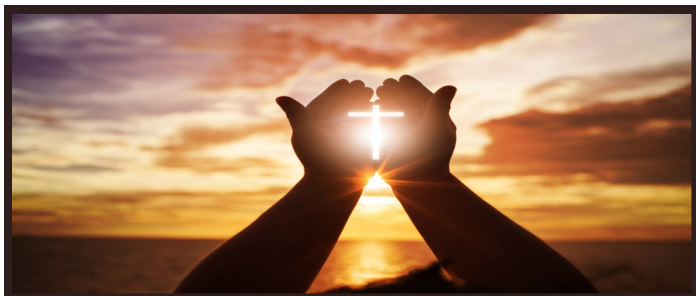

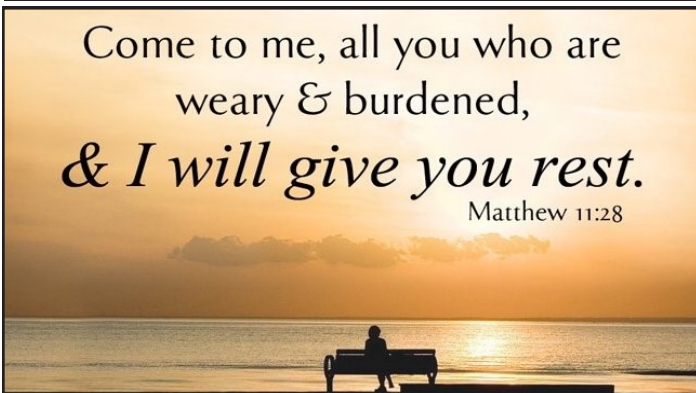

Pandemic: Relied more on faith, love of God, made extra effort to attend Mass.
Journeying/accompanying parishioners in my work/vocation.**

Obstacles

**Lack of young families and people in the Church.
Pandemic.
Unfortunate divide in the secular world: politics, relativism, materialism, etc. affects the Church.
Shortage of priests.
Desire/need for women to be able to be ordained as deacons or priests.
There needs to be a place for persons who are homosexual in the Church.
If the Church wants to be more relevant and bring people back, it must address marriage/divorce,
sexuality, priesthood.
Scandals, lack of awareness of Virtus training, etc.**

Keeping Pace With NYS & Diocesan Guidelines

Effective now:

If you have been fully vaccinated, wearing a mask in the Church or Parish Center is now optional.

If you have not been fully vaccinated, you continue to be responsible for wearing a mask in the Church and Parish Center in accordance with the federal and state's implementation of the CDC guidance.

At Communion time, for the safety of all, please receive the Host in your hands, step to the side, place the Host in your mouth, and return to your pew. Please consume the Eucharist before returning to your seat.

If you want to receive Communion on your tongue, please go to the very end of the priest's line for the safety of everyone.

The Bishop's dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Holy Days of Obligation due to the ongoing pandemic has been lifted. As usual, this obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, those with serious underlying health conditions or those who are caring for a vulnerable family member.

Our Sunday worship will continue to be livestreamed on Saturdays at 5pm and Sundays at 11am, and will continue to be posted on the website for those who fall into any of the categories listed above.

Our priority continues to be for the safety and health of everyone. We appreciate your patience, understanding and cooperation, and will continue to keep you updated on changes as we move forward.

Faith Formation

2022-2023

We hope you and your families are doing well and enjoying the warmer weather. We are excited to share with you the plans for the coming Faith Formation year! We continue to develop the program to be more family-oriented, balancing Church and home life, empowering and encouraging parents to be witnesses of the faith and providing opportunities for families to experience God's loving presence in all they do and in all the places they are!

This is what the program will look like for the 2022-2023 year!

- ~ All classes will meet at the parish, except for some of the Individualized Faith Formation (IFF) classes, which are designed to assist children with special needs in preparing for and receiving Sacraments.
- ~ Class times will be one hour and fifteen minutes instead of one hour long with exceptions for IFF.
- ~ Classes will meet twice a month instead of every week.
- ~ There will be a Sunday/Saturday Mass component for every Level to be involved in.
- ~ There will be Mass Reflection Forms to be completed once a month.
- ~ Children's Liturgy will be offered twice a month which will be helpful for children in completing the Mass Reflection Forms.
- ~ Different Levels will be invited to bring cookies, donuts, etc. to Hospitality on specific Sundays that coincide with Children's Liturgy.

Level 1 will meet once a month on Saturday from 9:00 to 10:15 am in the Parish Center. Parents will sign child into classroom and then go downstairs to meet with the other adults for hospitality and a parent presentation. They will sign their child out of class at 10:15 am.

Levels 2-6 will meet at the same time so parents will be able to drop off their children of different levels all at the same time. Level 2-6 will meet Tuesday and Thursday from 4:45 to 6:00 pm and on Wednesday from 5:15 to 6:30 pm.

Level 7 will meet Tuesday and Thursday from 6:15 to 7:30 pm. Level 7 will attend the 5:00 pm Mass once a month on designated Saturdays.

Level 8 will have immediate preparation and celebrate Confirmation in the fall. After Confirmation they will be invited to participate in a leadership role at the Saturday 5pm Mass once a month.

Telling It Like It Is

I always enjoy reading St. Paul's letters as they are often straight and to the point and today's Second Reading from St. Paul to the Galatians is no different.

He is telling the Galatians that they were called to freedom, but that they are not to abuse it; rather, they are to *"serve one another through love."* St. Paul continues, echoing the second part of Jesus' greatest commandment, *"For the whole law is fulfilled in one statement, namely, You shall love your neighbor as yourself."* As Catholics living in a free nation based on Christian principles, this is what we aspire to — loving God and others without question, and creating a united, peaceful country working toward the common good of mankind. How sad that our nation seems so far from this ideal as we watch the constant violence and mayhem that is now the daily news.

Paul, in his fabulously blunt way, seems to reach out through time and the pages of scripture to warn us, *"But if you go on biting and devouring one another, beware that you are not consumed by one another."* They are strong, graphic words, biting and devouring, bringing to mind perhaps a pack of wild dogs on the attack — terrifying and violent, but unfortunately most accurate!!

As we leave the Easter season and return again to Ordinary Time, let us refrain from sliding back into standing by and accepting what has become business as usual — the physical or verbal tearing apart of a person, group, race, religion, political party, gender, etc. to build up another. This is not the way Christ wants us to treat our brothers and sisters; with God, there is only love and looking forward. Jesus himself tells us so in Luke's Gospel, *"No one who ... looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God."* Are we ready to forget the hurts of the past and come together in peaceful cooperation to solve the crises facing us, or will we be as St. Paul warns *"consumed by one another?"* ~ Lori Zito

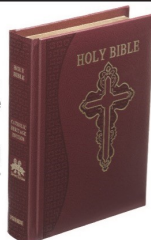
