# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Last weekend, I read a letter from Bishop Bonnar announcing his decision to close one of our two church campuses and to eliminate one of our two weekend Masses. Bishop Murry originally promulgated this plan in 2019; however, his passing and the Covid-19 pandemic delayed implementation until now. These changes will take effect by June of 2022. Similar reductions are unfolding around the Diocese and will reach other parishes in Trumbull County, I have been assured. At Blessed Sacrament, we announced that the number of weekend Masses there would be reduced from three to two. In the coming months, I will be working with the parish councils of Seton and BSP to develop a new weekend Mass schedule. After implementation, I will personally celebrate each of the three weekend Masses at Seton (1) and BSP (2). The finance and parish councils of St. Elizabeth Ann Seton will work with me to recommend which of the two church campuses will be sold- either St. James or Sts. Cyril and Methodius. Proceeds of the sale will remain with St. Elizabeth Ann Seton. Mass will not be offered at the ideal time and location for every one of us. With some flexibility and a firm commitment to our parish community, I trust that we will adjust and move forward. Fr. Trimbur's weekly presence will be sorely missed. We will be sure to thank him abundantly for his ministry when the time comes.

The reason for Bishop Bonnar's decision is: "a declining number of priests available for service." For quite a long time, the local Church has been eliminating Masses, merging parishes, sharing priests, and closing churches and schools. To say the least, Church downsizing is disappointing. We would rather be in the mode of celebrating heaps of baptisms, weddings, and ordinations and therefore building new churches and adding Masses. Sadly, this is not our reality. At the same time, we need to recognize that St. Elizabeth Ann Seton has not been sliding down the tubes. Mass participation and parish activity has been on the rise in recent months. You have worked tirelessly to sustain this parish through years of uncertainty and tumult by remaining committed to the parish community and raising funds. Consequently, the parish is financially sound. We have no debt, pay all bills on time and in full, and have a modest but healthy savings. The same can be said for Blessed Sacrament.

In my view, there are four key elements to successful parishes: focusing on prayer and sacraments, offering catechesis for all ages, serving the needy, and fostering community among parishioners. We are making progress in these areas, but our work is never done. I am grateful for the opportunity to be your pastor and ask for your continued support. If we put GOD FIRST and STICK TOGETHER as a parish community, we will recover from this change and emerge with strength. Please pray for me, Bishop Bonnar, and our parish. As we pray for vocations prior to Mass, know that this is the reason!

His love never changes no matter how we fail to serve Him. What does change is how we respond to such love. St Teresa of Calcutta is our modern day example of what love looks like. And she says it best, "If you judge people you'll have no time to love them, and the most terrible poverty is loneliness and the feeling of being unloved."

We have a lot to be grateful for. Let us love one another as Christ loves us.

#### **It's Pirohy Time!!!**

Sign-up sheets are in the back of the church for anyone able to help with the pirohy.

You may also call the office to sign up. Even if you can only *spare one or two hours* it will be much appreciated! We make them at St. Cyril's Hall.



## Wednesday, November 6:00 am-10:00 am

We cook the cabbage and sauerkraut in large stockpots, which must be lifted while full of hot water and food. Later the pots need cleaned.

#### Thursday, November 4 7:00 am-10:00 am

We cook the potatoes and mash them in a large commercial mixer. We roll the balls in preparation for filling on Fridays. We prepare and package the haluski. We set up tables for the sale on Fridays.

#### Friday, November 5 7:30 am-noon

We mix the dough in a commercial mixer, roll it out and cut the dough into circles. We form the pirohy by wrapping/pinching dough around the balls. We then cook the pirohy in stockpots. Once pirohy is cooled it is prepared for packaging and counted into one or two dozen containers. Orders are then picked up by customers from 12:00 -4 pm on Friday October 22.

**Pirohy cost \$7 per dozen**. We have potato and cheese pirohy or sweet cabbage pirohy.

Haluski cost \$4 a bag. We have with or without cabbage.

**Adopt:** Spiritually "adopt" one of our seminarians. Pray daily for them. Send cards at Christmas, Easter, and birthday.


