Courage and sacrificial love mark the life of **St. Maximilian Kolbe**. He became a priest of the Franciscan order.

Dedicated with evangelization, he published a magazine to teach the Catholic faith and encourage devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. During the Nazi occupation of Poland,

Fr. Kolbe was arrested and sent to Auschwitz. One day a prisoner escaped from the camp. The Nazi punishment was harsh: for one escapee, ten must die in his place. The guards picked ten men at random. One began to beg for his life on behalf of his family, and another man stepped forward and offered to take his place. Fr. Kolbe was sentenced, along with the other nine men, to death by starvation. For this "martyr of Auschwitz," a life of devotion culminated in one heroic, Christlike act.
