If you want to receive Communion on your tongue, please go to the very end of the priest's line for the safety of everyone.



Faith Formation in 2022—2023

We hope you and your families ae doing well and enjoying the warmer weather. We are excited to share with you the plans for the coming Faith Formation year! We continue to develop the program to be more family-oriented, balancing Church and home life, empowering and encouraging parents to be witnesses of the faith and providing opportunities for families to experience God's loving presence in all they do and in all the places they are!

This is what the program will look like for the 2022-2023 year!

- ~ All classes will meet at the parish, except for some of the Individualized Faith Formation (IFF) classes, which are designed to assist children with special needs in preparing for and receiving Sacraments.
- ~ Class times will be one hour and fifteen minutes instead of one hour long with exceptions for IFF.
- ~ Classes will meet twice a month instead of every week.
- ~ There will be a Sunday/Saturday Mass component for every Level to be involved in.
- ~ There will be Mass Reflection Forms to be completed once a month.
- ~ Children's Liturgy will be offered twice a month which will be helpful for children in completing the Mass Reflection Forms.
- ~ Different Levels will be invited to bring cookies, donuts, etc. to Hospitality on specific Sundays that coincide with Children's Liturgy.

Level 1 will meet once a month on Saturday from 9:00 to 10:15 am in the Parish Center. Parents will sign child into classroom and then go downstairs to meet with the other adults for hospitality and a parent presentation. They will sign their child out of class at 10:15 am.

Levels 2-6 will meet at the same time so parents will be able to drop off their children of different levels all at the same time. Level 2-6 will meet Tuesday and Thursday from 4:45 to 6:00 pm and on Wednesday from 5:15 to 6:30 pm.

Level 7 will meet Tuesday and Thursday from 6:15 to 7:30 pm. Level 7 will attend the 5:00 pm Mass once a month on designated Saturdays.

Level 8 will have immediate preparation and celebrate Confirmation in the fall. After Confirmation they will be invited to participate in a leadership role at the Saturday 5pm Mass once a month.

Feeding Friends and Strangers

Today in Luke's Gospel we hear the familiar recounting of the fish and the loaves where Jesus turns five loaves and two fish into enough to feed five thousand men.

It is appropriate that we hear this reading today on the Feast of Corpus Christi as this miracle is a foreshadowing of the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper. "Then taking the five loaves and the two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing over them, broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. They all ate and were satisfied."

This was one of the first bible stories I remember hearing as a child — probably because it was a very dramatic miracle. My mother could stretch a dinner when necessary, but not from five to five thousand!! Which leads me to the very real issue of hunger on Long Island. Yes, there is certainly a spiritual hunger as many seem lost in today's world, but there is much physical hunger too hidden behind McMansions and down quiet, suburban dead end streets. Archbishop Desmond Tutu perhaps said it best, "When people were hungry, Jesus didn't say 'Now is that political, or social?' He said, 'I feed you.' Because the good news to a hungry person is bread."

The current inflation and underemployment in our country has left many desperately wondering how they will provide for their "daily bread." Let us remember today, on the Feast of Corpus Christi, that Christ gave the disciples — and all of us by extension — a lesson on our responsibility to feed others, not only spiritually but also physically, to the best of our abilities. Not five thousand certainly, but maybe five? — Lori Zito

Therefore, with the help of God, I shall dedicate myself to the task of being all the things that I want my church to be. Amen.



Every day, people in our community are helped because of support from funds raised through the Catholic Ministries Appeal.

Today, consider a dad like James. James saw information about the Catholic Ministries Appeal at his local parish, and he knew he had to turn to the Church for help since he had nowhere else to go. James had been gainfully employed for more than 10 years when he began to fall ill. Soon his medical issues made it impossible for him to keep working and he was forced to go out on disability.

After paying the co-pays on his medications, his family's rent and utilities bills, James had very little left to purchase food and other necessities for his family.

It was hard for him to ask for help, but with nowhere else to turn, he did. Catholic Charities found him a specialist who assessed the family's needs and directed them to appropriate resources in their community. He went to his Parish Outreach, where his family received food that allowed them to make it through the month. James and his family received the help they so desperately needed.

Today, James is back to work and the family is doing well. "I am so thankful that I know there is somewhere I can turn, where there are people that care, people I can talk to, if I am ever in such a situation again," shared James.

Thank you to those who have already made a pledge or one-time donation to the CMA when you received the initial CMA letter from Fr. Suglia at the beginning of the month. We are at currently at 53.74% of our \$71,300 goal for this year.

More than 600,000 people are served each year through your faithfulness and generosity. Monies raised from the Appeal support our seminarians in their education, provide assistance to veterans, housing options for the disabled, treatment for those suffering from addiction and much more.

If we reach 80% of our parish goal, all funds raised and received between 80-100% of our goal are returned to us for our own programs, services and needs. Once we reach our goal, we receive 80% back of all the funds raised over this amount.
