

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, I am reminded of a very handy prayer to the Holy Spirit I learned from parishioners at St. James when I was a seminarian: "Come Holy Spirit, come by means of the powerful intercession of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, your well-beloved spouse." I encourage you to memorize these few words and use them whenever you need God's help. Pray that our parishioners, especially those who are being confirmed this Sunday, will be open and obedient to the outpouring of God's love.

I am pleased to share some exciting news for both of our parishes. Sisters are on the way! This September, one fully professed sister and two novices of the Parish Visitors of Mary Immaculate are planning to move into the Blessed Sacrament Providence Center (convent) for a three month trial period. The Parish Visitors specialize in person to person evangelization to connect and reconnect people to the Church, visiting hospitals and prisons, helping immigrants, catechesis, and directing young people to wholesome recreation. Bishop Bonnar whole heartedly supports this initiative. Over the summer volunteers will be needed to fix up the Providence Center. Please send me an email if you are interested in helping out. I will be working to find new meeting spaces for the AA groups and Cub Scouts that currently meet in the Providence Center. The Parish Visitors have expressed openness to returning on a long term basis in 2022. In case they do not return, another religious order is interested! Please continue to pray for God's will to be done. May God bless you!

PENTECOST SUNDAY

Thoughts for the week: This Sunday is the day of Pentecost—the day when we remember the experience of the disciples in the Upper Room when they received what Jesus called "the power from on high". The name Pentecost comes from a Jewish Festival of that name (also sometimes called "Feast of Weeks") which occurred fifty days after the Passover. It was a harvest festival, celebrating the completion of the grain harvest, and a time in which the first fruits of the harvest were offered to God. But it was also a time of remembering the giving of the law of Mount Sinai after the Exodus from Egypt. It was one of the three great festivals of Judaism.

It is significant that this was the day when the disciples experienced the outpouring of God's Spirit. After Jesus had fulfilled the law in his life, death and resurrection, the disciples now experienced the fulfillment of Jeremiah's prophecy of a time when God's law would be written on the heart. You may recall that, in Galatians 5, Paul teaches that those who live by the Spirit, and produce the fruit of the Spirit, need no law. This is because it is written on their hearts. So in a way, the disciples were receiving the "new" law, much as Moses received the "old" law on Mount Sinai long ago.

In addition, the followers of Jesus, and those who came to faith on this day, were the "first fruits" of the new community that God was bringing into being, based on the message and mission of Jesus-bringing God's Reign of justice, peace and love into the world. But, in the new ability to speak in different languages the disciples received, God demonstrated what kind of community this was to be. Language so often divides people—as it did in the Babel story in Genesis – but God enabled the disciples to overcome these divisions and create a diverse, inclusive community in which all were welcome.

Pentecost is about a personal gift of power, but as we see here, it is also about so much more. How can we embrace the whole gift of Pentecost this week? We must be open for God to meet us where we are and to come to us in whatever way will best lead us deeper into God's power and presence. We can know our own Pentecost.

Catholic Vs. Protestant Bibles

Why are Catholic and Protestant Bibles different? Since the earliest days of the Church, Christians used a Greek translation of the Old Testament known as the Septuagint. This collection of the texts of the Hebrew Scriptures included 46 books. At the time of the Protestant Reformation in the 1500s, the Protestant reformers began to create their own translations of the Bible (into local languages) and some began to question why the Jewish Scriptures would have included texts that were written in Greek, because, they assumed, the only valid Jewish Scriptures would have been written in Hebrew. And so, they decided to remove seven books from the Old Testament: Baruch, Sirach, 1 and 2 Maccabees, Tobit, Judith and Wisdom (as well as portions of the Books of Daniel and Esther).

This means that the Protestant Old Testament only includes 39 books, while Catholic Bibles continue to include those original 46 books. Both Catholic and Protestant Bibles include 27 books and letters in the New Testament. ©LPi


