

Divine Mercy Sunday

Celebrating God's Merciful Love

In the Jubilee Year 2000, Pope John Paul II proclaimed that from that year forward the Sec-

ond Sunday of Easter would be celebrated as Divine Mercy Sunday. This was proclaimed at the Canonization Mass of St. Faustina Kawalska, who worked throughout her life to make all aware of the merciful love of God. St. Faustina (1905–1938) was born and raised in Poland. Following a vocation to religious life, she was accepted by the Congregation of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy. As a member of the Congregation, she worked as a cook, gardener, and porter. In her spiritual life, her contemplation on the Mercy of God led her to develop a childlike trust in God and deep love for her neighbor.

In her years in the convent, St. Faustina heard a call from God to make God's mercy known to the world so that the world may more fully receive God's healing grace. St. Faustina promoted the Chaplet of Divine Mercy which consists of the recitation of prayers to the Eternal Father with the use of the rosary for the sake of Christ's sorrowful passion.

The Chaplet is prayed as follows:

- 1. Begin with the Sign of the Cross, one Our Father, one Hail Mary, and the Apostles' Creed.
- 2. On the Our Father beads, recite the following:

"Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of your dearly beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in atomement for our sins and those of the who

sus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world."

- 3. On the ten Hail Mary beads, say the following:
- "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world."
- 4. Repeat step two and three for all five decades.
- 5. Conclude by reciting three times:

"Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world."

What is a Plenary Indulgence?

God's granting special grace by removing all effects of previous sin to those who turn to God in their time of need. If the intention in your heart is to be reconciled to God and to your neighbor, then your sins are forgiven along with any remaining negative effects from the sin.

How does that work?

Normally we would gather at Mass and for other forms of prayer and devotions, but because of the COVID-19 pandemic and the necessary social distancing, we are unable to. We can however still unite spiritually through our individual practices as well as shared virtual experiences. This could include uniting "through the media to the celebration of Holy Mass, the recitation of the Holy Rosary, to the practice of the Way of the Cross or other forms of devotion, or we can recite the Creed, the Lord's Prayer or invoke the intercession of our Blessed Mother, Mary, and offer this time of suffering in a spirit of faith in God and charity towards our brothers and sisters, along with the will to fulfill the usual conditions (meaning to celebrate the sacrament of Confession, and receive Holy Communion as soon as possible)". Through these actions and intentions we will be granted Plenary Indulgence.

No Matter What...

For those who are too sick to pray, even those who may have only ever said just "a few prayers," God's Mercy and Love is already with them, especially during their time of suffering. And, should it be their time to leave this life, as we know it, God will embrace them and bring them to everlasting life. We know this because **God's love is unconditional**. God sees into our hearts and knows, before we even say a prayer, who we are. God's love and forgiveness, God's salvation for all humans is an unmerited, gracious and generous, free gift.

As long as your child is doing the work at home, this temporary break from having classes at the parish will in no way stand in the way of the celebration of Sacraments (as soon as we can safely celebrate, for Levels 2, 7 and Older Sacraments), or moving up to the next Level (for Levels 1, 3, 4, 5 and 6). Level 7 Confirmation Packets which were due on March 25th, will now be due when classes resume.

Dear Parishioner,

It is springtime both in our world and in our church. In our natural world, we look outside our windows and see the trees beginning to bud. A quick walk around the neighborhood reveals colorful daffodils, harbingers of the explosive growth that is to shortly arrive. For those of us who garden, we prune away last year's growth to make room for new growth, new life. We are an Easter people, and even though we can't come together right now to celebrate, we rejoice in Jesus' resurrection and usher in a time of renewal – a time to reflect upon how we live out our baptismal call as Christians.

Normally, my preparations for our annual Stewardship Time and Talent Renewal would be in full swing, a time when I invite all of you to consider getting involved in something in the parish, whether it be as a Lector, Catechist, Thrift Shop Assistant, etc. So, the challenge is how do we still practice Stewardship and Ministry when we can't meet face to face? How do we "be church" without an actual church available to us? We can watch the Mass on our phones or TVs, but what other actions can we take at this challenging and stressful time?

To live "Stewardship" is to live a life of gratitude. Perhaps being forced to curtail all our outside activities has given us the time to reflect on the blessings in our lives – health, family, friends, food, etc. It is not enough, however, to be grateful. How do we respond to the gratitude, especially now? Do we hide in our homes, watch the news and become more fearful, or do we turn off the TV and show others our faith, love and compassion? Now is the time to give the gifts of your time and compassion to others. How? We can start by communicating with others! Try reaching out to a few people each day that you may not have spoken with for awhile. Call them, hear their voices and listen, really listen to what they are saying. Giving the gift of your time and companionship to someone who feels isolated and afraid is huge at a time like this!

Be a disciple – share your faith with others who may be questioning why God is "letting this happen to us". Allow them to see that you too are afraid, but choose to put more stock in Jesus' promise that He will be with us always than in all-consuming fear.

Use social media. Social distancing does not mean social distance! How ironic that the very thing that helped create social isolation can now bring us all together. Get on Facebook and Twitter; use Skype or FaceTime to see distant family members and friends. Here at the parish, the staff has set up a "Group Me" chat so we can share something immediately with the entire staff and have weekly Zoom video conferences to keep us close to one another. And yes, Father Suglia is right there to support us and share with us!

Stewardship

Generously offer your time to do what you can. Help elderly neighbors secure food and medicine. If you live near someone who is working long hours in a hospital or providing some other essential service, consider preparing a meal or baking cookies and leave your gift at their front door with a thank you note. And pray!!! Make the time and commitment to pray every day from your heart. As faith-filled stewards, we *know* the power of prayer makes a difference.

And last, but certainly not least, give generously if you are able. Financial giving is an important part of living as a committed steward, as we give back joyfully in gratitude for all that we have been given.
