What Does It Mean to Be a Consecrated Religious?

Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the first reading today the power of God extends through the prophet Elijah to the poor and needy, in the story of a woman and her son. The story has a happy ending, emphasizing the message of trust in God.

The second reading sets out differences between the sacrifices offered by the Jewish high priests and the single sacrifice offered by Christ, the high priest. For generations of Jews ministers offered animals, Christ offered himself on the cross in a once-and-for-all offering that took away the sins of humankind.

In today's Gospel reading of Mark, Jesus tells his disciples to beware of the scribes. See that you do not imitate their hypocrisy, or all their principals, and be on guard against their insidious counsels and designs. There was an absolute necessity for these repeated cautions of our Lord. Then he said to them in His teaching, "beware of the scribes, who desire to go around in long robes, love greetings in the marketplaces, the best seats in the synagogues, and the best places at feasts, who devour widows' houses, and for a pretense make long prayers. These will receive greater condemnation of our Lord."

The two brief stories in the gospel today deal with wealth issues that are still challenging today. First are those who think they are more important than anyone else. In Mark's estimation they are self-important, arrogant and self aggrandizing.

Jesus states his teaching about wealth, putting it as clearly as possible, "Amen I say to you" stresses how important it is that disciples and us adopt his view.



They also will sponsor a lottery wreath raffle. Tickets will be sold at all the pirohy sales. Drawing will be held on December 10th.




