INTERCESSION FOR LIFE

For the sick, especially those nearing life's end: May they be cared for with tenderness and compassion as they prepare to enter eternal life: We pray to the Lord:

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

The mother-in-law of Simon lay sick with a fever. They immediately told him about her. He approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up. Then the fever left her and she waited on them.'

This action of Jesus tells us something about Him. Jesus did not need a crowd in order to exert his power; nor did He only wield His power when faced with possessed, paralyzed, or blind individuals, those suffering from leprosy, or even the dead! Today Jesus heals an ordinary woman from an ordinary fever. The purpose of miracles was not to increase the fame of Jesus; rather they were simply to heal individuals from their sufferings.

Do we ever refrain from praying to Jesus for healing in our ordinary lives and for our ordinary sicknesses? Do we ever feel unworthy to be healed? Do we feel that we are not important enough to be considered a candidate for the healing power of Jesus? Let us look at the Gospel today and identify with the mother-in-law of Peter and ask for ordinary things we need in our own ordinary lives.

When we are healed what is our immediate response? Do we remember to thank Jesus for His goodness, mercy, and compassion? Do we respond with service to others -- service to Jesus? Do we know someone who needs to be visited by Jesus? Someone who needs to be healed; but is not approaching or can not approach Jesus? Can we be like the disciples and bring the healing power and love of Jesus to them trusting in the power of Jesus to heal just as the disciples trusted?
