LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

October 4, 2020

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Last week we heard the parable of the two brothers who are told to go out and work the vineyard. One said he would go, but did not go. The other said he would not go, but later changed his mind and went. The second son did the Father's will. The first did not. Two weeks ago, Jesus assured us it doesn't matter at what hour of the day or at what stage of our life's journey, He wishes to bestow generously His life into ours that we in turn plant and cultivate the seed of His life in others. Today there is an urgency to the call. *The day is far spent and the night draws near.* We must waste no time getting into the work of life which is the work of the Church in deference to Christ.

In today's first reading from the prophet Isaiah we have yet another parable warning us that if we do not get to work, the Lord will "*allow things to come to ruin, overgrown with thorns and briars.*" In both the first reading from the prophet Isaiah and in the gospel, the laborers prove themselves lazy, irresponsible, and full of greed. When Jesus is sent to set things right; laying out the blueprint for what is true, honorable, just, pure, lovely, and gracious, even to the point of healing and saving, He is rejected – beaten and killed. From the cross He cried to the Father, "Forgive them, they know not what they do." In the resurrection, He yet again issues the call to get into the work, sending us as "*lambs in the midst of wolves.*" I'm shifting from image to image, but the point should be well understood.

As Catholics we have a responsibility to labor under the Lordship of Jesus Christ and thereby confound the wise of this world. Unfortunately, our nation, founded on Judeo-Christian principles and values, has quite successfully removed the hedge from around the vineyard by removing the Commandments and Prayer from the institutions that form the lives of our children. For decades the nation has dismantled the watchtower and given little attention or, worse yet, is complicit to forces embarking upon us to pillage, rape, and destroy the sacred soul of our nation in favor of irresponsible behavior, laziness, and greed which often morphs into violence.

It is true, *the day is far spent and the night draws near*, but there emerges from time to time beautiful signs to remind us that all is not lost and good shall prevail. This past week I saw and heard such a sign. In an interview with Amy Coney Barrett, a constitutional scholar who has been nominated to the Supreme Court of the United States, I saw and heard what can best be described as the essence of our Catholic faith and what it means to get into the work. Amy Coney Barrett is a devout Catholic who prays daily. She and her husband have seven children, one with Down's Syndrome, and two adopted from Haiti.

While in the process of adopting the children, Amy learned she was pregnant with their fifth child who was prenatally diagnosed with Down's Syndrome. Overwhelmed, Amy balked and wondered whether or not to suspend the adoptions. Conflicted by her situation, emulating Jesus, she went to a "lonely place" to bring this dilemma before the Lord. She went to pray in a cemetery at Notre Dame University where she was a Professor of Law. There, she was able to put things in perspective. As she described it, "I understood this would be hard, but I thought to myself life is short. We can do this." She added, "There is nothing more beautiful in life than raising children."

In other words, the essence of our Catholic faith is that life is short and we must get into the work and do what we can in the time allotted us. The Lord never deceived us in saying it would be easy. Amy Coney Barrett's witness, and that of her husband, are the antithesis of laziness, irresponsibility, and greed. I bring her up because she is currently on the world's stage and has already been scrutinized and vilified for her Catholic faith and firm commitment to marriage and family, to the life of the unborn, and for publicly declaring her love for the Constitution of the United States of America.

Amy Coney Barrett is one witness among many. During these topsy turvy days of uncertainty and confusion when so many are full of anxiety and feeling rather discombobulated, I take solace in you who read this letter and are seated in the pews. No matter at what hour or at what stage in your life's journey, you are now in the sacred story. Together we offer our lives to Christ who washes us in His most Precious Blood and we get to work no matter what the cost. St. Paul reminds us:

*"In everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God.
Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus."*

CARTA DEL PÁRROCO

4 de octubre de 2020

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

La semana pasada escuchamos la parábola de los dos hermanos a quienes se les dice que salgan a trabajar a la viña. Uno dijo que iría, pero no fue. El otro dijo que no iría, pero luego cambió de parecer y sí fue. El segundo hijo hizo la voluntad del Padre. El primero no la hizo. Hace dos semanas, Jesús nos aseguró que no importa a qué hora del día o en qué etapa de nuestra vida estemos, Él desea otorgar generosamente Su vida a la nuestra para que a su vez plantemos y cultivemos la semilla de Su vida en los demás. Hoy hay urgencia en el llamado. *El día está muy avanzado y la noche se acerca*. Debemos apresurarnos en la obra de la vida que es obra de la Iglesia en atención a Cristo.

En la primera lectura de hoy del profeta Isaías, tenemos otra parábola que nos advierte que, si no nos ponemos a trabajar, el Señor *"permitirá que las cosas se arruinen y se cubran de espinas y abrojos"*. Tanto en la primera lectura del profeta Isaías como en el Evangelio, los obreros demuestran ser perezosos, irresponsables y llenos de codicia. Cuando Jesús es enviado para arreglar las cosas, trazando el modelo de lo que es verdadero, honorable, justo, puro, hermoso y misericordioso, hasta el punto de sanar y salvar, Él es rechazado, golpeado y asesinado. Desde la cruz clamó al Padre: *"Perdónalos, no saben lo que hacen"*. En la resurrección, vuelve a emitir el llamado a entrar en la obra, enviándonos como *"corderos en medio de lobos"*. Estoy pasando de una imagen a otra, pero el punto debe entenderse bien.

Como católicos tenemos la responsabilidad de trabajar bajo el señorío de Jesucristo y así confundir a los sabios de este mundo. Desafortunadamente, nuestra nación, fundada en principios y valores judeocristianos, ha eliminado con bastante éxito el cerco alrededor del viñedo al eliminar los mandamientos y la oración en las instituciones que forman la vida de nuestros hijos. Durante décadas, la nación ha desmantelado la torre de vigilancia y ha prestado poca atención o, peor aún, es cómplice de las fuerzas que se embarcan en nosotros para saquear, violar y destruir el alma sagrada de nuestra nación en favor del comportamiento irresponsable, la pereza y la codicia que a menudo se transforma en violencia.

Es cierto, *el día está muy avanzado y la noche se acerca*, pero de vez en cuando surgen hermosas señales para recordarnos que no todo está perdido y que el bien prevalecerá. La semana pasada vi y escuché tal señal. En una entrevista con Amy Coney Barrett, una académica constitucional que ha sido nominada a la Corte Suprema de los Estados Unidos, vi y escuché lo que se puede describir mejor como la esencia de nuestra fe católica y lo que significa entrar en el trabajo. Amy Coney Barrett es una católica devota que reza a diario. Ella y su esposo tienen siete hijos, uno con síndrome de Down y dos adoptados de Haití.

Mientras estaba en el proceso de adopción de los niños, Amy se enteró de que estaba embarazada de su quinto hijo al que le diagnosticaron síndrome de Down antes del nacimiento. Abrumada, Amy se resistió y se preguntó si suspender o no las adopciones. Conflictuada por su situación, emulando a Jesús, fue a un "lugar solitario" para llevar este dilema ante el Señor. Fue a rezar a un cementerio de la Universidad de "Notre Dame" donde era profesora de derecho. Allí, pudo poner las cosas en perspectiva. Como ella lo describió, "Comprendí que esto sería difícil, pero pensé que la vida es corta. Podemos hacer esto." Añadió: "No hay nada más hermoso en la vida que criar hijos".

En otras palabras, la esencia de nuestra fe católica es que la vida es corta y debemos ponernos manos a la obra y hacer lo que podamos en el tiempo que se nos ha asignado. El Señor nunca nos engañó diciendo que sería fácil. El testimonio de Amy Coney Barrett y el de su esposo es lo contrario a la pereza, irresponsabilidad y codicia. La menciono porque se encuentra actualmente en el escenario mundial y ya ha sido escudriñada y despreciada por su fe católica y su firme compromiso con el matrimonio y la familia, con la vida de los no nacidos y por declarar públicamente su amor a la Constitución de los Estados Unidos de América.

Amy Coney Barrett es un testigo entre muchos. Durante estos días revueltos de incertidumbre y confusión cuando tantos están llenos de ansiedad y sintiéndose bastante desconcertados, me consuelo en ustedes que leen esta carta y están sentados en los bancos. No importa a qué hora o en qué etapa de su vida se encuentren, ahora están en la historia sagrada. Juntos ofrecemos nuestras vidas a Cristo quien nos lava en Su Preciosísima Sangre y nos ponemos manos a la obra sin importar el costo. San Pablo nos recuerda:

"En todo, con oración y petición, en acción de gracias, den a conocer sus peticiones a Dios. Entonces la paz de Dios, que sobrepasa todo entendimiento, guardará sus corazones y sus mentes en Cristo Jesús".
