





WEEKEND MASSES ARE CELEBRATED AT 5PM ON SATURDAYS

AND 9AM AND 11AM ON SUNDAYS. You must register to attend these Masses weekly through our parish website beginning each Wednesday morning at 9am. The program will stop accepting reservations on Friday at 3pm (or sooner if it reaches a maximum of 80 people for that particular Mass). Ushers will check your registrations at the door before entering the church and will seat you. The pews in the church are marked off to maintain social distancing.

# WEEKEND MASSES WILL NOW BE LIVE STREAMED ON YOUTUBE AT 5PM AND 11AM —LINK AVAILABLE FROM OUR

**WEBSITE.** If you click on the Mass and it has already begun, you will have the ability on *YouTube* to rewind the Mass to the beginning while it is in progress. Don't worry if you are unable to rewind — the Mass in its entirety will also be available immediately after its conclusion. Live streaming will allow you to attend Mass at home simultaneously with your fellow parishioners in the church, and with much clearer video and sound than we have been able to offer in the past.

### Dear Parishioners,

As we continue to navigate the public celebration of Mass within State Guidelines, St. Sylvester Parish will offer Mass on Saturdays at 5PM and Sundays at 9AM & 11AM. Please note the following important information:

- At this time, the bishop still dispenses all the faithful from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation.
- Our Sunday worship will be livestreamed on Saturdays at 5pm and Sundays at 11am and will continue to be posted on the website for those who are vulnerable, for those who have a health impairment that would make them more susceptible to serious illness, for those who might not be feeling well, or have a fever, and for those who are caretakers for other people who are vulnerable. If you are in any of these situations, you are encouraged to continue to remain at home and worship online.
- Restrooms will be open for emergency use only! Please use bathroom at home!
- There is a mandatory online reservation system for all who wish to attend Mass. Please register beginning Wednesdays at 9am by going to www.stsylvesterli.org
- Please print out your registration information or have available on your phone as you will be asked to show your registration before entering the church.
- Masks or other face coverings must be worn by all participants.
- Please arrive 15 minutes before Mass so your reservation may be confirmed and you may be shown to your seat. Capacity at this time is limited to 25%.
- Seating will be done according to social distancing guidelines. You will most likely not be sitting in your "usual" seat. Families may sit together at Mass. There is no "saving seats" or asking to be seated in a particular seat.
- The Offertory Procession and passing of the donation basket will be omitted.
- If you wish to make a contribution, there will be baskets at the entrance and exit. Contributions may also dropped at the parish center or made online.
- The Sign of Peace or other greetings will not be exchanged.
- Directions will be given for Communion, which will be distributed after Mass as you are leaving the church. Please follow the directions of the ushers.
- Please go directly to your car, as no congregating is permitted.
- We will continue to keep you updated on changes as we move forward.

This is a work in progress, so as we move forward there may be changes. We appreciate your patience and want you to know that our first priority is that those attending Mass will be safe.

### Information Regarding Envelope Donations

When sorting the envelopes each week, we have noticed that some of you are using multiple envelopes for your regular donations, which is a lot of extra writing, stuffing and sealing! If you are sending in your regular donations monthly (or every few months), you only need to use the most current envelope for your donation. For example, you can simply write "for the month of January" on the envelope instead of filling out five (5) individual envelopes.

If, however, you are sending in donations at the same time for many different things such as Regular, Solar, Renovation, Holy Days, etc., please continue to use the separate envelopes provided as each category must be counted individually.

### What Are you Looking For?

In today's Gospel (John 1:35-42) we hear that Jesus, noticing that two disciples of John the Baptist were following Him, turned and asked them, "What are you looking for?" They, of course, were seeking the Messiah. Jesus knows this and invites them to accompany Him to where He was staying, saying, "Come and you will see."

John's Gospel presents the question and the invitation to each one of us as faith-filled stewards. In short, what are you really looking for and how will you find it? If you asked 100 people what they are seeking in life, they would all give different answers: happiness, peace, a good job, true love, etc. On the surface, all are meaningful, honest responses — what's missing is the path. How do we find and attain these things we seek? By our own determination, or perhaps pure luck and coincidence?

The reality is that only our faith and trust in God can bring us the hope, happiness, love and peace we so desperately seek in our very broken world. No amount of influence or money can help attain them. I have known many wealthy people in my life who were absolutely miserable. Jesus alone is our "go to" connection. John the Baptist proclaims, "Behold the Lamb of God," to his disciples as Jesus passes, and they in turn, respond immediately to Christ's invitation, "Come and you will see."

Do we really believe that He is the way, the truth and the life — that God alone is the path? And just as important — as missionary disciples, are we prepared to immediately follow Jesus at His invitation? ~ Lori Zito
