"The Son of Man is to be handed over to men and they will kill him, and three days after his death the Son of Man will rise." Last Sunday, Jesus said, "that the Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and rise after three days." Sandwiched between these two passages on these Sunday's, were the Feast days of the Exaltation of the Cross, Our Lady of Sorrows, and the Martyrdom of Saints Cornelius and Cyprian. This tells us that the Cross is very important to us as Catholics and Christians. The Cross is part of our lives and dying to ourselves brings us newness of life. We experience this new life as we go through the travails of this life and eventually the fullness of life in heaven.

Sometimes we expect our lives to be a "bowl full of cherries", when in fact none of us will escape suffering and death. As Christians we can expect hardship and suffering for the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The message in our culture is if we pray and be good, we will not suffer. The truth is we will all suffer. The message can be put out to us that if we live a Christian life, we will prosper in this life. This is not the experience of our Saints that have gone before us marked with the sign of Christ. TO KNOW: This passage marks a turning point in Mark's gospel. Jesus had left Galilee where he was safe and took the first step towards Jerusalem and the Cross that awaited him there. For the second time, Jesus taught his followers about his coming passion and death, but they did not understand his words. When they arrived in Capernaum, Jesus asked his disciples what they had been arguing about on the way. They were embarrassed because they had been discussing what rank each would have in the kingdom. Jesus placed a small child in their midst and taught them an important lesson. Those who wished to be his disciples should not be concerned about ambition and prestige. God's kingdom would be attained through service to the poor and lowly. Anyone who served these little ones of simple faith were in reality serving Jesus and the Father who sent him.
