



Ushers will check your registrations at the door before entering the church and will seat you. The pews in the church are marked off to maintain social distancing.

**WEBSITE.** If you click on the Mass and it has already begun, you will have the ability on *YouTube* to rewind the Mass to the beginning while it is in progress. Don't worry if you are unable to rewind — the Mass in its entirety will also be available immediately after its conclusion. Live streaming will allow you to attend Mass at home simultaneously with your fellow parishioners in the church, and with much clearer video and sound than we have been able to offer in the past.

THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION IS OFFERED ON SATURDAYS AT 4PM IN THE CHURCH. Unfortunately due to limited seating, you cannot remain for the 5pm Mass after Reconciliation if you have not reserved a seat ahead of time.

As we continue to navigate the public celebration of Mass within State Guidelines, St. Sylvester Parish will offer Mass on Saturdays at 5PM and Sundays at 9AM & 11AM. Please note the following important information:

- At this time, the bishop still dispenses all the faithful from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation.
- Our Sunday worship will be livestreamed on Saturdays at 5pm and Sundays at 11am and will continue to be posted on the website for those who are vulnerable, for those who have a health impairment that would make them more susceptible to serious illness, for those who might not be feeling well, or have a fever, and for those who are caretakers for other people who are vulnerable. If you are in any of these situations, you are encouraged to continue to remain at home and worship online.
- Restrooms will be open for emergency use only! Please use bathroom at home!
- There is a mandatory online reservation system for all who wish to attend Mass. Please register beginning Wednesdays at 9am by going to www.stsylvesterli.org
- Please print out your registration information or have available on your phone as you will be asked to show your registration before entering the church.
- Masks or other face coverings must be worn by all participants.
- Please arrive 15 minutes before Mass so your reservation may be confirmed and you may be shown to your seat. Capacity at this time is limited to 25%.
- Seating will be done according to social distancing guidelines. You will most likely not be sitting in your "usual" seat. Families may sit together at Mass. There is no "saving seats" or asking to be seated in a particular seat.
- The Offertory Procession and passing of the donation basket will be omitted.
- If you wish to make a contribution, there will be baskets at the entrance and exit. Contributions may also dropped at the parish center or made online.
- The Sign of Peace or other greetings will not be exchanged.
- Directions will be given for Communion, which will be distributed after Mass as you are leaving the church. Please follow the directions of the ushers.
- Please go directly to your car, as no congregating is permitted.
- We will continue to keep you updated on changes as we move forward.

This is a work in progress, so as we move forward there may be changes. We appreciate your patience and want you to know that our first priority is that those attending Mass will be safe.

#### **Everyone is Looking for You**

Mark tells us in today's Gospel that Simon and the others were looking for Jesus who had gone off to a deserted place to pray. In fact, we hear that they *pursue* Jesus, a much stronger word, and that when they find Him they say to Jesus, possibly with a hint of exasperation, "Everyone is looking for you."

Now we've all had those stressful, busy days where you try to find a quiet place for a few minutes to collect your thoughts (especially if you have a demanding job or young children), and you cringe inwardly when you hear your name being called.

So here we have Jesus, beginning His public ministry by preaching, healing the sick and driving out demons. He made quite an impression on the people he encountered, to say the least, which made them clamor for more. This must have been challenging and tiring for the fully human Jesus, son of a carpenter. And yet, unlike my struggling human response — which probably would have been to hide to gain another five minutes of solitude when I heard my name being called — Jesus, once found, turns to Simon and the others seemingly renewed, saying to them "Let us go on to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come."

As Christian stewards, we all have a purpose and God has given us special gifts and talents to fulfill this purpose, our vocation, here on earth. Jesus, because He's also fully divine, implicitly understood His purpose and the commitment, challenges and sacrifice involved. For some of us, it may take years of prayer and discernment to understand what we are called to do in this life, but make no mistake, we all are called. Perhaps we can try to emulate Jesus' response by saying, "I'm here. Let us go on..." when we hear His voice echoing within us, calling us out of our comfort zones to bravely and energetically embrace all that He envisions for each one of us as faithful stewards and disciples. ~ Lori Zito
