

As they wonder about the welcome they may receive, imagine their joy when they hear welcoming words or receive a hot meal. Mary and Joseph depended on the goodness of strangers to help them: Welcome, to a place and food; Welcome, to companionship and help as your baby arrives; Welcome, to a world poor and hopeful; Welcome, to a people who have longed to see this night.






I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.






Hail, Holy Queen


